TWENTY-FIFTH YEAR CHARGED WITH VIOLATING CRIMINAL CODE

President Charles F. Sise of the Bell Telephone Company Summoned to Appear Before Magistrate Davidson at Whitevale for Trial Next Monday.

Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, President of the C.P.R., Subpoenaed as a Witness—Climax of Struggle Waged Against Telephone Monopoly in Ontario County.

Whitevale, Feb. 16.—(Special.)—Charles F. Sise, president of the Bell Telephone Company of Canada, was formally charged with the violation of the criminal law today.

The complaint was filed with Magistrate James Davidson. It was formally sworn to by a member of the Co-operative Company, and dozens of prominent farmers on all parts of the county were present to witness the inauguration of the proceedings by the Crown.

Many Witnesses to Come. As soon as the complaint was sworn to, Magistrate Davidson certified subpoenas for a large number of witnesses, which were at once handed to his constable for service.

Formal Complaint. Here is the formal complaint the Bell Telephone President must answer to. Now comes Herbert J. Hurd, who says: That Charles F. Sise of Montreal, as president of the Bell Telephone, Limited, of Canada, on or about the sec-

ond day of February, 1903, in the County of Ontario, for and on behalf of said company, did unlawfully conspire, agree or arrange with the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, to unlawfully limit the facilities for transporting or supplying or dealing in articles and commodities, subjects of trade and commerce, to wit, ordinary farm and other produce, by refusing telephone connection and privileges to one Harrison Johnston and others, contrary to the provisions of the Criminal Code, Section 520.

Several farmers who are expected to guarantee the rent of Oddfellow's Hall for that purpose, and it was agreed to, on the same time there was general sentiment to the effect that it was not desired to embarrass the C.P.R. nor President Shaughnessy in any way since he has been universally fair to this section at other times during the present agitation. The subpoena was issued for 15s attendance in order that absolute proof may be obtained of the existence of the famous contract, in which the violation is claimed.

As an evidence of the importance they attach to the action, prominent farmers and business men were in Whitevale today from Markham, Brougham, Green River, Pickering, Clarendon and the farming section intervening.

Efforts to Settle. The Bell Company has been making frantic efforts to settle the controversy during the past few days. It has offered to purchase the telephone connection and privileges of the co-operative company with a view to securing a compromise. All the subscribers have refused to sign on the ground that for the good of other farming districts of Canada they desired to see a trial by jury.

Aurora, Feb. 16.—(Special.)—The first of a series of joint meetings in the North York by-election was held here to-night, and created the liveliest interest throughout this section.

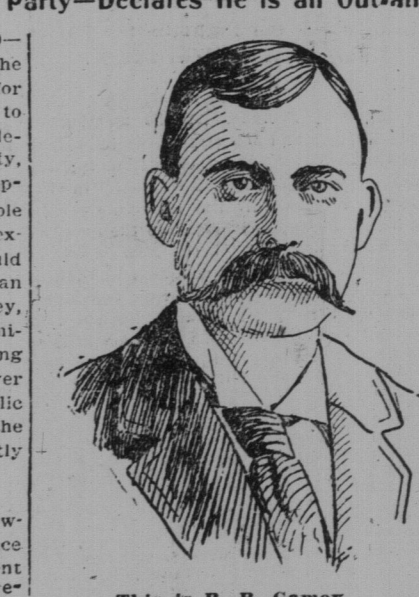
