THE MCKINLEY BILL DEFEATS ITSELF

Our Foreign Commerce in Agricultural Products Grows in Spite of It.

Comparisons Made Before and After Canadian Farmers Have Successfully Adapted Themselves to the Changed Conditions and Are Now Almost Independent of the American Market—Where Our Products Find a Ready Market.

RETROSPECT.

A few comparisons of the above results with those of the year 1922-23 will assist in forming some correct conclusions as to the effects produced on the agricultural interests of Canada by the operation of the McKinley tariff on the one hand and the National Policy on the other.

The displacement of production has been greatest in the article of barley. The exports in 1922-23 were 9,975,908 bushels; the exports in 1923-24 were 2,044,225 bushels.

In every other important production of the farm there has been a gratifying increase. Wheat—In 1922-23 Canada imported 2,844,929 bushels wheat and 182,628 barrels flour, and exported 2,394,130 bushels wheat and 149,989 barrels flour.

Oats—In 1922-23 Canada imported 400,225 bushels oats and exported 177,792 bushels; the imports exceeding the exports 222,433 bushels. In 1923-24 the exports exceeded the imports 7,247,204 bushels.

Peas—In 1922-23 Canada exported 2,488,142 bushels peas; in 1923-24 exported 3,255,812 bushels.

Beans—In 1922-23 Canada exported 183,995 bushels; in 1923-24 it exported 276,855 bushels.

Buckwheat—In 1922-23 the exports were so insignificant that they were not classified; in 1923-24 they reached 504,000 bushels.

Indian Corn—In 1922-23 the net imports of Indian Corn amounted to 3,325,069 bushels; in 1923-24 the net imports had decreased to 2,201,692 bushels.

Horned Cattle—In 1922-23 the value exported was \$9,949,417; in 1923-24, \$7,745,105.

Horses—In 1922-23 the value exported was \$1,858,073; in 1923-24, \$1,888,000.

Sheep—In 1922-23 the value exported was \$274,344; in 1923-24, \$288,540.

Cheese—In 1922-23 the value exported was \$4,212,212; in 1923-24, \$4,167,555.

Butter—In 1922-23 the value exported was \$9,372,121; in 1923-24, \$1,900,199.

Meats, canned, etc.—In 1922-23 the value exported was \$180,133; in 1923-24, \$1,006,398.

In hog products, lard, pork, bacon, hams, shoulders, and in wine imported to be slaughtered in bond, the change in the current of trade has been very marked.

In 1922-23 the value imported exceeded the value exported \$1,600,000. In 1923-24 the value exported exceeded the value imported \$1,900,000.

Apples—In 1922-23 the value exported was \$292,163; in 1923-24, \$271,223.

Potatoes—In 1922-23 the quantity exported was 1,458,707 bu.; in 1923-24, 1,112,838 bu.

Hay—In 1922-23 the quantity exported was 115,102 tons; in 1923-24, 151,881 tons.

The McKinley bill has to a considerable extent injured almost the prices realized for barley, beans, horses, potatoes, hay and a few minor articles of produce it undoubtedly true. That this result has been seriously felt in those sections where there used to be a large and profitable trade with the States in these products is equally true and is to be regretted.
