which was another evidence of national prosperity. (Cheers.)

The industrial census showed also to what extent the country had progressed under protection during the past 10 years. The United States census shows that there were thousands of factories set down as such with only one employe. (Hear, hear.) If Sir Richard Cartwright had really wanted to be fair he would have quoted the great increase in the larger industries, those having over \$10,000 capital.

Notwithstanding the decreases in values at the present time, compared with the year 1878, our total trade had grown from \$152,000,000 in the latter year to \$230,000,000 in the latter year to \$230,000,000 in the year which has closed. (Cheers.) Look at the inter-provincial trade of Canada. Look at the immense trade which has sprung up in the different provinces of the country, a trade which had increased from less than \$2,000,000 in 1867 to \$125,000,000 in 1894. (Cheers.) But Sir Richard Cartwright was not content with criticizing the census, and, although he did not refer as much as usual to it in his speech, yet he adopted his old tactics of deprecating and decrying the country in which he lived. Worse still, he was not correct in his statements.

Sir Hichard Discredits Statistician Elue.

He said that farming property in the Province of Ontario had decreased in Province of Ontario had decreased in value to the extent of \$200,000,000. What should be said of a statement of that kind, when the records showed there had been no decline whatever in that respect; on the contrary, there had been a gain of \$95,000,000? (Cheers.) Land had decreased—(Opposition cheers)—but there had been an increase in buildings and implements and live stock (Hear, hear.) Let him refer Sir Richard to an authority which he would not deny—the authority of Mr. Blue, an officer of the Ontario Government, and Sir Oliver Mowat's statistician.

Should we not better depend on such statistics than on those furnished by the honorable gentleman? Where are we to go for our statistics if not to duly accredited officials? (Hear, hear.) What means had the honorable gentleman at his command for finding out what the real statistical condition of the country is? (Hear, hear.) are we to take his ipse dixit as to what the condition of the country is, and are we to reject the statement of the statistician? He was taking evidence, such as was furnished in this country, evidence that could not be controverted and it showed that, instead of a decline in the farming operations and agricultural wealth of the country, it had increased to \$979,000,000 in 1892. (Loud cheers.)




