EUROPEAN NEWS.

Russia and Austria have become friends again, and entered into an offensive and defensive treaty, which is on the eve of being signed.

First, the most ample concessions as to all that regards the holy places at Jerusalem, will be made by Austria to Russia. Second, with a view to eventualities that have every probability of being realized, Austria agrees to conform her policy to that of Russia as to the Danubian Provinces and Servia.

These engagements have already produced a powerful effect. France is inclined now to discontinue the union of the Italian and the creation of a powerful Italian State. It is alleged that a meeting of the French Cabinet was recently held, at which it was resolved "that the project of the annexation of Tuscany to Piedmont must be altogether abandoned."

The intention of Spain to demand the cession of a portion of the Moorish territory is regarded with distrust in England. In the House of Lords, the Earl of Carnarvon asked if the Government had any objection to this departure from the original declaration of Spain.

The Paris correspondent of the London Times commences the report that Napoleon is endeavoring to reconcile Italy. An arrangement respecting the Romagna, likely to satisfy both parties, has been proposed, but the terms are not mentioned.

The King of Sardinia and Count Cavour remained at Milan. They were constantly received with the greatest enthusiasm. The clergy had presented a complimentary address. The decoration of the Annunziata had been conferred by the King of Sardinia on Marshal Randon was expected to be also conferred on Marshals McMahon and Neil.

The New Brunswick House of Assembly has passed a resolution for an address to the Queen, requesting Her Majesty to take steps to have the word "Canada" placed on the Province added to France under the new Commercial Treaty.

The Halifax Witness says that nothing new of importance has transpired regarding the Hungarians. Two additional bodies have been found—that of a man and that of a child.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY. MONDAY AFTERNOON, March 19. The afternoon was occupied in receiving petitions, of which a great number was presented.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON, March 20. Hon. Col. Gray, by command, submitted intra-Colonial correspondence on the subject of Light-houses on the East Point and North Cape of this island; also, the Report of the Indian Commissioners, which were read.

The amendments of the Council to the Will amendment Act were agreed to. They extended the public for a creditor to set, in execution, the real estate of a deceased debtor, to 6 years.

On motion of Mr. McAnulty, it was resolved that there be called on the House on Wednesday, the 21st inst., for consideration the several petitions lying on the table.
