CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

Name and Objects of the Society.

The Society shall be known as the "St. Andrew's and Caledonian Society, of the City of Vancouver," and shall have for its object the affording of medical, and other relief, to such natives of Scotland, and their descendants, as may from sickness or other causes have fallen into distress; the encouragement of the national costume and games; to cultivate a taste for Scottish music and literature; and of binding more closely together all Scotchmen, and those of Scottish descent.

ARTICLE II.**Seal of the Society.**

The Seal of the Society shall have engraved thereon the Arms of Scotland, with the motto—*Nemo me Impune Lacessit*.

ARTICLE III.**Membership.**

The membership of the Society shall consist of three classes, viz: Ordinary, Life and Honorary Members.

ARTICLE IV.**Ordinary Members.**

Sec. 1.—None but Scotchmen, or those of Scottish parentage, of the age of 18 years and upwards, shall be eligible for ordinary membership in this Society. Candidates for admission must make application in writing, in accordance with a form which will be supplied by the Secretary.

Sec. 2.—Persons proposed at any meeting shall be eligible for election at the next regular meeting. The election shall be by ballot, and the consent of three-fourths of the members present shall be necessary for the admission of a candidate. Such candidate, however, in the event of rejection, shall have the privilege of again making application at the expiry of three months.

See. 3.—None but members in good standing, who have paid their entrance fee and signed the Constitution, shall be entitled to vote at elections, or participate in any other business of the Society.

See 4.—Each member, after subscribing to the Constitution, shall hand to the Secretary his entrance fee of \$1, and \$1 for the current quarter's dues, whereupon he shall receive from that officer a Certificate of Membership, authenticated by the seal of the Society, and duly signed by the President and Secretary, and also a copy of the Constitution and By-laws.

ARTICLE V.

Life Members

Any member, upon the payment of a sum of not less than fifty dollars at any one time, shall be accepted as a Life Member, retaining, however, all the rights of an Ordinary Member.

ARTICLE VI.

Honorary Members.

Natives of Scotland, or their descendants, who have done anything towards the advancement of the welfare of the Society, or whose public record shall reflect credit on their nationality, and who are not themselves residents of Vancouver, may be proposed and admitted as Honorary Members. They shall be entitled to a Certificate of their admission, authenticated by the Seal of the

Society, and signed by the President and Secretary; but shall not be entitled to vote or take an active part in the business of the Society

ARTICLE VII.

Officers of the Society.

Sec. 1.—A President, Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Physician, a Chaplain, a Solicitor, and ten members of the Society who shall be Directors, shall be annually chosen from among the Ordinary Members at the preparatory meeting hereafter mentioned, who shall be installed, and shall enter upon the duties of their respective offices on the festival of St. Andrew, next ensuing. Installation shall be by the Chaplain of the Society.

Sec 2.—Each officer shall be proposed and seconded, and in case more than one be proposed for one office, a ballot shall be called for by the presiding officer, when a majority of the votes of members present shall decide the election. The ten Directors shall be voted for without nomination, upon one ballot slip, and the ten members obtaining the highest plurality of votes shall be chosen. In the event of a tie the President shall give the casting vote.

Sec 3.—The President shall be first chosen, and duly announced to the meeting, and the others afterwards, in the order in which they have been heretofore enumerated.

Sec. 5.—In addition to the foregoing there shall be elected *viva voce* the following officers—A Bard, Standard Bearer, Piper, two auditors and a Warden.

ARTICLE VIII.

Stated Meetings of the Society.

The Society shall hold twelve meetings in each year, to be held on the first Thursday of each month. The meetings in Feb., May, Aug. and November shall be quarterly meetings, the last of which shall be called the annual meeting preparatory to the anniversary festival of St. Andrew's Day. All meetings shall be held in the rooms of the Society, unless otherwise decided by the Board of Directors, and due notice shall be given thereof in at least two newspapers of the city by the Secretary. Seven members shall be necessary to constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IX.

Special Meetings of the Society.

Sec. 1.—The President, or in his absence, the officer highest in rank who may be in the city, shall, when any emergency occurs, which in his opinion may render it expedient, or upon application made for that purpose by the Board of Directors, or on the written requisition of five members, call a special meeting of the Society.

Due notice thereof shall be given by the Secretary, and seven members shall constitute a quorum.

Sec. 2.—Special meetings shall be competent to transact any regular business that may come before them, except where it is otherwise prescribed in the Constitution; but the consent of two thirds of the members present shall be necessary to constitute a vote. Yeas and nays on any question shall be recorded at either special or regular meetings if called for by any member.

ARTICLE X.

Duties of President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society, preserve order, put all motions duly moved and seconded, and declare the decision. He shall leave the chair on all occasions when any vote affecting himself is to be taken. He shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. He shall also perform such other duties as the By-Laws direct.

In the absence of the President at any meeting, his duties shall devolve upon the Vice-President. In the event of the absence of the President and Vice-President, the members present shall appoint their own Chairman, who shall have the same power as the President at such meeting.

ARTICLE XI.**Duties of the Secretary.**

The Secretary shall have the custody of all the personal property, records and journals of the Society, and shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the Society and of the Board of Directors. He shall have charge of the seal of the Society, and sign all certificates of membership jointly with the President. He shall also conduct all correspondence of the Society, and notify members of their election within three days thereafter. He shall advertise all meetings of the Society, and prepare the draft of the annual report for the Board of Directors, and the consideration of the Society at the annual preparatory meeting.

ARTICLE XII.**Duties of the Treasurer.**

The Treasurer shall have the custody of all moneys and other property or securities belonging to the Society. He shall keep regular accounts of his receipts and expenditures in suitable books provided for that purpose. He shall at each quarterly meeting, present an abstract of his accounts, stating the sums received and expended since the previous quarter; and in addition, at the preparatory meeting, an annual fiscal statement of the financial affairs of the Society since the last annual preparatory meeting. He shall deposit all moneys handed to him.

without delay, in one of the chartered banks in the city of Vancouver, on account of and for the use of the Society. He shall not pay out any money on account of the Society, except by cheque upon the order of the Board of Directors, which order must be duly signed by the President, or in his absence by the Vice-President and Secretary. He shall, at the expiration of his term of office, hand over to his successor the cash balance, and all books, papers and property of the Society. All cheques must be signed by the Treasurer and Sec'y, and countersigned by the Pres-

ARTICLE XIII.

Duties of the Physician.

It shall be the duty of the Physician to give advice and assistance to such indigent, sick or maimed persons as may from time to time be recommended to his charge by the Board of Directors. In such cases his fee shall be \$1 per visit. He shall not exceed ten visits without further orders from the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIV.

Duties of the Chaplain.

It shall be the duty of the Chaplain to perform the religious services held every year in connection with the anniversary celebration of the Society, and by his council and advice endeavor to promote harmony and goodwill among

members. He shall visit such sick and distressed persons as may be recommended to his attention by the Board of Directors; and perform such other clerical duties as the Society may require.

ARTICLE XV.

Duties of the Solicitor.

It shall be the duty of the Solicitor to advise gratuitously the Society, or Board of Directors, in all legal matters that may arise in connection with the business of the Society; and also to advise with the Board of Trustees in the investment or other disposition of the funds held by them in trust for the Society.

ARTICLE XVI.

Duties of the Board of Directors.

Sec. 1.—The Board of Directors shall be entrusted with the discharge of all executive business of the Society. They shall carry out all entertainments the Society may decide upon, and duly report the result thereof, handing over the surplus, if any, to the Secretary. No indebtedness shall be incurred without their sanction, and all obligations presented to the Society shall be presented to them for liquidation.

Sec. 2.—The Directors shall constitute a Board for dispensing the bounty of the Society in accordance with the regulations and restrictions prescribed by the Constitution. No persons

shall be objects of this bounty but such members as may become indigent, as well as all Scotchmen and descendants of Scotchmen who may be in indigent circumstances. The Directors shall have discretionary power as to what extent and in what mode relief shall be given; not to exceed however to any one applicant the sum of ten dollars during the year, except in peculiar cases, when the Directors may, with the consent of the Society, increase the amount.

Sec. 3.—The Directors, at their first meeting, which shall be within one day after installation, shall elect one of their number Chairman of the Board, who shall preside at their meetings, and who may call such meetings when asked to do so in writing by any three members of the Board. Three members to constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE XVII.

Death, Resignation, or Removal of Officers.

In case of the death, resignation, or removal of any of the officers during the term for which they were elected, the Society shall at the next meeting, choose others in their stead to serve for the remainder of the year.

ARTICLE XIX.

Delinquency in Paying Dues.

Any member, unless he be in indigent circumstances—of which the Board of Directors shall judge—who shall refuse, or neglect to pay his dues for one year after they have accrued, provided he has been called on by the Secretary or Collector, shall be suspended by the Board of Directors until he pays his dues in arrear; and in the event of non payment, that his name be erased from the books one year after such suspension.

ARTICLE XX.

Anniversary Assembly.

As the benevolent views of the Society will be greatly promoted by social intercourse among the members the Society shall hold an anniversary assembly upon St. Andrew's Day, at which officers and members may wear, upon the left breast, the prescribed badge of the Society.

When St. Andrew's Day occurs on Sunday, the first day of December shall be celebrated as the anniversary. The anniversary of Burns and Dominion Day may also be duly observed by the

Society, and be celebrated in such manner as may be decided upon at the regular monthly meeting before such events occur.

ARTICLE XXI.

Funds of the Society.

The funds of the Society shall consist of a Benevolent and reserve fund. The benevolent fund shall consist of not more than three-fourths of the net annual income of the Society derived from the initiation fees and annual dues of members, and interest accruing on investments, and shall be applied in charity and liquidating the ordinary expenses of the Society. The Reserve fund shall consist of at least one-fourth of the net annual revenue of the Society, of all donations or bequests, and of life membership fees; which reserve fund shall be placed to the credit of the Board of Directors, who shall have the care and disposition thereof.

ARTICLE XXII.

Observance of the Rules of the Society

Sec. 1.—The members of the Society shall faithfully observe and conform to the rules and regulations set forth in this Constitution, on penalty of being suspended from the privileges of the Society, or having their names erased from the list of members.

Sec. 2.—If three-fourths of the members present at any general meeting shall vote for the ex-

pulsion of a member, his name shall be erased from the roll, and he shall never afterwards be admitted to attend any meeting of the Society, unless again elected.

ARTICLE XXIII.

Funerals and Burials.

Sec. 1.—In the event of the death of any of the members, information shall at once be communicated to the President, who may, if necessary call a special meeting of the Society, to permit of members attending the funeral. Members shall cover their badges with crape at funerals.

Sec 2.—The Board of Directors shall take charge of all funerals, and shall have discretionary power to defray the expenses of burying deceased fellow-countrymen, members or non-members of the Society, who may die in indigent circumstances. The Chaplain shall conduct all religious services in connection with such funerals.

ARTICLE XXIV.

Order to be Observed at Meetings.

Sec 1.—At each meeting of the Society, the President, or in his absence the Vice-President, shall preside and call the meeting to order for the transaction of business. If neither of these officers are present the meeting shall then elect a chairman, who shall preside.

Sec. 2.—Discussions on religious, political or other subjects foreign to the objects and purposes of the Society, shall not be allowed at any of the meetings

Sec. 3.—The following order of business shall be observed :

1. Call to order.

3. Communications and accounts.
4. Reports of standing committees.
5. Reports of special committees.
6. Propositions for membership.
7. Balloting for members.
8. Treasurer's report.
9. Recess for payment of dues.
10. Election of officers.
11. Unfinished business.
12. New business.
13. Notices of motion.
14. Report of Board of Directors.
15. Adjournment.

ARTICLE XXV.

Preparations of Motions and Reports.

Sec. 1.—At all regular and special meetings of the Society, any member making a motion shall, upon the request of the Chairman, put the same in writing, and it shall be read by the Secretary before discussion. Reports of Committees shall be in writing, and signed by the Chairman; also all notices of motion.

Sec. 2—No person shall speak more than once upon any subject, except the person proposing any resolution, who shall have the right to reply and close the debate. The chairman shall decide all questions of order, and if any member be dissatisfied therewith he shall have the right to appeal to the Society.

ARTICLE XXVI.

Altering or Amending the Constitution.

The Constitution shall not be amended or altered except at a quarterly meeting. The consent of three quarters of the members present at such meeting shall be necessary to ratify an amendment, and notice of all proposed amendments or alterations shall be given in writing at the previous quarterly meeting.

The frame thus constructed stands firmly on the floor and is kept in the same position no matter how much weight the tub contains.

The cover of this tub consists of very heavy closely woven duck which is coated especially for us, with thoroughly refined, vulcanized rubber, cured, and thus rendered tough and pliable. We guarantee it not to crack. It is composed of a single piece in which there are no cuts or seams. As the duck is thoroughly coated with pure rubber, it has a perfectly smooth surface and is as easily cleaned as a porcelain tub. It is suitable for sea salt, sulphur, or medicated waters. It is complete with no separate parts. A full, with a half, or two pails of water make a full bath, less will answer. As the frame is firmly put together with our metal joints, and riveted, there is absolutely no danger of tipping, and we guarantee the tub to be strong enough for the heaviest persons even if a full submergent bath is desired. As the tub has no separate parts it is easily taken up and carried, even when it contains water for the bath, by taking hold of the tub at both ends where the duck is folded in several thicknesses and made strong for this purpose; when taken up in this manner the rails come nearly together and not a drop of water can be spilled; hence a bath can be taken in any part of the house, and as the entire apparatus weighs only 16 pounds, it is easily handled by any woman or even a strong child. It is not necessary to dip the water out to empty the tub, simply take hold of the rails and lift one end, when the other end forms a trough and the water can be easily poured into a pail without spilling a drop.

The shape is well shown in our cut. It is very similar to the metallic tubs. It is not suspended, but rests on the floor about one foot in width the entire length of the tub. We send samples and prices of cut goods free of charge, but would suggest, in order to facilitate matters, that a description as near as possible to article be given, and about price wanted, as our variety in most goods is very large, and to send samples of all would incur an enormous expense and would be impossible.

When ordering from samples, always enclose a small cut of pattern selected, and state if we may substitute, in case goods have been sold out. A second choice would greatly facilitate the filling of an order in such cases and avoid unnecessary delay.

We make no charge for packing, shipping or wharfage, which is an item of considerable importance in such goods as furniture, crockery, etc., and all goods are packed in the best manner by experienced packers.

POSTAL INFORMATION, ETC.

1st CLASS MATTER. Letters.

Letters addressed to places in Canada and United States, 3 cents per 1 oz, or fraction thereof.

Great Britain and all Foreign Countries, 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz, or fraction thereof.

Letters addressed to places in the United States must be prepaid at least one full rate (3 cents); otherwise they will be sent to the Dead Letter office.

Partly prepaid letters addressed to places in Canada will be forwarded to destination, subject to delivery to double the amount of postage remaining unpaid; and letters on which no postage has been prepaid will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

2nd CLASS MATTER.

Newspapers and Periodicals published not less frequently than once a month and posted from the office of publication for transmission to *regular subscribers* in Canada, the United States and New Foundland, are sent free of postage. All specimen copies and all copies of publications published less frequently than once a month, must be prepaid 1 cent for each pound or fraction of a pound.

3rd CLASS MATTER.

Matter of this class must be so packed or put up as to be easily opened for examination, and there must be no correspondence enclosed.

Patterns and Samples.

Bona fide Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 21 ounces, in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 1 ounce. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual by another, *not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples*, are not admissible as such. A sample of tea is limited to half a pound. The limit of weight to the United States is eight ounces; postage, 2 cents for the first 1 ounce, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces. Limit of weight to the United Kingdom is 5 lbs.; dimensions, 2 feet in length, 1 foot in width and depth.

4th CLASS MATTER. Parcels.

Parcels should be plainly addressed, and there must be no correspondence enclosed.

Parcels for Canada must be prepaid 10 cents for 1 ounce, and must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight nor two feet in length by one foot in width or depth, and the senders name should be written on the lower left hand corner.

5th CLASS MATTER.

Comprises such articles of general merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per 1 oz, or fraction of an oz. Limit of weight 5 lbs., of up to 2 feet in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be 5th class *must be open to inspection*, and there must be no correspondence enclosed. Prepaid 5th Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Customs inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed Tins containing Fish, Lobsters, Vegetables, Meat, etc., if put up in a solid manner and labelled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents, may be sent as 5th Class matter within the Dominion, but unsealed matter can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as 5th Class, if put up in accordance with the ruling referring to such articles in the Canada Postal Guide for \$100, page xiv.

REGISTRATION.

All classes of *matter* addressed to places in Canada, the United States, New Foundland, Great Britain or any Postal Union Country may be registered for a fee of five cents for each article in addition to the Postage, and *letters* may be registered to *most* of the countries not included in the Union.

Every article intended for registration *must be handed in at the window*, and a receipt obtained therefor. *On no account must it be dropped into a letter box.* The registration fee should be paid by registration stamp.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union Country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents.

It will be seen from the above that the marine freight-carrying trade on the Pacific coast already almost equals two-thirds of that on the Atlantic at the above principal ports, and that the proportion of tonnage per ship is nearly 3 to 2, indicating a larger average class of vessels.
