LATEST CABLE NEWS.

Lord Derby on the Unfairness of American Competition.

RUSSIA, FRANCE AND GERMANY.

Remarkable disclosures are expected.

SCOTLAND'S IRON TRADE.  
The revival in the iron trade continues to make local felt in commercial circles in Scotland. The demand from America for Scotch pig iron has increased, and several large contracts have been secured.

ANOTHER BORN LEADER ARRESTED.  
A dispatch from Pretoria of the 8th says Pretorius, ex-President of the Transvaal, has been arrested on a charge of high treason, the specific charge being that he addressed a letter in conjunction with Bok to Sir Garnet Wolseley forwarding the resolutions passed at the late meeting, advising the British Government to grant a reasonable project. Bok for Pretorius was arrested. The Boers are stopping Pretorius.

RUSSIAN TROOPS ON THE AUSTRIAN FRONTIER.  
A Vienna dispatch says the information possessed by the military circles respecting the distribution of Russian troops along the Austro-Russian frontier by no means confirms the reports of a concentration along the western frontier of Russia. These rumors may, in great part, have arisen from the circumstance that, in consequence of the experience acquired during the Turkish war, the whole Russian military organization is in a state of transition.

THE BOERS EXCITED.  
The arrest of Pretorius, President of the former Republic of the Transvaal, for high treason, has caused great excitement among the Boers.

RUSSIA ENGAGES TO PROTECT SERBIA.  
A Berlin dispatch says the National Zeitung publishes a sensational statement in which it is stated that the Russian Government has formally engaged to protect the latter.

THE MACDONALD CASE.  
It is stated the Bishop of London has signed letters of request to the Dean of the Exchequer, in relation to the case against the Rev. Alexander Macdonald for the deprivation of Mr. Macdonald's rights of priesthood.

A CAPTIVITY DISPATCH.  
A Capetown dispatch says a warrant has been issued for the arrest of Paul Kruger, President of the committee appointed at the meeting of Boers on the 10th ult., which adopted a resolution to maintain the demand for independence of the Transvaal, and instructed Paul Kruger to summon a Volksraad.

RUSSIAN WORKERS IN SIBERIA.  
A Berlin dispatch says in the lower House of the Prussian Diet, the Minister of Finance asking a vote for the relief of the sufferers by the famine in Upper Siberia, announced that the Government also contemplated the construction of two branch railway lines in Siberia, which would result in a grant of 125 million marks. He said 100,000 tons of wheat, rice, and provisions for these had been made up to the end of the month. The Government, he said, had also undertaken improvements by extensive drainage works and the promotion of local industries.

LONDON, Jan. 11.  
The War Department has agreed to an arrangement by which successful candidates of the Royal Military College, Kingston, Canada, of which Lieut. Col. 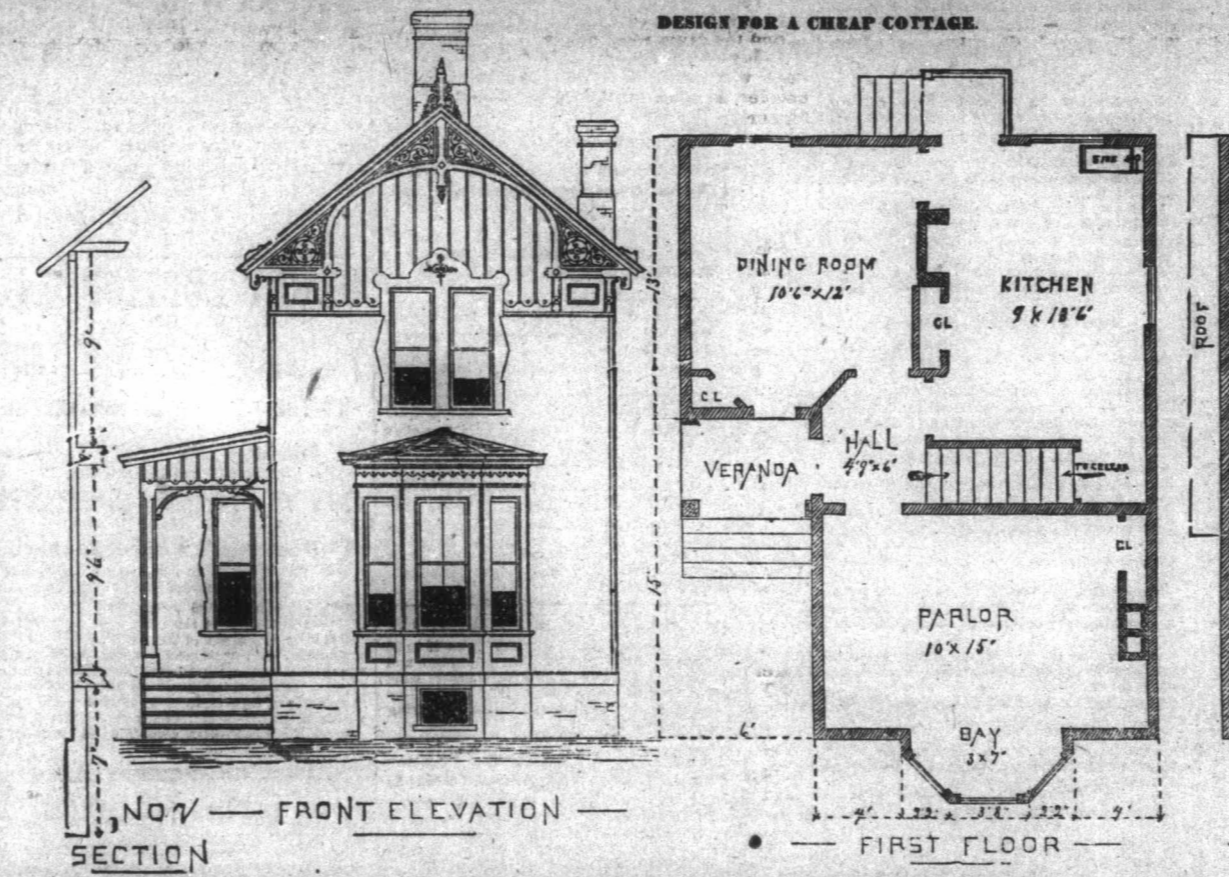
