

British Conference Arranges Four Day Truce.

Plan of Unity Agreed.

Irko-Italian Agreement Denied-- Britain Under no Obligation to Compensate Russia--Police Arrest Two Hundred Longshoremen.

ARRIVED TO MEET OBLIGATION.
LONDON, May 4. Chamberlain told the House of Commons to-day that the Government had declined to admit any question of compensating the Russian Government for damages arising from the action of Allied troops in East Prussia after the Armistice.

THE TRUCE.
DUBLIN, May 4. A conference between the rival Irish Republican Army forces to-day which resulted in a four-day truce, was a most friendly one, and the fact that it was prolonged to point to the arrangement of a plan of unity which the British Government can accept to-morrow. The agreement reached, it is believed to mean an improvement in the position of De Valera and his followers, who would be given a share in the portfolios of the British Cabinet. Likewise the disarming of the Irish Republican Army would coalesce with the British Army and its generals re-

sumed their high commands in the re-united body.

THE WHEAT BOARD.

OTTAWA, May 4. The door to a compulsory Wheat Board was re-opened to-day in the House Committee on Agriculture when a sub-committee brought in a report after consultation with the Deputy Minister of Justice to say that the Federal Government could form a Board with compulsory powers if legislation was passed concurrently by the Dominion and Provincial legislatures. By such concurrent legislation there would be control of purchasing, storing, import and export of all wheat grown in the Provinces passing the legislation. The sub-committee reported that only the Dominion Government could form a voluntary Board giving it the rights held by any private dealer in wheat.

TORNADO IN TEXAS.

HOUSTON, Texas, May 4. A tornado of terrific proportions struck Austin to-day moving southeast. The waters of the Colorado River, swollen from heavy rains, were hurled in the air by the winds. Wire connections were badly interrupted.

CAUSE OF FIRES.

MONTREAL, May 4. Probably 6 per cent. of fires are due to accidents, while the remaining 94 per cent. are due to incendiary or negligence, declared Fire Commissioner Latulippe to-day.

FRANCE'S LONE HAND.

PARIS, May 4. Premier Poincaré's policy towards Germany was endorsed at a semi-official meeting of members of the Senatorial Foreign Relations Committee now in Paris, held last night. M. Doumergue, the Committee's President, told his colleagues that the Premier had assured him that if oc-

cupation of the Ruhr region of Germany became necessary he could accomplish it without calling up further troops. Senators heard this with manifest satisfaction, and almost unanimously pronounced in favor of the policy of firmness in the event of Germany defaulting on May 31, regardless of the attitude taken by other Allies.

GREECE PAYS, BUT RUMANIA DOESN'T.

OTTAWA, May 4. Greece has paid the interest on the loan made by the Canadian Government in 1919, but no interest has been paid on the loan made to Rumania at the same time. Finance Minister Fielding stated to-day in the House.

RAILWAY RATES.

OTTAWA, May 4. The Minister of Railways moved a resolution in the House to-day providing for the appointment of a special committee to make inquiry into transportation costs with a view to reaching a decision regarding railway rates. He said the Government was anxious to reduce rates immediately.

IRISH TRUCE.

DUBLIN, May 4. A truce between the rival Irish Republican Army forces has been declared. It was announced this afternoon. The truce is operative from four o'clock this afternoon until four on Monday afternoon with a view to giving both sections of the Army an immediate opportunity to discuss a basis for Army unification. The provisions of the truce are: (1) All operations except training and ordinary Army routine will cease; (2) All penetrative operations will cease; (3) Both sections will co-operate to maintain order and prevent acts of aggression against persons or property. The document is signed by Owen Duff, and Rian Feigh, Chiefs of Staff of the rival forces.

MAY ACCEPT ALLIED NOTE.

GENOVA, May 4. Soviet representatives here announced to-day that the terms of the Allied note to Russia have been telegraphed to Moscow, says the Exchange Telegraph, which adds, "It is stated that possibly Premier Lenin will accept, demanding simultaneously, full recognition."

LONGSHOREMEN ARRESTED IN MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, May 4. Civil police raided a meeting of Longshoremen this morning at Union Headquarters and placed approximately two hundred under arrest. This action was the aftermath of last night's raid on the docks, during which two policemen were seriously wounded.

FRENCH POLICE ARREST SPIES.

PARIS, May 4. Three arrests have been made and numerous others are momentary expected this afternoon in what the French police claim to be a vast organization for espionage of French arsenals for the benefit of the Russian Soviet Government.

Strange Football Mascots.

A well-known Rugby football team in Lancashire has just discovered that its fortunes are being watched over by a pair of rooks, who come from a neighbouring rookery and perch upon an elm-tree over-looking the football ground. Supporters of the team assert that they have always won when the rooks came to watch the match, and it must be mentioned that the team have a fine "home" record. However, as most of the "away" matches have been lost, the team manager is attempting to get on terms of greater friendship with the luck-bringing rooks. He hopes to be able to induce them to accompany the team on "away" matches. This is rather a delicate business, but he expects the rooks will agree if "expenses are paid" in the shape of tempting food.

Let's Tighten Up.

We have for many years sold a considerable quantity of fish to the United States. In one way it has been a good customer of ours, but in a good many instances, we regret to say, business transactions have not conducted to very friendly relations on the part of the seller and the buyer. From the shores of Lake Erie from the Lakes of the Middle West, from Gaspe and from Nova Scotia the same story comes. Some fish buyers across the border seem to have adopted it as a principle of their business that they shall not pay the stipulated price for the commodity they buy off the Canadian fisherman. If the happening were occasional it might be charitably ignored, but the system is altogether too general to escape attention.

The producers of Lake Erie have been so hard hit by losses on shipments, simply by a cutting down of the invoice prices by unscrupulous buyers for some manufactured reason that it is understood they have in mind co-operative measure to control the buying price of their commodity from this side of the border. Producers on the Gaspe coast and in Nova Scotia and elsewhere who are plagued with the same trouble will do well to take the suggestion into consideration. It should be a simple matter to blacklist buyers who make a constant practice of this and prevent them from getting the supplies they need until after they have altered their tactics. There are reputable houses across the border, and these

shysters in the trade are just as much a nuisance to the legitimate dealers as they are to our producers.

We are very pleased to have the business of the United States. It represents many millions of dollars, but that conveys nothing to the producer unless it leaves an adequate margin between the cost of production and marketing and the price he gets from the U. S. buyer.—Canadian Fisherman.

The Daily Questionnaire.

FRIDAY, May 5.

1.—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister what steps, if any, have been taken by the Government to prepare for the contingency of the Reid Newfoundland Company refusing to operate the railroad system of the Colony after July 1st and if any negotiations are in progress between the Reid Newfoundland Company and the Government with the object of arranging a new contract or other agreement for the operation of the road during the next year.

2. Sir M. P. Cashin.—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister if it is the intention of the Government to permit the increased railway fares at present in effect to be charged by the Reid Newfoundland Company after July 1st next, seeing that in the United States and Canada there has been a reduction in railway fares since the beginning of the year as part of a general movement to reduce the high cost of living, and if the Government does intend to permit the Railway Company to charge increased rates, will he state the reasons which the Government considers justifies such a step on his part.

3. Sir M. P. Cashin.—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister when the people of this country may expect him to put into effect the promise he made in his manifesto in November 1919 to reduce taxation and lessen the cost of living in this country and to lay on the Table of the House a statement showing the percentage of increase in taxation which the new taxes, as told by the Budget now before the House, would involve to the great mass of the people of this country from now onward.

4. Sir M. P. Cashin.—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister, in absence of Hon. the Minister of Marine and Fisheries to lay on the Table of the House a statement showing the work of the dredge last year, and to say if it is the intention to keep her in operation this year, and if so, where, and for what periods.

5. Sir M. P. Cashin.—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister if Mr. R. C. Morgan before leaving here recently furnished the Government with any further report on representations in regard to the Railway, and if so, to lay on the Table of the House copy of same.

6. Sir M. P. Cashin.—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister if it is his intention at this session to introduce the labor legislation promised in his Manifesto, and if not, why not.

7. Mr. Vines.—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister if it is the intention of the Government, to continue after the 30th of June next, the Minister of Shipping Office seeing that the Premier at the last session intimated that this Department would go out of existence on the 31st of December last, and that there is a great need for economy and a reduction of expenditure in the Public Service of the Colony, and if it is the intention to continue this Department, what is the justification for so doing; why not remove Mr. Cave and put him in charge of the Marine and Fisheries Department.

New Lincoln Picture
Unearthed in Chicago.

A picture of Lincoln, painted as he looked 18 days before the martyred President died, has been given to the Chicago Historical Society. For 50 years it lay unnoticed in a family storeroom.

The painting was made by G. P. A. Healy, an American artist. It shows President Lincoln, Gen. Grant and Admiral Porter, in the cabin of Porter's flagship, hearing Gen. Sherman's account of his march to the sea, which had ended the day before.

COMMITTED FOR TRIAL.— Rebecca Newell was yesterday committed for trial in the Supreme Court on a charge of bigamy. The preliminary inquiry has been proceeding for some time. The case will probably be heard this month.

Starvation Facing Ukraine.

RICHEST FARMING COUNTRY IN WORLD ENDANGERED BY FAMINE.

ODESSA. (Associated Press)—Fear of starvation in the Ukraine, once regarded as the richest farming country in the world, has become so acute that thousands of peasants are abandoning everything they possess and flocking to the cities, where they hope to eke out an existence until all danger of crop requisition by the Soviets has passed. Hope for better crops this summer seems to have been lost. Merchants who formerly sold agricultural machinery in the Ukraine are making no efforts to dispose of their stock.

tons. In 1914 it marketed 27,000 head of horned cattle, 3,100,000 hogs and 8,300,000 pigs. It also exports iron and manganese, dairy products and blooded horses. A DESOLATE WASTE. The Ukraine, twice as large as British Isles and with a pre-war population of 40,000,000, is fast becoming a desolate waste, according to fugues. The only reason it has together until now, they say, is cause of rich stores of grain accumulated in the days of prosperity, which are shelled from the Soviet Commissars on the plea that they must be used for seed. Now that these are exhausted, the rich, black earth of the Ukraine must lie idle and worthless. Included among those who face starvation are half a million German colonists, descendants of Germans who settled in the country more than one hundred years ago by invitation of Catherine the Great. In the German colony of Gros-Liebihenthal, near Odessa, one city of 10,000 population is said already to be in the grip of famine. In this section some 30,000

acres of grain was sown annually before the war. To-day there is not a sheaf of wheat to be seen. In another section where 80,000 acres were sown, there is now 100 acres under cultivation.

Through the Inland Sea.

PRICE WILL VIEW MOST BEAUTIFUL SCENERY. TOKIO. (Associated Press).—One of the most beautiful sights of the Far East, a trip through the Inland Sea, is reserved for Edward, Prince of Wales, when he leaves here for Kobe to continue his tour of the empire as guest of the Japanese Government. The Inland Sea, so called because it lies almost enclosed between Hondo, the main island of the Japanese Empire, and the southerly islands of Kyushu and Shikoku, is 240 miles long from east to west, and varies in breadth from eight to 40 miles. It is interspersed with numberless islets of various shapes and sizes while the coast is highly indented. Passengers journeying to and from Kobe by steamer are filled with wonder over the fascinating views which present themselves in ever changing variety. One of the three beautiful scenes in Japan is the sacred Island of Miyajima, thickly wooded with pine, cypress, cherry and maple trees.

THE SACRED SPOT OF JAPAN. According to tradition, Miyajima has been a sacred spot for more than 18 centuries. Until the restoration in 1868, births and deaths were forbidden on the island. Sacred deer still wander about, tame enough to feed from one's hand. The Itatsukushima Shrine, the principal shrine of the island, founded in 1614, is built on the beach, with a mountain rising straight up behind it. When the tide flows, the magnificent buildings are surrounded by the blue sea and look like straggle floating upon the waves. A favorite motive in Japanese art is the red Torii, or "Sacred Shrine way" which stands in the sea. gateway is 45 feet in height and

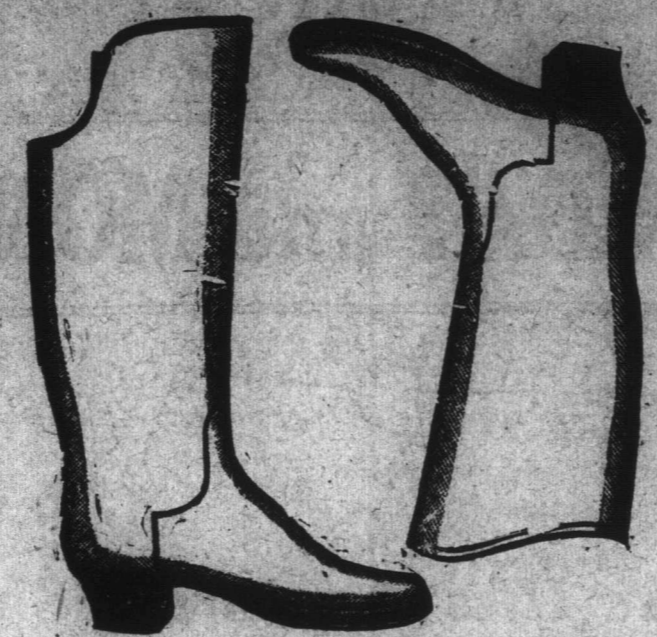
