brothers and sisters to seek immediate pre-
paration for death, and expressed her ex-
pectation of meeting them in the Kingdom
adding, "Dear Father, you have been a kind
father to me, and you have been instrumental
in leading me to Jesus the Saviour. You
will soon follow me into His Kingdom."
When her work was done, (for we can
only here give an outline to the praise
of that grace manifested in and by her)
she calmly but firmly, as if going to sleep,
without a struggle or a groan or a dis-
torted feature, she breathed her last and was
not long before her soul entered the
bosom of the Father, and the
the image of sublime repose and
tranquility.

to pay the last tribute of respect by conveying

ceased, testified the regard in which she
