New Rules of Court.

The following new rules were passed by the Supreme Court of Judicature for Ontario on 29th December, 1893:

For rules 210, 211, 212 (hereby repealed) substitute the following:

210—A judge shall be at Osgoode Hall every week, except vacation, for the purpose of disposing of all business, except trials, which may be transacted by a single judge. All applications during the week are to be made to the judge assigned to take the weekly work.

211—The business of the weekly sittings shall be as follows:

Monday and Friday—Chambers business. Motions first, appeals afterwards.

Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday—Court business.

212—All business, except ex-parte motions, is to be entered on a list for each court day, and to be disposed of in the order of entry, unless otherwise directed by the judge.

212 (a)—Lists shall be prepared by the proper officers, of all court business for each day, in which the cases and matters shall be entered in the order in which the praecipes are filed with the officer.

212 (b)—The above rules shall come into operation on and after the 8th January, 1894, and prior publication in the *Ontario Gazette* is hereby dispensed with.

A list of non-jury cases to be tried at Toronto shall be prepared by the proper officer, upon which he shall enter all actions wherein, after close of the pleadings, notice of trial has been given by either party.

Either party shall be at liberty to give ten days' notice of trial in respect of such non-jury cases, and to enter the same on the trial list. Such actions may be tried in the order in which they are entered at the current or next available sittings of the court.

In addition to the above rules of court the following rules respecting the sittings for trial of actions were passed by the Supreme Court of Judicature for Ontario on the 4th January, 1894.

In cases of non-jury actions to be tried at Toronto, notice of trial may be as follows:—

“In the High Court of Justice,——Division: A. B. v. C. D.:

“Take notice of trial of this action (or the issues in this action ordered to be tried) at the City of Toronto in ten (or five) days after the service hereof, or as soon there-

after as the court may be sitting for the trial of actions without a jury.

“Dated, etc.

“X. Y., Plaintiff's Solicitor.

(or as the case may be.)”

After the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice of trial of an action in Toronto, without a jury, either party may enter the action for trial. If both parties enter the action for trial, it shall be tried in the order of the plaintiff's entry.

The party entering the action for trial in Toronto without a jury shall at the time of the entry thereof deliver to the proper officer one copy of the whole of the pleadings in the action, for the use of the Judge at the trial, such copy to be certified as a true copy by the officer having charge of the pleadings filed, and to be called the record.

Actions to be tried in Toronto without a jury may be entered for trial before or during any sittings for the trial of actions without a jury; but no such action shall be placed on the peremptory list for trial before the day following that on which the same is entered.

The following regulations were made on the 17th of February, 1894:

1. All non-jury cases in any of the Divisions of the High Court which are to be tried in Toronto are to be entered for trial with the Clerk of Records and Writs, with whom the record shall be left, as prescribed by rule 664.

2. Rule 545 is hereby amended by striking out the words “Clerk of Records and Writs.” and inserting in lieu thereof, the words “Clerk in Chambers.”

3. All papers relating to proceedings in the weekly court, in all Divisions, are to be filed with the Clerk of Records and Writs not later than the day preceding that upon which they are intended to be tried.

Also the following regulations for the distribution of work in all divisions.

1. The Registrar of the Chancery Division (Mr. Holmsted) is to be relieved of the duty of sitting in the weekly court, but in addition to the other duties now performed by him, he is to settle the minutes of all judgments in the Queen's Bench and Common Pleas Divisions pronounced at the trial of non-jury actions in Toronto whereby any equitable relief is awarded, and all such judgments shall be authenticated by his signature.

2. The assistant-registrar (Mr. Maclean) is to be relieved of the duty of attending the sittings for trial of actions, and in lieu thereof, he is to act as clerk of the weekly

court for all the Divisions; and is to settle and sign or authenticate by his signature all orders and judgments pronounced thereat.

3. The Clerk in the Queen's Bench Division (Mr. Brown) is to be relieved of his duty of sitting in the weekly court; and, in lieu thereof, he is to act as clerk of the Court for the trial of non-jury actions in Toronto, in addition to his other duties.

4. In the case of one officer acting for another who is necessarily absent, the signature of the acting officer shall be sufficient for all purposes.

5. The Clerk of the Records and Writs is to transmit the records as they may be required to the Clerk of the Court for the trial of non-jury actions; who, at the conclusion of the trial, is to return the same, with all exhibits relating thereto, to the Clerk of Records and Writs, who shall forward the records and exhibits in actions in the Queen's Bench and Common Pleas Divisions to the registrars of these Divisions respectively; and a record is to be kept by the Clerk of Records and Writs of his dealings with all such records and exhibits.

6. The practice as to entering orders and judgments in court in the Chancery Division shall be observed in the case of the like orders and judgments in court in the other Divisions.

Heirs, Devisee and Assignee Commission.

The Heirs, Devisee and Assignee Commissioners sit at Toronto on the first Monday in January, and the first Monday in July in each year, and on the thirteen days next following the said days respectively, Sundays and holidays excepted.

Fees and Rules respecting copies of Evidence in County Courts.

The fees for copies of evidence in the County Court are five cents per folio (100 words) for each copy.

On each TERM MOTION there must be filled with the motion paper a copy of the evidence. This copy must be paid for (at five cents per folio) by the party moving. It does not then become his property, but is filed with the clerk for the exclusive use of the Court before whom the motion is to be heard. If the party moving desires a copy of the evidence for his own use he must pay for a second copy at the same rate.

On each APPEAL FROM A COUNTY COURT the applicant must purchase two copies of the evidence at five cents per folio each. One of these copies is filed with the Clerk of the County Court and sent to the Court of Appeal with the original papers. The second copy is sent to the printer to be set up for the appeal book.

If the Intestate die leaving: His personal representatives *take thus, viz:*

Wife and child or children..... One-third to wife, rest to child or children; if children dead, then to their representatives (that is their lineal descendants), except such child or children (not heirs-at-law) who had estate by settlement of intestate or were advanced by him in his life-time equal to the other shares.
 Wife only..... Half to wife; rest to next of kin, in equal degree to intestate, or their legal representatives, or if no next of kin, to the Crown.
 No wife or child..... All to the next of kin, and to their legal representatives.
 Child, children, or their representatives..... All to him, her or them.
 Children by two wives, if no child, children or representatives..... Equally to all.
 Child or grandchild by deceased child.. All to next of kin, in equal degree to intestate.
 Husband only..... Half to him and half as if he had predeceased intestate (R. S. O. c. 108, s. 5; *sed vide* R. S. O. c. 172, s. 23).
 Husband and child or children..... Third to husband and two-thirds to children.
 Father and mother..... Equally to both.
 Father, mother, brother or sister..... Equally to all. (See R.S.O. c. 108, ss. 5, 6.)
 Mother and brother or sister..... Whole to them equally.
 Wife, mother, brother, sister, and nephews or nieces .. Half to wife, residue to mother, brothers, sisters and nieces, but nephews and nieces take *per stirpes*.
 Wife and father..... Half to wife, half to father.
 Wife, mother, nephews and nieces..... Two-fourths to wife, one fourth to mother and one-fourth to nephews and nieces.
 Wife, brother or sister and mother..... Half to wife under Stat. of Can. 11).
 Mother only..... Half to brothers and sisters and mother equally.
 Wife and mother..... The whole (it being then out of the statute).
 Brother or sister of whole blood, and brother and sister of half blood..... Half to wife and half to mother.
 Posthumous brother or sister, and mother..... Equally to both.
 Posthumous brother or sister, and brother or sister born in lifetime of father..... Equally to both.
 Father's father and mother's mother..... Equally to both.

Uncle's or aunt's children, and brother's or sister's grandchildren Equally to all.
 Grandmother, uncle or aunt All to grandmother.
 Two aunts, nephew and niece..... Equally to all.
 Uncle and deceased uncle's child..... All to uncle.
 Uncle by mother's side, and deceased uncle's or aunt's child..... All to uncle.
 Nephew by brother, and nephew by half-sister Equally *per capita*.
 Brothers or sisters, and nephews or nieces Equally (but the nephews or nieces take *per stirpes*).
 Nephew by deceased brother, and nephews and nieces by deceased sister..... Equally *per capita*.
 Brother and grandfather..... All to brother.
 Brother's grandson and brother or sister's daughter..... All to daughter.
 Brother and two aunts..... All to brother.
 Brother and wife..... Half to brother and half to wife.
 Mother and brother..... Equally.
 Wife, and mother, and children of deceased brother or sister..... Half to wife, one-fourth to mother, one-fourth *per stirpes* to deceased brother's or sister's children.
 Wife, brother or sister, and children of deceased brother or sister..... Half to wife, one-fourth to brother or sister *per capita*, one-fourth to deceased brother or sister's child *per stirpes*.
 Brother or sister and children of a deceased brother or sister..... Half to brother or sister *per capita*, half to children of deceased brother or sister *per stirpes*.
 Grandfather and brother..... All to brother.

By the 23rd section of R.S.O. c. 132 it was enacted that the separate personal property of a married woman dying intestate shall be distributed in the same proportion between her husband and children as the personal property of a husband dying intestate is to be distributed between his wife and children. And if there be no child or children living at the death of the wife so dying intestate, then such property shall pass or be distributed as if that Act had not passed. Descendants of intestates always take *per stirpes*: *Re Natl. 37 Chy. Div. 517.*

REAL ESTATE OF INTESTATES.

Since 1st July, 1866, realty descends to personal representatives, whether the deceased died testate or intestate. In case of intestacy to be distributed in the same way as personal estate, subject to the following modifications:
 A widow is entitled to elect whether she will take dower, or a distributive share of her deceased husband's real estate (R.S.O. c. 108, s. 4, s. 5, 2).
 A husband entitled to curtesy may, by deed executed within six calendar months of his wife's death, elect to take curtesy in lieu of a distributive share (R.S.O. c. 108, s. 4, s. 5, 3).
 The father, mother, brothers and sisters of an intestate dying without issue are to share equally in real and personal estate, to the exclusion of grandfather and grandmother (R.S.O. c. 108, s. 6).
 As to real estate not disposed of or conveyed by executor or administrator within twelve months after decease of the testator or intestate, see 54 Vict. c. 18, s. 1. and 56 Vict. c. 23. (Ont.)

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
