OPEN TO WOMEN.

An announcement from Washington, is of interest to women, especially those who claim communion with the Roman Catholic church. The great Catholic university of that city, richly endowed and with a splendid faculty, which has hitherto been devoted solely to the education of priests, has thrown open its doors to women.

It is expected that the first women who will apply for admission to the college courses in the higher studies—those of science, philosophy and the arts—will come from the religious orders. This is because it is thought advisable to have teachers in the convents of the United States take a university course, so that the convent schools may be kept abreast of the modern movement in education.

Not only will nuns be welcomed, but the university will throw its doors open to all seekers of instruction, and women students from every part of the globe will be admitted to all the lectures and studies of the university in the regular and special courses, side by side with the men.
