Ottawa, April 5.-(Special.)-When the Canada Atlantic and Grand Trunk Bills were called in the house this evening the minister of railways an-nounced that the government will introduce special legislation to enable it to take running rights over the Canada Atlantic line from Coteau to Parry Ada Atlantic line from Colear to Party Sound and also over the Grand Trunk line between Coteau and Montreal, on terms to be fixed by the railway com-mission. The tolls on the I. C. R. trat-fic from Montreal west to Parry Sound would also be subject to the control of the railway commission. The board, however, would have no more control over the I. C. R. east of Montreal than it possesses to-day. The right to use terminals and to construct its own ter-minals at Parry Sound will also be given to the I. C. R. Mr. Maclean asked if it was the in-tention to have the I. C. R. compete with the other railways and accept freight at Georgian Bay ports. To this Mr. Emmerson replied that the I. C. R. would have running rights and control its own trains subject to the order and direction of the-railway commission. It would be the govern-ment's policy to use this portion of the line, together with the present system, taking freight from the great lakes to the Canadian seaboard at Monteal, Que-bec, Halifax, St. John and possibly Sydney. "Is it the government's policy to take similar rights for the Canadian North-ern over the Canada Atlantic portion of the G. T. R.?" persisted Mr. Mac-lean. "This bill," answered the minister. The thru rates would not be subject to the commission's control, but would be regulated as the I.C.R. rates are to-day. The railway commis-sion was given control of the rates be-tween Parry Sound and Montreal orly because that portion of the line came into competition with other companies operating over the same system.
