Annual Report and Financial Statements of the Public Library Board

The Public Library Board for 1886 concluded its year's business yesterday afternoon.

The financial statement showed the receipts during the year including a balance of \$765.50, to have been \$28,221.50.

The third annual report recorded a steadily increasing interest in every department of the institution.

In the reference department the number of books, papers and periodicals taken out during the year was 14,445.

The number of findings sold at 20 cents each was 827.

The Board passed a resolution expressing its sense of the efficiency and faithfulness of the library officials.
