The value of assets is \$30,000 in specie, \$100,000 in bills receivable, and \$100,000 in miscellaneous assets of which cannot yet be ascertained. The stock has been selling at a premium of 100 per cent. Brecken was married to a Miss N. B., and was a Patron of all the virtues. ST. JOHN, N.
