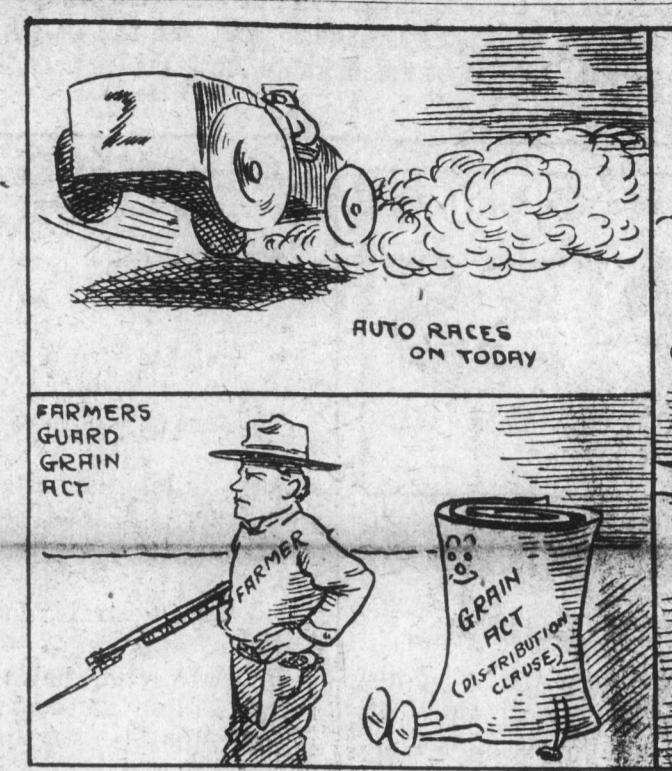

\$10,000 FOR WELCOME ARCH FOR DUKE OF CONNAUGHT
Plan Is to Expend This Amount on Elaborate Scheme of City Decoration
Triumphal Arch Will Be a Blaze of Color at Night and Gorgeous Color By Day
Decorative Scheme Contemplates Use of Thirty Thousand Yards of Bunting
THEIR Royal Highnesses, the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, will be welcomed to Calgary under a triumphal arch to be erected on Centre street, between Eighth and Ninth avenues, the gates of which will be opened by means of the pressing of an electric button, by His Worship the Mayor, J. W. Mitchell. Tentative plans for the triumphal arch were approved last night at a special meeting of the council together with a request from the reception committee of which Alderman R. S. Whaley is chairman, for \$10,000 to defray the cost of the arch, and other decorations.

FACTS AND FANCIES

Modern Cornelias Miss Linda Scott, a hat trimmer, was in Albany during the debate over the equal suffrage bill, according to an exchange, and heard Senator McMillan refer to "Cornelia's jewels." In the course of his argument against giving the vote to women. At a suffrage meeting at Cooper Union Miss Scott, confessing some ignorance as to the ancient Cornelia, spoke of two modern Cornelias, now living in New York, of whom she said:

"I can tell you about the modern Cornelia, who lives only a short distance from both the old and the new. She has eight jewels. They live in three rooms. There are two windows in one, there is one which is dark, and the kitchen, where all the work is done, is lighted by an air shaft. "The mother and children all sew on pants, for which they get 2 cents. The united efforts of this Cornelia and her eight jewels can only make seven pairs in a day. If you go in Cornelia has only time to nod her head slightly, and her children do not look up once in a while. They make 144 violets for 3 cents, and if they work to midnight they can make 40 cents a day. "I don't want to be a governor. I don't want to be a policeman, or yet a senator; but I do want to have the ballot help change the laws which are killing and maiming the jewels of the Cornelias of the present day."

Wicker Novelties Fascinating electricals of wicker and cretome are now made for country homes. Both the bowl and shade are of heavy wicker in plain weaves, and the shade has a broad band of cretome. These electricals come in all colors, but are very good looking in white, highly glazed or in the natural tones. For libraries or living rooms interesting ones are shown in dark green, brown and red. The sizes and shapes vary from the small, narrow design for the night stand in a bedroom to massive bowls, fully 18 inches across the base, with huge shades to correspond. While most of the cretomes are light tones that can be used with almost any decoration, it is possible to get the shades unlined, so cretomes or prints can be used that correspond with the hangings of the room. Another wicker convenience for the country home is the tea tray on wheels that can be pushed over the grass. These come in various forms, but most of them are double, with separate compartments for the cup and saucers and ample room for the tea service on top and sandwich plates beneath. Another novelty is the tall wicker porch screen, which is light, but firm, with tops in graceful empire lines. Usually they are in natural tones, but are sometimes painted to match the porch woodwork. As a background for plants and a small table or to shut out draughts these screens are equally useful. A porch work stand that is convenient and ornamental is of natural wicker with collapsible sides. When open the top can be utilized as a sewing table, while beneath is a cretome bag to hold work and sewing utensils. Wicker jardiniere and advertising matter are decorative, and when painted brown, dark green or a soft gray make an agreeable setting for the gray summer flowers, which are to often spoiled by being put in vases that jar with their tones.

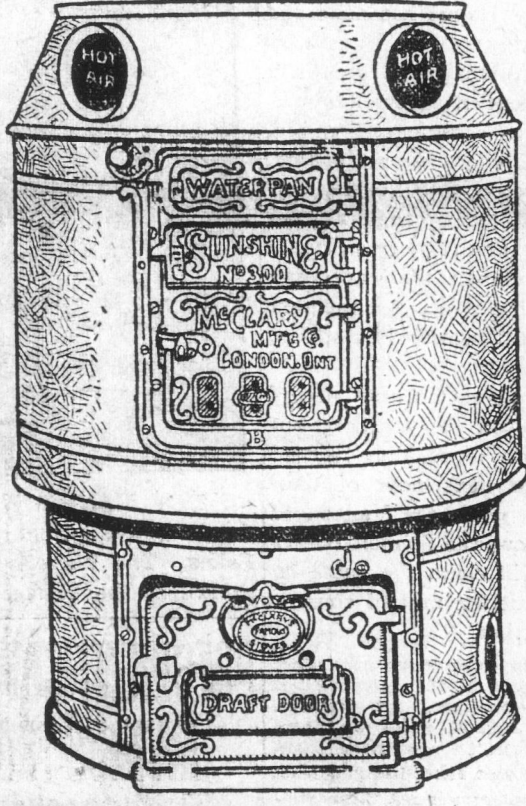

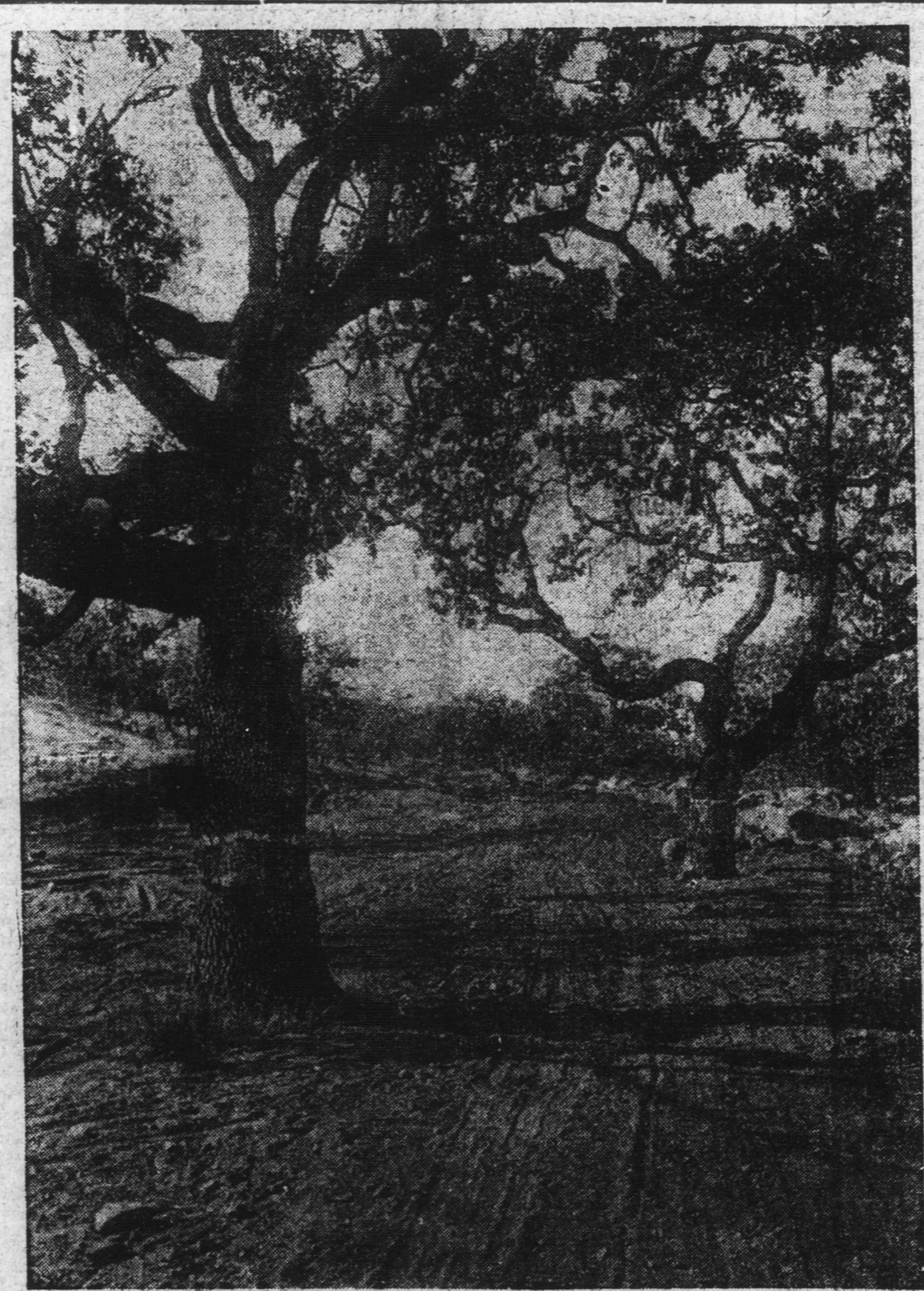

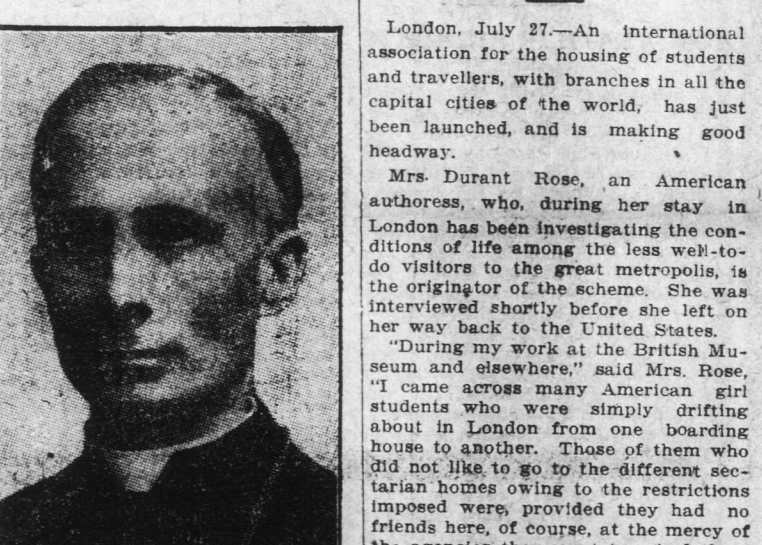
