A Key West despatch of Aug. 5 says that paying out Mexican cable between Cuba and Florida began on Saturday, and that the line will be open Aug. 15.

A Washington despatch says that the next statement of the public debt of the United States will show a considerable reduction in the debt. Since May 31, about forty millions of dollars in interest have been paid, half of which was coin.

At the latest accounts from Mexico, the Austrian corvette, *Elizabeth*, was near Vera Cruz waiting for the body of Maximilian. A French gunboat was also in port. No foreign representatives were recognized but the United States, other foreign consuls having struck their flags. Vera Cruz is perfectly quiet, and not unusually healthy. Santa Anna is at Campeche.
