The Circuit Court. Waking up, Magee et. al. occupied a yesterday afternoon. For the defence Mr. Weldon moved for a nonsuit on the ground that there had been no illeg-1 dismissal as set forth in the declaration.

The addresses of both counsel occupied about an hour and a half. Mr. Weldon claimed that there had been no wrongful dismissal, and Mr. Thompson contended that there had. The latter claimed \$403.96 as the least amount they could give the plaintiff.

This included the amount acknowledged by defendants, and the amount of Waking-up's salary and board, less what he had earned in other employ since. He also asked for damages for wrongful dismissal.

His Honor charged the jury to find the plaintiff guilty if it was proved that the plaintiff had been discharged from his employment, and if there had been a wrongful dismissal he was entitled to be paid for the full time, but any amount he had been paid in other employ would go towards reducing damages.

The jury, after a short absence, announced that six of their number had agreed, and were informed that they must be out two hours before any less than the whole number could bring in a verdict. At 6 o'clock a verdict of \$403.96 was returned for the plaintiff.

The next case on the docket was Ferguson vs. Donville, but it was allowed to stand over, and Godose et. al. vs. Isaac Burpee came up this morning. A. L. Palmer, Esq., and Dr. Tuck appeared for the plaintiffs, and S. R. Thomson and C. W. Weldon, Esqs., for the defendant.

It is an action brought by Messrs. Godose Bros. to recover \$452.25, being the amount of their account against the Victoria Hotel, which they claim the Hon. Isaac Burpee guaranteed. Mr. W. C. Godose was on the stand all the forenoon, and his direct examination was not concluded when the court adjourned. The principal portion of the bill was contracted while Cregan and Brownell were managing the house under a committee of the Directors.

On January, 1872, Cregan owed them nearly \$1500, and they refused to supply provisions any longer unless payment was guaranteed. A few days ago the Gazette invited Prince Napoleon to return the coveted blue sash which he had received during the empire, either from the civil list or from the funds of the State, the writer calculating the amount at \$1,463,000. The Prince's Intendant, M. Branon, now writes to the journals contending that figure, and affirming that the Prince touched in all not more than 14,830,000.

The Liberal Catholics of Zurich, who are in a majority in the parish, recently elected their candidates as curate. The Bishop of Coire, to whose diocese Zurich belongs, excommunicated the newly appointed Old Catholic priests, and those who had voted for them. The government of the canton has sent an address to the Cantonal Council requesting the separation of Zurich from the diocese of Coire.

A pedestrian named O'Leary has, under the surveillance of responsible persons, walked forty-eight and one-third miles in 81 hours. The trial was in Chicago, and the endeavor was to walk fifty miles in the time mentioned. At the outset of the effort a mile in about 10 minutes was his gait, but after the 25th mile he maintained the remarkable pace of about seven and a half minutes to the mile, and his feet and the other profes- sional walkers entirely in the background.

Canadian, British and Foreign.

[To the Associated Press.] New York, Nov. 24. A hurricane passed over Trenton, N. J., last evening, causing damage to the city and vicinity to the amount of \$100,000.

The storm in Alabama, Sunday, was very severe throughout the central portions, and extended into central Georgia. The town of Monticello, Ala., reported destroyed; two persons killed, 20 injured.

Considerable damage to property is reported at other points. Excitement over the Gulf case at Montreal continues. Father Rousselot, Curé of the Parish, declares intention to go to jail rather than bury Gauthier in the consecrated ground.

LONDON, Nov. 24. It is reported that Yokook Khan was imprisoned because he wanted to surrender the city of Herat to Persia. France has ordered the release of the crew of the Spanish steamer Nereus, seized at St. Jean de Luz.

The Spanish correspondent of the New York Herald has been captured by the Republicans and imprisoned. Fighting between the Carlists and Republicans, between San Sebastian and Irua, is resumed.

LONDON, Nov. 25. THE FRENCH ASSEMBLY. The Left is making a vigorous effort in the French Assembly to bring about the revocation of the state of siege.

SEARCHING FOR ARMS. Spanish officials yesterday searched the British steamer Mary at Santander for arms for the Carlists, but found none. In the German Reichstag, yesterday, Herr Lasker demanded unlimited publicity to judicial proceedings as the best guarantee of the rights of the people.

FRENCH PROTESTANTISM. Dissensions in the French Protestant Church are increasing. WHAT advanced one shilling in continental markets during the past week.

ANOTHER CONSERVATIVE ELECTED. Messrs. Cassinville, has been elected to Parliament from Birkenhead by 497 majority. A COLLISION occurred in the English Channel yesterday between the Peninsular and Oriental steamer Indus and the Red Star steamer Abbotford, from Antwerp for Philadelphia. The latter put into Dover for repairs, and the Indus proceeded to Southampton with three large holes in her side.

NEW YORK, Nov. 25. THE ST. LAWRENCE. The river at Quebec is quite clear of ice, but all the pontoons at the wharves and boats are placed in winter quarters.
