While the Entente Allies are "nibbling" at the German lines rom the North Sea to Switzerland, but are making little or no ser-
ous attempts to break through or bring about a culminating strugious attempts to break through or bring about a culminating struggle, the Teutonic powers have taken another step in the exploitation
of the east. The advance guards of the Germans have entered Odessa, the greatest Russian port on the Black Sea and the center of a great agricultural section, the products of which are desired to feed the hungry peoples of the Central Empires. The German ad-
vance through Moldavia and Bessarabia has been virtually unopposed.
With Odessa safely in their hands, the Teutons will have ac-
cess to vast stores of wheat which can be transported overland or by sea to points where it can be readily shipped into Austria and
But the capture of Odessa will mean something more-an ad which is to be followed now that the British have severed the famous Berlin and Bagdad route to the east.

Forms giving particulars of income for the year 1917 must be filled in and filed on or before the 31st March, 1918 Section 4 of the Act provides that all persons resident or ordinarily resident in Canada, shail pay a tax upon
income exceeding $\$ 1500$ in the case of those single and widows and widowers without dependent children, and upon income exceeding $\$ 3000$ in the case of all other persons. It also provides that all Corporations and Joint Stock The Porms provided by the Department of Finance to be filled in with particulars of the 1917 income of all those
whose incomes are liable under the Act and by Trustees, Corporations and Joint Stock Companies, with informa those incomes are liable under the Act, and by Trustes, Corporations and Joint Stock Companies, with informa-
