WAYS AND MEANS—THE INCOME TAX. Sir R. Peel moved that the House resolve itself into a committee of ways and means.

Lord J. Russell wished Sir R. Peel to make his statement before the speaker should leave the chair. Sir R. Peel preferred to make it in committee, when, as he observed, he would have the opportunity of speaking more than once, and be enabled to reply to objections.

Mr. Baring then rose—He did not consider that the falling off in the revenue was likely to be permanent. He held it a mistake to suppose that taxation upon consumption would be a source of revenue which the Government was seeking to levy.

The new plan was to raise £3,000,000, of which only \$3,000,000 was required to meet deficiency, the remainder being applied to effect alterations in the tariff, and to add a surplus for other objects.

Such a principle must put this country under no real difficulty in its arrangements with foreign nations. And now the question was, whether the nation would undergo an income-tax for the sake of this tariff?

Lord John Russell described the construction of the tariff for not working out its own principle, but springing certain important articles, as in the instance of sugar, merely from fear of the influence of protectionist members of the Government.
