ECLIPSES IN 1845.

- This year there will be two eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.
1. Of the Sun, May 6th, invisible—conjunction in longitude at 43m. past 4 in the forenoon. This Eclipse goes off a few minutes before the sun rises.
 2. Of the Moon, May 21st, invisible—opp. in longitude at 43m. past 10 in the forenoon.
 3. Of the Sun, October 30th, invisible—conjunction in longitude at 39m. past 6 in the afternoon.
 4. Of the Moon, November 13th—partial and visible at Toronto, as follows :

Beginning at 6h. 7m.	}	evening.
Middle, at 7h. 46m.		
End, at 9h. 25m.		

WEATHER TABLE.

The following Table (ascribed to Dr. Herschell, and revised by Dr. Adam Clarke), constructed upon philosophical considerations of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and confirmed by experience of many years' actual observation, furnishes the observer, without further trouble, with the knowledge of what kind of weather there is the greatest probability of succeeding, and that so near the truth, that in very few instances will it be found to fail.

Explanation.—It will be seen from the above, 1st. That the nearer the time of the Moon's Change, First Quarter, Full, and Last Quarter, is to *Midnight*, the fairer will the weather be during the seven days following; the space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

2dly. That the nearer to *Midday*, or *Noon*, these phases of the Moon happen, the more foul or wet the weather may be expected during the next seven days; the space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to summer, though they affect spring and autumn to a considerable extent.

3rdly. That the Moon's Change, First Quarter, Full, and Last Quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, *i. e.* from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the *wind*, as it is noted in the Table.

Though the weather is more uncertain in the latter part of autumn, the whole of winter, and the beginning of spring; yet, in the main, the above observations will apply to those periods also.

The two following observations are from the ingenious Dr. Kirwan:

1. When there has been no particular storm about the time of the Spring equinox (March 21), if a storm arise in the East on or before that day, or if a storm from any point of the compass arise near a week after the equinox, then, in either of these cases, the succeeding summer is generally *dry*, four times in five.

2. But if a storm arise from the S. W. or W. S. W. on or just before the Spring equinox, then the summer following is generally *wet*, five times in six.

Note.—This table is sufficiently accurate for the purpose it is wanted for,—that of ascertaining moonlight evenings.

POST-OFFICE REGULATIONS.

Issued by the Deputy-Postmaster in Quebec, dated Dec. 12, 1843.

LETTERS.—1. Letters sent by post in Canada, and the other Provinces in British North America, are to be charged by weight.

2. The scale of weight for charging postage is to be the same as that by which letters to and from the United Kingdom, *via* Halifax, are at present charged, viz:—On a letter not exceeding half-an-ounce in weight, one rate of postage. Exceeding half-an-ounce, 2 rates. Exceeding 1 ounce, 4 rates. Exceeding 2 ounces, 6 rates. Exceeding 3 ounces, 8 rates. And for every ounce above four ounces, two additional rates are chargeable, and every fraction of an ounce is chargeable as one additional ounce.

3. The rates of postage to be charged on letters conveyed by the post, to and from any of the post-towns in British North America, remain unaltered.

4. Letters to or from the United Kingdom, *via* the United States, whether conveyed by packet-boat or private ship, are chargeable with 2d. sterling (2½d. currency) the half-ounce, as Colonial postage, to or from the frontier line, and so in proportion, according to the scale above expressed. *Note*.—The American postage on such letters is to be paid, or pre-paid, as the case may require.

NEWSPAPERS.—5. For every Colonial newspaper, *not exceeding two ounces in weight*, sent by the post between any places in B. N. America, the rate will be one half-penny currency, *to be pre-paid or not, at the option of the sender*.

6. For every such Colonial newspaper sent from Canada to a British Colony beyond the sea, when not intended to pass through the United Kingdom, or to any foreign country (the United States excepted) one half-penny currency, to be invariably pre-paid at the time of posting. *Note*—In addition to any foreign or sea-postage to which it may be liable.

7. For every such Colonial newspaper, sent to any part of the United States, one penny currency, to be pre-paid.

8. United States newspapers, brought by the ordinary post to this country, will be liable on delivery to a provincial rate of one penny currency, in addition to the United States postage which may be due thereon.

9. Colonial newspapers addressed to the United Kingdom, or to any British Colony, by way of England, and British newspapers sent by post from the United Kingdom to any part of Canada, are exempt from any postage charge, as has been the case hitherto.

10. With the exception of Colonial newspapers addressed to the United Kingdom, and British newspapers addressed to Canada, which are not limited as to weight, a newspaper, to pass under these regulations, must not exceed the weight of 2 oz., otherwise it becomes liable to pamphlet postage.

11. British and Foreign newspapers, including newspapers published in the United States, if post'd in this Province, are liable to full letter postage.

12. Every supplement, or additional sheet, to any newspaper, is to be deemed a distinct newspaper, and charged for accordingly.

PAMPHLETS AND OTHER PRINTED PUBLICATIONS.—13. Pamphlets and Publications printed in the United Kingdom, or in British North America, or in the British West Indies, posted in Canada, may be sent to another place in British North America, or to the United States, or to a place in the British West Indies, at the reduced inland rate of one penny per ounce in addition to any charge for sea postage, provided they do not exceed the weight of sixteen ounces, beyond which it is expressly ordered that no pamphlet or publication shall be forwarded by the post.

14. Pamphlets and publications printed in the United Kingdom, and brought by post or otherwise for delivery in this Province, will be liable to the above rate of one penny per ounce for conveyance through the post in British North America. *Note*.—Less weight than an ounce will be charged as one ounce.

16. No printed Newspaper, Supplement to a Newspaper, Votes or Proceedings of any Colonial Legislature, Pamphlets or Publications, can be conveyed by the post at the reduced rates laid down in these Instructions, unless they are sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends. If this is not done, or if any writing or marks appear upon the cover, or upon the Papers, Votes, &c., except the address, the whole packet becomes liable to full letter postage.
