NOTE AND NEWS.

GENERAL.

The village of Portella is entirely destroyed by the Carists.

Of the 30,000 medals awarded to exhibitors at the Exposition 400 go to America.

Shakespearean documents have been discovered which contradict the theories touching Shakespeare's business connection with theatres.

A special despatch to the London Telegraph says the cholera is raging in Hungary, and that fifty per cent. of the cases prove fatal.

A contemplated revolt by the crew of the Spanish frigate Carmen was discovered by the officers and forty mutineers arrested and placed in confinement.

Castelar was on Tuesday elected President of the Spanish Cortes by 184 against 73 blanks. Upon taking the chair he delivered a conservative speech.

At a demonstration of the Trades Unionists at Edinburgh on Saturday there were 15,000 men in the procession. The object of the demonstration was to protest against the Criminal Law Amendment Act.

Since the elections the London papers have arrived at the conclusion that a share in a brewery or distillery is now almost as useful a political instrument as a pocket and French coinage.

Nearly four hundred witnesses will be summoned to Besant's trial, and the authorities are at present engaged in trying to find building large enough to contain all those who will be required to attend the trial.

A plaintiff with a claim of £1,900 has lately been nominated in an English court, owing to the adhesive stamps on certain foreign bills of exchange having been cancelled simply with the cross "head of the initials, date, etc., required by law.

The Honolulu Advertiser of the 26th ult. announces that during the week a small party of ladies and gentlemen left Honolulu to walk around the island.

The Spanish Ministers of War, Marine and Interior, and several members of the army threaten to resign if the Government shall decide to commute or in any way fail to execute the death sentence pronounced upon the Communist insurgents.

In Quebec, Wm. Draycott, confectioner, having been to the circus, and got a thorough working on his way home, went to bed without undressing, and was found dead in his bed Monday morning. The deceased formerly belonged to the 1st Battalion 1st Regiment.

Mr. Donkin, Warden of the Penitentiary, reports that two men escaped from that institution on Tuesday afternoon in making repairs to a wharf near by, under the direction of a keeper, when they started to run. The keeper promptly given by the keeper, but before pursuing could be put on their track they were out of sight.

In estimating the amount of English requirements of foreign breadstuffs it will be advisable to take into consideration the remark of the London Times, 11th inst., that "the increased consumption of foreign potatoes is remarkable. In the last seven months the value was £1,329,153 against £385,005 in the same period last year."

In the Spanish Cortes, Monday, Olave demanded the prosecution of Hidalgo on a charge of having abandoned his post as captain of the iron-clad Victoria. He required of the Ministers whether the report that Hidalgo was going to Washington on a mission to the United States Government was correct. In consequence of Olave's action a duel with Hidalgo was imminent, but through the intervention of friends a meeting was averted.

On Sunday there was a severe engagement near Estella, Spain, between 5,000 Government troops and 3,000 Carlists under favorite leaders. The Carlists were completely defeated by the Republicans. They asked for a truce to remove the dead and wounded at Mombach after the battle of Rome, during the siege of that city he aided in the defence of Forta Pia. He joined the French Cossack Zouaves and shared the brilliant career of that corps under De Chabre.

There was a thunder storm Sunday, of great severity in the midland counties, England. Crops were considerably damaged and there was also some loss of life. Accounts from Cambridge, Peterborough, Wisbech, Newark, and other towns, represent the wind and lightning as appalling. Thousands of people refused to go to bed last night because of the storm, and many were awakened by the lightning and many deaths are reported.

CHILDREN'S HALL, near Cambridge, historically connected with the reign of Charles the First, was struck by lightning and burned to the ground.

The steamer Great Republic has arrived with China dates to July 26th and Japan August 6th. The China press congratulates the people upon the success of the mission of Soyemata, sent from Japan to the Emperor for the purpose of improving the treaty relations of the two countries.

The people of Hong Kong fear the cholera will be introduced from Singapore and other places in the Malay Peninsula, and vessels from those places are quarantined from two to ten days. Yokohama papers say that the rebellion of the farmers of Fankokan and other parts has been put down. The rebels were guilty in many instances of shocking barbarities.

When close pressed many of them committed suicide. A gunpowder explosion at Osaka killed a large number of persons. The railroad from Osaka to Kobe is progressing favorably. The Emperor and Empress have gone to the Hot Springs. Last year, on the occasion of their visit, foreigners were excluded, but this time they were not interfered with. Business throughout the Empire was very dull.
