Montreal, April 30--The financial statement presented to the sharehold-ers of the Maritime Coal, Rallway and Power Company Limited, at their annual meeting Saturday, showed to-tal earnings for the year ending Feb-ruary 28th, amounting to \$225,325, an increase of \$59,133 over the previous year. This was after deducting all expenses incidental to operations, in-cluding those for ordinary repairs and maintenance. An amount of \$32,290 was written off for depreciation \$1,984 for mining rights and \$5,320 for the sinking fund. Besides these the an-nual discount on securities account of \$5,749 was written off.
