38th—That this House will sustain no application for allowanges to Teachers of Common or Parish Schools, unless it shall be certified by at east two Trustees of Schools for the Parish where che School has been taught, shewing the time actually taught—the Teacher to be licenced—the ause why such Teacher was not certified to the essions in the ordinary way—and that such eacher was not compelled to discontinue his or er School on account of any improper conduct.
