**MANITOBA**—The Mail's Manitoba correspondent gives full returns of the number of voters in 1872 and 1873. The total for 1872 was 2,871, against 2,355 in 1873, an increase of 516. The immigrants have nearly all come from Britain and Ontario, and therefore the English section, which has been increasing, Winnipeg has more than doubled its number. Portage La Prairie has increased from 13,295, Eldon from 78 to 121, and Pease Point from 96 to 120. On the other hand some of the French parishes have fallen: the numbers in the County of Provencher having decreased from 497 to 414, the inhabitants having moved away to the neighborhood of Redwing Mountain, and some as far as North Saskatchewan. The political complexion of the country is completely changed. English and loyal French being in ascendancy and Riel's supporters few in number. It is very gratifying that all the efforts of the Government to weaken the Province's French Catholic preserve,
