The trial of William McLean for the murder of Robert McElva, of Clarke, at the Newcastle As sizes, has ended in a conviction. The murders shot his victim through the window of the house, while the latter was siting at his own fireside. The weapon was a common pocket pistol. MacElva died almost instantly. What could have been the motive for the commission of so diabolical an act, from all that is supplied by the eviculation. It appears that the victim and murderer had lived on the most friendly terms, and the character of the latter was spoken of by several witnesses as hitherto unblemished. It did appear that McLean had sometimes taken what, in other states of society, would be deemed unseemly liberties with McElva's wife; but several witnesses testified that such frolicking was no uncommon thing in that neighborhood, and especially with the prisoner. The murderer was a Member and Officer of the Orange Society; of whom both Judge and Queen's Counsel spoke in the highest terms for their exertions in bringing the party to justice. The condemned prisoner is sentenced to be executed on the 29th instant. The Jury did not accompany their verdict with a recommendation to mercy: and the Judge held out not the not accompany their verdict with a recommenda-tion to mercy; and the Judge held out not the slightest hope of a commutation of the sentence.
