Alexander Barrington Orr, an old and prominent resident of Stratford, died at a general hospital there Friday night after a prolonged illness. He came to Stratford previous to the rebellion of 1837-8. In 1840 he settled in North Easthope, and lived there for some years, afterwards removing again into Stratford, where he engaged in the foundry business. Leaving the foundry business he was appointed postmaster. In 1854, when Stratford was incorporated as a village, Mr. Orr was elected to the first council. Mr. Orr was also a member of the county council during 1856-7-8, in the latter year being warden of the county. During the Fenian raids Mr. Orr lived in Buffalo, N. Y., where he was British vice-consul. Returning from Buffalo to Stratford he lived a retired life. Deceased's wife was a daughter of the late Col. Daly, survives him, along with one daughter, Miss Mary Orr, living in Stratford, and three sons—Thos. Orr, connected with the Union Pacific, at Omaha, Neb.; Geo. Orr, in Utah, and James Orr, Boston. Deceased was born on the Isle of Man 70 years ago.

Col. McKnight, of the Twenty-Eighth Battalion, has had rooms fitted up in the drill shed at Stratford for the use of non-commissioned officers and their families. It is his intention during the winter months to hold weekly meetings for their instruction.
