Sugar as a Sumutant

The Swiss guides fully appreciate the value of sugar as a stimulant, and alwayp sugar or highly sweetened chocolate. The muscular lumbermen or Can
ada consume an extraordinary large amount of sugar during the season in the woods, taking it in the form of mo-
lasses. They sweeten their milkless lasses. They sweeten their milkless
tea with it, make cakes with it and tea with it, make cakes with it and
even add it to their tried salt pork, whiek is the only meat they get during
the time they are in the woods cutting lumber, and this is practically half the
year. In he '"black belt' of Alabama the staple articles of diet are also mo-
lasses, salt pork and cornmeal. These simple articles fortm the diet day in and
day out, year about, and yet the ne-
