





Revelstoke

Revelstoke has an early and eventful history, which if fully written up would be highly interesting from an historical point of view. It is not our intention, however, to give here a complete account of all the events which have transpired in the early days, but to touch upon only those which most concerns us at the present time, not believing in "ancient history." But here and there we find a few characters who remember distinctly the exciting times here years ago.

The banks of the Columbia, on which river the town is situated, have been the stage upon which strange scenes have been displayed and wild and daring exploits performed by the thousands who entered this district during the '07 gold boom in the Big Bend.

Revelstoke is probably one of the oldest towns in the interior, at one time being known as Farwell, named after the original locater of the townsite before construction, and over which there has been more trouble than a little, some eleven years having elapsed before clear titles could be obtained, and this only last season. And it was not until this was settled that Revelstoke really began to forge ahead, commercially and otherwise. As we said before, its growth was slow until 1897, but the old timers and newcomers had great confidence in the town and started in to make it a mining centre worthy of note.

The C. P. R. is concentrating all its principal work shops on the western division at Revelstoke. It has erected a large new round house and warehouse and car repair shops, a supply store, an hotel, also a freight shed and a new express office for the handling of merchandise coming and going into West Kootenay. Revelstoke is not only a mining town, but is now and will be increasingly so in the future a railway point of considerable importance in the C.P.R. system and a distributing centre for the business of the rich mining districts included in the section popularly known as North Kootenay. Its importance in these connections is due to its unique geographical position. Seated in a beautiful open valley at the point of intersection of the Columbia river and the C.P. R. main line, it commands the passes ruaning north and south, to the famous goldfields of the Big Bend and the rich mineral leads of the Lardeau, while on the east up the Illecillewaet another district of great promise is being rapidly opened up. The town is the point of junction of the main line and the Arrowhead branch of the C.P.R., by which access is gained to the South Kootenay by rail and steamer. Before long another line of steamers will make Revelstoke their starting point for the Big Bend, for wbich country it

is at present the outfitting point and base of supplies. Thus by the mere force of geographical position alone Revelstoke has forged to the front until the little mining camp of a few years ago has become a town of considerable importance to the business of the province.

The mining industry is still in its infancy, but with the careful expenditure of capital in development work will grow to large dimensions.

Large areas of land in close proximity to the town are covered with timber suitable for lumber, but probably just as valuable as fire wood, there being no coal deposits discovered near at hand as yet. Wood is worth from \$2.25 to \$4 per cord delivered. This land when cleared is proving to be exceptionally fine farming and gardening land, and the demand for produce is always many times larger than the supply, train loads being imported from other points every season. This should be taken into consideration by intending settlers.

Across the river from Revelstoke an excellent clay exists for the making of brick in vast quantities, which commands a high price at any time.

The surrounding country abounds in both large and small game of all kinds. Lovers of mountain trout fishing can find their heaven here as all the adjacent streams are filled with trout. When the hunting and fishing are taken into consideration, coupled with the pleasant climate and beautiful scenery, this is an ideal place for any one, tourist included, to spend the summer.

The town enjoys many advantages: A fine, healthy climate—the death rate being exceedingly low—good water, supplied by a system of water works, from the mountain side just north of the town, underlying which is a stratum of gravel that insures a natural drainage. A short distance up the C. P. R. track, east, to the Illecillewater river, is a canyon and falls, which must be seen in order to be fully appreciated. The power from these falls is now being utilized by the Revelstoke Water, Light & Power Co. for running their fine electric lighting plant. They have an unlimited power which later on will be useful for manufacturing purposes and running the proposed street car line.

In reading the contents of this DIRECTORY you can form your own opinion as to the progress and stability of Revelstoke, the North Kootenay Capital.
