# ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

---

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1856.

PRESENTED 5TH JANUARY, 1857.

---

The Committee of Management beg to place before the members of the St. George's Society, a brief account of their administration.

St. George's Day, was, as usual, celebrated by the members attending Divine Service at the Cathedral. An admirable and appropriate Musical Service was performed under the able management of Henry Carter, Esquire. The excellent sermon preached on the occasion, by the Society's senior Chaplain, the Revd. Geo. Mackie, has been printed and distributed among the members in accordance with a resolution adopted by your Society.

The collection in aid of the charitable fund amounted to £22 11s 7d.

Your committee refer with satisfaction to the report of the Sub-Committee of Charity, the members of which have been indefatigable in the performance of their duties. The demands on the Society have been more numerous, and a larger amount of relief has been granted than in any previous year.

The number of cases relieved is 69 against 49 last year, and £132 17s 6d has been paid out in relief against £71 18s last year.

Your Committee cannot close this subject without referring to the increasing demands made on your Society by the indigent forwarded from Western cities.

Your Society, at its sole expense, sent to their friends in England, by the Ocean Steamship Co., five old and infirm Englishmen. These had been forwarded from one St. George's Society to another, at a very trifling expenditure to each, until reaching this city, they had to be sent back, or forwarded to England.

Your Society has to lament the loss by death of two of its oldest members during the past year, viz : Peter Sheppard, who was one of its original members ; he became a life member in 1845, was twice elected Vice President, and always took an active part in the affairs of the Society. Mr. Sheppard was a native of Guernsey, came to Canada in 1809, served in the Incorporated Militia in the war of 1812. He departed this life on 23rd August, aged 63, much and deservedly respected. John Racey, who was also an original member, and became a life member in 1845. He was a native of Bath, Somersetshire, came to Quebec in 1802, died in England, aged 73.

During the year eight new members have been added to the list.

The Report of the Treasurer will explain the financial affairs of your Society, under the good management of that officer the funds have improved. The permanent fund now amounts to £1411 8s. 9d, besides which £4 12s 4d appears to the credit of the Charity fund.

# R E P O R T

OF THE

## CHARITABLE COMMITTEE ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

---

It will be gratifying to the Society at large to learn that the Committee have been enabled to afford relief during the past year, in sixty nine cases of distress, at an expenditure of £127 17s. 6d.

This being considerably in excess of any former year most satisfactorily proves that the usefulness of the Society has by no means diminished.

The means available for Charitable purposes being principally derived from the interests of the Invested Permanent Fund, it would be very desirable that the fund should be annually augmented, and it is to be hoped that those members of the Society, who have the ability, will aid by bequests, or occasional donations.

Your Committee have, as far as in their power, faithfully and prudently expended the money entrusted to them, but they fear that occasionally they may have been deceived by misrepresentation, and they would strongly urge upon the members of the Society, the necessity of investigating all cases, before recommending them for relief.

A very erroneous idea prevails in Western Canada, and the adjoining States, that we have funds at our command sufficient to pay the Atlantic passage of infirm Englishmen, who desire to return to their friends and parishes. Once for all, your Committee think, the Society should distinctly state, that

although willing to bear a share of the burden, they cannot for the future forward applicants to England unless the St. George's Societies in Western Canada contribute fairly, towards the expense. Your Committee were compelled in one instance to send back to Western Canada, a whole family, who had been assisted to Quebec, with an assurance that our Society would pay the Atlantic passage and also the expenses per rail to their parish settlement.

The members of your Committee having for many years enjoyed your confidence, as the dispensers of your bounty, would respectfully decline to be again nominated, there being in the Society so many better qualified to discharge the pleasing office of relieving the distressed.

OF THE  
**TREASURER OF THE ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY,**  
FOR THE YEAR 1856.

---

The Twenty-first Annual Financial Statement is now submitted, and the Treasurer has much pleasure in presenting to the Society the continued prosperity of this truly charitable institution.

The permanent fund of the Society being at present £1411 8s. 9d., of which £1260 is invested in Bank Stock, £100 in the Quebec Water Works, and the balance is in the hands of the Treasurer. The Interest received during the past year from the amount invested being £102 19s. 1d. which places the Society in a state of independence, must be a source of sincere gratification to every member.

The amount paid in charity during the past year is £127 17s. 6d. distributed to 69 applicants, besides the sum of £5 voted by the Society to the ladies of the Relief Committee in March last.

The receipts from Subscription and Entrance Fees being part for 1855-56, amounts to the sum of £30 5s.

Six ordinary and one life member have been add to our members since the last report.

The Treasurer must again draw the attention of the members to the large amount of arrears which increase yearly.
