And those who remain, compelled to the fence of gray and danger, mechanically march on, a prey to dread and weakness, the scratch of a thorn, the puncture of a pointed cane, the bite of an ant, or the sting of a wasp, the smallest thing serves to start an ulcer, which presently becomes virulent and eats its way to the bone, and the men die. These sores range like an epidemic, and dozens are sufferers. Then the recklessness with which the men eat up their stores of provisions! What might have lasted ten days is eaten up in two or three, and they starve the rest of the time, for the spaces between the banana plantations may be only a day's march, but they may be twenty days. But it requires a calamity to teach blacks as well as whites how to live."
