THE LOTTERY SCANDAL

The graphic picture given in these columns yesterday of the extent of the lottery scandal in New Orleans, is not overdrawn; it is the plain relation of the actual condition of things in that city, as observed by a gentleman of Toronto who has just returned from a sojourn there of several months. Lotteries and other forms of gambling are the curse of Louisiana.

Now these lotteries are directly illegal, and it is only through gross negligence of duty on the part of the authorities that the moneys are being allowed to go on.

In order that the public may see how illegal these lotteries are we will quote the law on the subject:

Any person buying, selling, exchanging, taking or receiving any such lot, ticket, or other device in an above-stated national, shall upon conviction thereof, in the manner as therein mentioned, forfeit the sum of twenty dollars for each and every such offence...

Why a law so explicit has not been enforced, we cannot say. The county attorney of Middlesex ought to be asked for an explanation. Above him is the attorney-general of Ontario, Oliver Mowat, who, once his attention has been called to the matter, will not doubt inquire into the whole proceedings.

From the county attorney of York ought to have put the law in motion and stopped the sale of tickets in Toronto. But he says he is ready to act.
