Explanations, and Principal Articles of the Calendar for 1871.

EXPLANATIONS.

All the calculations are reduced to local mean time for Charlottetown, lat. $46^{\circ} 13' 55''$ N., long. $63^{\circ} 7' 23''$ W., with the exception of equation of time and Sun's right ascension and declination, which are given for apparent noon. The Sun's apparent semi-diameter is also inserted on the respective days for each complete second of arc.

At the head of each month, beside the changes of the Moon, are given the Moon's bearing at the time of change, the Perigee, or Moon's nearest approach to the earth, and the days when the Moon crosses the Equator, and reaches her greatest north or south declination; on which point Saxby's system of Lunar Equinoctials is founded; the principle being that on these days the Moon's influence on the atmospheric tides is most marked; and when these times fall close upon the time of Moon's change or Perigee, this disturbing influence is proportionably increased. These cases are marked ** or *** according as two or three of these influences combine. When *** occur, a gale or other strong atmospheric disturbance may be expected with considerable certainty.

In addition to the general local disturbance on these days, the effects of a storm generated within the tropics is sometimes propagated so as to arrive in about two or three days—it having been found that the average rate at which these travel is about 16 miles per hour.

Mercury is most favorable for observation at the times of his greatest elongation or apparently angular distance from the sun, which is about 10 or 12 days after being stationary to the East, when he may be discovered a little after sunset—or 10 or 12 days after being stationary to the West, when he must be looked for just before sunrise. Occultation by Moon, June 15th.

VENUS.—The apparent motion is direct till September 2nd. Retrograde till October 15th, then direct the rest of the year. She is at her greatest elongation about 45 days from the dates when she is stationary; at which time, like Mercury, exactly half her disc is illuminated: but she is at her greatest brilliancy when she presents the appearance of the moon between 3 and 4 days old. This will be about August 20th and November 1st, when she may be seen during the day, coming to the meridian, 9h. 20m., a. m. Venus will be an evening star till her inferior conjunction with the sun, September 17th; after which she will reappear to the west of the sun as a morning star.

MARS.—Apparent motion direct till February 9th: retrograde till May 2nd, and then direct till the end of the year. In opposition to the sun, March 19th, coming to the meridian at midnight. Occultation by the moon, November 15th.

JUPITER.—Retrograde till February 10th. Direct till November 17th; afterwards retrograde, in conjunction with the sun, June 30th; after which he will reappear as an evening star. Occultations by the moon: March 27th, April 24th, May 21st.

SATURN.—Direct till April 19th: retrograde till September 17th; then direct till the end of the year. In opposition to the sun, June 28th; on the meridian at midnight. Occultations by the moon: January 18th, February 15th, March 14th, July 2nd and 29th, August 25th, September 21st.

URANUS.—Retrograde till March 30th. Direct till November 6th. In opposition to the sun, January 14th, coming to the meridian at midnight, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the distance southward, on the prolongation of the line joining the Twin Stars, Castor and Pollux, a little to the west. In conjunction with the sun, July 19th. Occultations by the Moon, January 7th, February 3rd, March 2nd.

NEPTUNE.—Direct till July 28th. Retrograde afterwards to the end of the year. In opposition to the sun, October 15th.

None of the occultations above noticed will be observable at Charlottetown, all with one exception occurring in the daytime or when the moon is below the horizon. The occultation of Uranus on the 2nd of March will be central at the time of conjunction at Long. $87^{\circ} 12' W.$, Lat. $78^{\circ} 29' N.$ To us it will appear as a near approach, the planet being to the south of the moon about $\frac{1}{2}$ of her diameter at 11h. 18m. p. m.



ECLIPSES.

There will be four during the year, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, one of which will be visible at Charlottetown.

I. A partial eclipse of the Moon, January 6th. Greenwich mean time of opposition, in right ascension 9h. 14m. 57s. Magnitude of eclipse, .688 of Moon's diameter towards the south. Visible at Charlottetown.

II. An annular eclipse of the Sun, June 17. Visible in part of the Indian and Pacific Oceans. Line of centrality passes near Cape Bougainville, (Australia) the centre of New Guinea, to the neighborhood of the Fiji Islands. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 14h. 27m. 49-1sec. (half-past 2, a. m., June 18).

III. A partial eclipse of the Moon, July 2. Greenwich mean time of opposition, 1h. 29m. 21sec. Magnitude of eclipse .348 of the diameter towards the north.

IV. A total eclipse of the Sun, December 11. Line of totality commences in the Arabian Sea, southern extremity of Hindostan, north end of Ceylon, Sumatra, Java, Cape Bougainville, Gulf of Carpentaria. Greenwich mean time of conjunction 10h. 0m. 2 sec. (4, a. m., Dec. 12).



ZODIACAL LIGHT.

During the early part of March, after the Moon has passed her full, the Zodiacal Light may be seen after sunset, streaming upward from the western horizon towards the Pleiades. From recent observation by spectral analysis, Angstrom has arrived at the conclusion that this light is closely allied with that of the aurora borealis, which has been conclusively proved to consist principally of oxygen gas brought to an incandescent state by the electric discharge. See Report of Toronto Astronomical Society, in a paper by the President, S. Winder.

VEAL CAKE.—This is a pretty, tasty dish for supper or breakfast, uses up any cold veal which you may not care to mince. Take away brown outside of your cold roast veal, and cut the white meat into slices; have also a few thin slices of cold ham and two hard-boiled eggs, which also slice, and two dessertspoonfuls of finely-chopped parsley. Put all in an earthenware mould, and lay veal, ham, eggs, and parsley in alternate layers, with a little pepper between each, and a sprinkling of lemon juice over the top. When the mould seems full, fill up with strong stock, and bake half an hour. Turn out when cold. If a proper shape be not at hand, the veal cake looks pretty made in a plain pie-dish. When turned out, garnish with a few sprigs of fresh parsley.

MER AU MACARONI.—Line a pork-pie mould or a pie-dish with light meat up some cold fowl into small pieces, with a little ham or bacon; some macaroni quite tender, and cut it in lengths of about an inch; gravy; of veal stock or milk, thicken it with a little flour; season the with salt and pepper to taste, and put it all into a saucepan, and simmer few minutes. After the paste is placed round the mould or dish, turn it upside down, and bake it. When the paste is sufficiently done, turn it out, and put in a layer of meat and a layer of macaroni alternately, until the mould is full; on the top of all a layer of grated cheese. Turn it out and serve.

SCOTCH BROTH.—Three pounds of beef, a three-pound neck of mutton, back rib; cover with cold water, and set on a slow fire; one teacupful barley, half a teacupful of rice, one turnip, and two carrots cut small; carrots grated, one handful of parsley, and two good sized onions mince; few leeks finely shred, a cauliflower, or small head of cabbage, may be well mixed previously, a pinch of parsley minced very fine, and Cayenne. The oil should be put in drop by drop, to mix perfectly.

TARTAR SAUCE.—Take the yolks of two eggs, half a dessertspoon vinegar, two dessertspoonfuls of oil, a pinch of salt, a pinch of pepper, a teaspoonful of mustard, a little Cayenne pepper. Put into a very saucypan the yolks of two eggs, a dessertspoonful of the best vinegar, a little salt; whip up this mixture with a whisk as quickly as possible. When the whole forms a sort of cream, add the oil and mustard, which be well mixed previously, a pinch of parsley minced very fine, and Cayenne. The oil should be put in drop by drop, to mix perfectly.

VEAL SOUP.—Boil the veal with two-thirds of a cup of rice, and add some herbs or celery, and the usual seasoning. This makes a plain, wholesome soup.

NEW METHOD OF COOKING A LEG OF MUTTON.—Cover it well with water and bring it gradually to a boil; let it simmer gently for half an hour, then lift it out; roast it an hour and a quarter, or a half, according to its size. Dressed in this way it is particularly juicy and tender; but there must be no delay in roasting it after it is taken out of the water. It may be garnished with roasted tomatoes or potatoes, and served.

CHICKEN FRITTERS.—Make a batter with four eggs, some new milk rice flour; to this add a pint of cream, some powdered sugar, candied lemon peel cut small, fresh lemon peel grated, and the white parts of a raw chicken shred small; set these all together on a stove, and stir well for time. When done, take it off, roll out the mixture, cut it into fritters, fry them. Put sugar on a dish, lay the fritters on it, strew sugar over them hot.

LEMON CAKE.—One pound of flour, six ounces of butter, six ounces moist sugar, three teaspoonfuls of baking powder, three eggs, and the juice of one large lemon, or two small ones, grated fine; a little milk to make a proper stiffness. Bake for one hour in a quick oven.

WHAT TO DO WITH THE COLD MEAT.—Mince any kind of cold meat, son it well, and mix with it some gravy, thickened almost to a paste, yolk of egg. Make into balls, and dip them two or three times into egg bread-crums, and fry them brown. There should not be much fat in or the balls will not be firm enough. This is a good breakfast relish.

OATMEAL CAKES.—Only one should be made at a time, as the mixture is merely sufficient to form into a cake; knead it round and round with hands on the paste board, strewing meal under and over it; it may be as thin as a wafer, or any thickness under and over it; it may be traveller's biscuit. Put it on a griddle, bake it till it is a little browned on the under side, then take it off and toast that side before the fire, which is uppermost on the griddle. Oatmeal cake, instead of bread, is capital cheese.

FRITTERS.—Rice fritters are most generally made with whole rice, but if rice may be used instead in the following way: Mix a handful of rice with milk, set it on the fire and stir it constantly, adding a little cream, sugar, grated lemon-peel, and a few drops of essence of vanilla, until it becomes sufficiently thick and stiff, remove it from the fire, and pour it over a slab or flat tin; let it cool, cut out the fritters with cutters, dip them in butter or in egg and bread crumbs, and fry them in a very hot pan. BROWN CHARLOTTE PUDDING.—Butter a pudding mould thickly, spread brown sugar over the butter, and line the mould with slices of bread buttered; cut some baking apples into slices, place them in the mould in layers, with grated lemon-peel, candied citron, and orange-peel to taste; a little sugar between each layer of apples; fill up the mould, cover with a slice of bread soaked in a little warm water; bake three hours in a moderate oven, turn it out of the mould, and serve it hot.

CUP PUDDINGS.—Beat three ounces of butter to a cream, add two ounces of pounded sugar, stir in three ounces of flour and then a milk; put the mixture into buttered cups, and bake it twenty minutes.

DAINTY BISCUITS.—Sift flour, add half the weight of butter, drop on wafers, and bake in a slack oven.

NOBUT BISCUITS.—Scrape off the skin carefully, grate the nut very fine, add half the weight of powdered sugar. Mix well together with eggs, drop on wafer paper in small rough knobs, the size of a walnut, and bake in a slack oven.

BITT.—The following is a very old receipt for this old-fashioned dish: Take of ready-boiled flour put by degrees two quarts of new milk and three of currants picked clean and washed; stir them, and boil till done. Beat the yolks of three eggs and a little nutmeg with two or three spoonfuls of milk; add this to the flour, stir them together while over a fire, then sweeten, and serve cold in a deep dish.

A CHEAP PUDDING.—Three-quarters of a pound of flour, a quarter pound of suet chopped fine, a little chopped lemon-peel; a teaspoonful of treacle; mix to batter with two eggs well beaten in a little milk. Tie cloth and boil three hours. Serve with wine sauce if approved, but it is nice with only a little sifted sugar.

IRISH GRIDDLE OR SLIM CAKES.—Rub two ounces and a half of butter, half a pound of flour with a little salt, make it into a stiff paste with a little milk, roll it out half an inch thick, and cut it into squares and round any shape you like. It will take half an hour to bake; it should be baked on a griddle over a stove, or in the oven with the door open.

PUPPIES.—Take one pound of flour, one pound of powdered yeast, two pounds of butter, let it stand till cold, add a pint of milk, a pint of caraway seeds, and a pint of melted iron, with tin rims.

DOUGHNUT CAKE.—One pound of flour, one pound of powdered loaf sugar, one pound of caraway seeds, one pound of melted iron, with tin rims.

SHORT BREAD AS MADE IN SCOTLAND.—Two pounds of sifted flour, one pound of butter, half a pound of moist sugar, a small teaspoonful of carbonate of soda, a few drops essence of lemon. Rub the butter into the flour with the hand; after the butter, sugar, and flour have been well mixed, the carbonate of soda and lemon, and work all well together ten minutes, wished very rich, substitute for the breakfastcupful of the flour one ground rice, and add a quarter of a pound of almonds blanched and made very fine. Made into cakes, and pinched round with the finger and thumb.

CACOANUT KISSES.—One cup of sugar to two of cocoanut, a tablespoonful of corn starch; moisten it with enough white of egg to make it stiff. Bake in a very hot oven, or they will run together.


