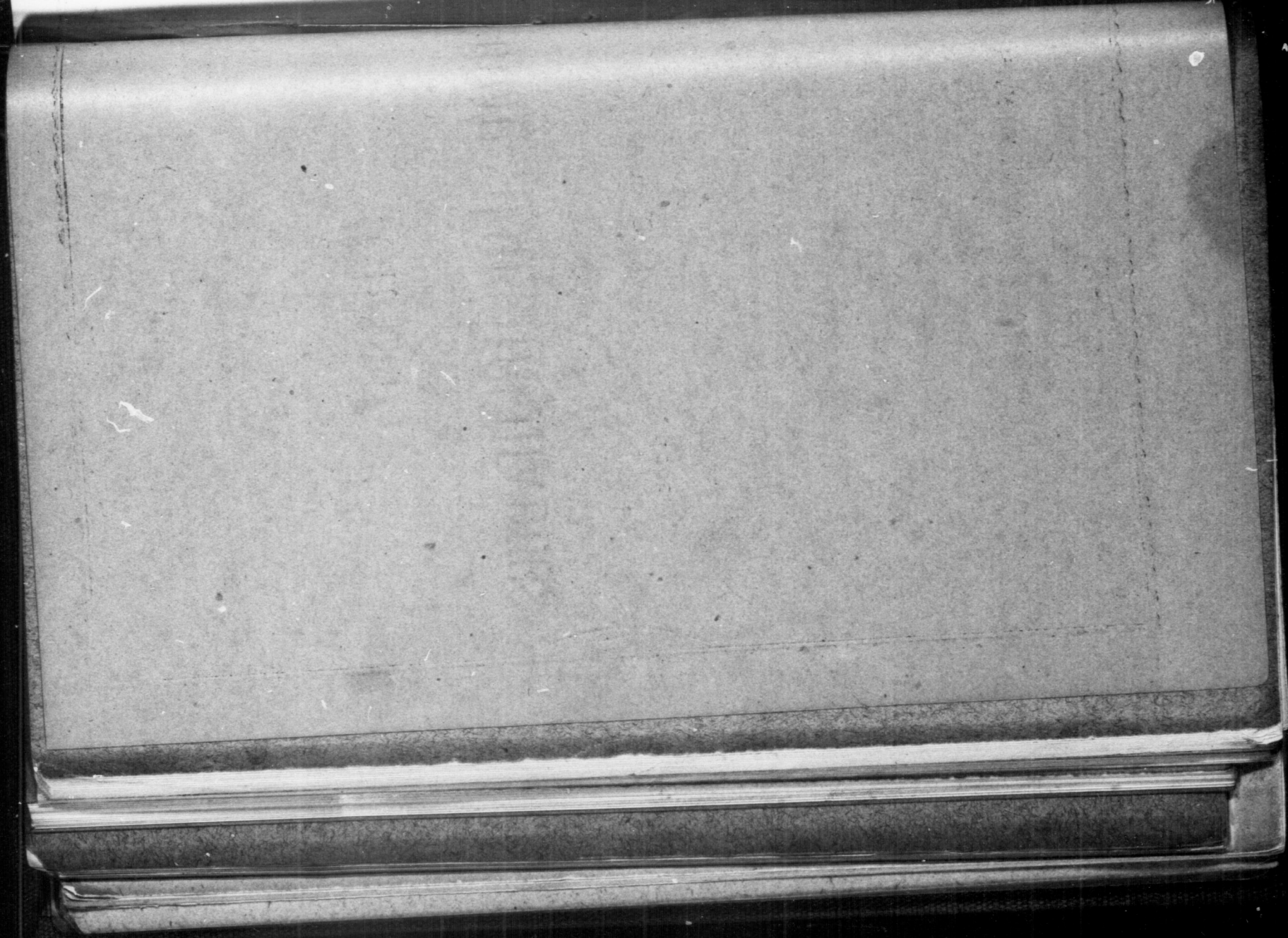

NINTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Toronto Home for Incurables,

ENDING MARCH 1st, 1883.

Another year has passed and the Board of the Toronto Home for Incurables begs to lay before its friends and the public the Ninth Annual Report.

This year with the enlarged accommodation, and the advantages of our new abode, we have advanced from being a semi-private charity, into the full work of providing for a public need.

Our sphere of usefulness has been widened, and with our power to lighten the days of those who suffer, has also come the duty of continuing to provide for the increasing numbers who are seeking rest within our "Home."

The Report of the Building Fund tells of how nearly our late President had accomplished his work of clearing our present building from debt, and we trust that ere long his aim may be attained, so that we may at once begin the enlargement so greatly needed.*

The capacity of our present building is well nigh reached, and we would remind our well-wishers that our "Home," as it is now, is but one wing of the completed design, and one half the size of what we have it in hand to provide.

We are indebted to the liberality of the late Mr. Michie for the erec-

tion of the Elevator, which is now in working order, and a great comfort to those who are obliged to occupy the top story.

In consequence of the terrible loss by fire, which took place at the hotel in Milwaukee, it was thought advisable, that all public institutions should have fire escapes attached to the buildings; one of a light construction, but perfectly safe, has been erected on the west side of the "Home," whereby invalids could be placed in security outside the brick wall until assistance was procured from below, a staircase being attached by which the inmates could be conveyed to the ground.

The Library has been largely increased during the year, but there is room still for more books, and we ask for further additions, which may serve to while away the weary hours of those who live among us.

From a family of 39 in 1881 we advanced to 45 in 1882, and to-day, in 1883, we number 59 on our roll, 35 women, and 24 men being at present in the "Home."

During the year we have to record the deaths of thirteen (13) inmates, 7 women and 6 men, and to mention that 6 patients returned to their families.

The Board has been called during the past year to lament the removal by death of three of its members. Mrs. Burns, whose well known Christian sympathy and philanthropy found fresh scope in her connection with the "Home," and whose personal intercourse with the inmates is much missed. Mr. Jas. Michie, to whose liberality the establishment of the "Home" was largely due, and whose warm interest in it was manifested up to the time of his death; and our venerable President, the Hon. John McMurrich, who devoted time and strength ungrudgingly to the advancement of the interests of the "Home," and whose watchful care contributed so largely to the success of the institution, that the managers feel it will be extremely difficult to fill the blank caused by his removal.

Kind friends have continued to provide music at religious services, and others have given entertainments for the relaxation and amusement of the inmates.

We thank the clergy who have so kindly administered to the spiritual condition of those in the "Home."

Also the medical staff who have been very assiduous in their attendance.

MEDICAL REPORT.

For presenting this, the Ninth Annual Report of the "Home," the Medical Staff beg to inform the Directors, that there are at present under their care fifty-nine (59) patients.

During the past year there have been thirteen (13) deaths—five from cancer, five from paralysis, one from convulsions, one from consumption, and one from rheumatism.

We would submit for the consideration of the Managers of the institution, that the admission of patients suffering from cancer is, in our present limited accommodation, attended with much extra labour and expense, and that in consequence of the offensive nature of the disease, such persons require to be separated from the other inmates, and moreover, as it was the intention of the founders of the "Home" to afford relief to the greatest number possible, their object is defeated by having so many persons in it suffering from this malignant disease.

We would also suggest that the habit of admitting persons in a dying condition should be discontinued. It is both cruel to the poor sufferers to remove them from their residences when so feeble, and expensive to the institution.

It is our pleasing duty to acknowledge the never failing attention and tender care bestowed by Mrs. Craigie and the nurses upon those placed under their charge.

The public can never too highly appreciate the work being done by the ladies who preside over the "Home," theirs is a labour of love, and worthy of all admiration.

ANNUAL MEETING.

The annual meeting of the "Home" was held on Wednesday afternoon the 14th March.

His Worship the Mayor was in the chair.

Devotional exercises were conducted by the Revs. W. A. Hunter and T. W. Campbell.

The Annual Report, together with the Treasurer's report for the past year, were read by Mr. Barlow Cumberland; The Building Fund account by Mr. W. B. McMurrich, and the Medical Report by Dr. Thorburn.

It was moved by Mr. Alexander Manning, seconded by Mr. R. Kilgour, and resolved

"That the reports now read be adopted, and printed for circulation."

On motion of Rev. H. M. Parsons, seconded by Rev. Dr. Reid, the following resolution passed by the Board of Management at a recent meeting in reference to the death of the Honourable J. McMurrich was adopted:

"The Directors of the Toronto Home for Incurables desire to record their deep sense of the serious loss they have sustained in the removal by death of the Hon. J. McMurrich, the late honoured President of this Board. They would also express their high appreciation of his wise counsels, earnest devotedness, and personal labours, so freely and heartily given, both to secure, and to perpetuate this noble charity.

"His skill, prudence and foresight, in management of its finances, have enabled this Board to project and to execute plans for comfort and enlargement, which otherwise must have been long delayed.

"During the last year he has freely devoted an amount of time to the duties of his office, which we are convinced very few can be found able to command, and by his watchful and constant exertions in care and charge of the grounds and building, he often overtaxed his physical strength.

In accordance with notice given at last annual meeting, Rev. D. J. Macdonnell moved :

"That the words 'and Vice President' be inserted after the word 'President,' in the 12th line of Section V. of the Constitution, so as to read 'There shall be chosen annually and by the vote of the Board, a President and Vice President.'"

The motion was seconded by Mr. T. M. Thomson and carried.

On motion of Rev. Septimus Jones, seconded by Rev. P. M. McLeod, it was resolved :

"That we give thanks to God for the good which by His blessing has been accomplished, and commend the 'Home' anew to the cordial sympathy and support of the Christian community."

The officers and the Board of Management for the ensuing year were appointed on motion of Rev. C. Ingles and seconded by Dr. Richardson.

It was moved by Mr. W. H. Howland, seconded by Mr. Wm. Gooderham and resolved :

"That steps be taken to remove without delay the mortgage debt remaining on the building."

His Worship the Mayor made a few remarks expressive of his interest in the "Home," and of encouragement to those who are engaged in this work.

On motion of Dr. Thorburn, seconded by Rev. D. J. Macdonnell, a vote of thanks was given to His Worship, the Mayor, for his kindness in presiding at this meeting.

The Benediction was pronounced by the Rev. H. M. Parsons.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

HOME FOR INCURABLES.

Adopted and Amended 14th March, 1883.

I. This Institution shall be known as "The Toronto Home for Incurables."

II. Its objects shall be to afford maintenance, nursing, and medical and surgical aid to persons suffering from incurable disease, and to provide for them, while inmates of the Home, the ministrations of the Gospel.

III. Every subscriber of two dollars and upwards per annum, shall

be entitled to vote at the annual meeting, at which a Board of Managers shall be elected for the ensuing twelve months. Every individual who shall pay, in advance, and at one time, the sum of fifty dollars, shall be entitled to the same privilege for life.

IV. All money now in the possession of the "Home," or which may hereafter be collected or acquired by it, shall be applied (unless otherwise directed by the donor) to the general objects, uses and requirements of the Home. Persons may donate for special objects, and effect will be given to the wishes of such contributors, so far as they can be carried out without conflicting with the Constitution and By-laws of the Home.

V. The affairs of the Home shall be under the direction, control and management of a Board of Managers, of whom at least forty shall be ladies and twelve gentlemen, and who shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers qualified as set forth in Article III. The medical staff attending the Home shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers. In case of a vacancy arising, the Board may elect a member to fill the vacancy until the next annual general meeting.

The Board shall control and direct all the business of the Institution, and their decisions upon all points of management shall be final.

There shall be chosen annually, and by the vote of the Board, a President and Vice-President, and from among the Lady Managers the following officers, viz:—First Lady Directress, Second Lady Directress, Third Lady Directress, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

For the more convenient working of the Institution, the Board may from time to time appoint committees of not less than three of their number, such as an Executive Committee and committees for visiting and superintending the Home.

The Board may also enact By-laws for regulating the duties of the the various officers and employees of the Home. The By-laws shall not be altered except at a regular meeting, after notice duly given at least a month previously.

VI. The Board of Managers shall hold stated meetings at least once a month, and may hold adjourned meetings when necessary. At such monthly meetings the Board shall have power to make additional By-laws for regulating its own government, and for the government of the

officers and employees, as before provided, and when necessary, after due notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President and one of the Lady Directresses, or on requisition of five or more members of the Board. When a special meeting is called, the time and place of meeting, and the business for which it is called, shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting, and no other business shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting of the subscribers qualified as set forth in Article III. shall be held during the month of March.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers to make all necessary arrangements for said annual meeting ; to lay before the subscribers a report of the proceedings of the previous twelve months ; and to exhibit a full and accurate view of the funds, property and effects of the Home.

VIII. In view of the large contributions given by the citizens of Toronto, and the grant made by the City Council in aid of the Home, applicants from the City of Toronto for admission to the Home shall have the preference over others.

IX. The Board will receive incurable persons from any municipality in Ontario outside of Toronto on condition that a bond be given by said municipality to pay such sum as the Board may determine from time to time for the maintenance of each patient so sent.

Provided always that a certificate be given by the gaol surgeon of the municipality, or by such other medical gentleman as the Board may approve, that the person seeking admission is incurable ; provided also that such certificate be endorsed by the medical officers of this Institution.

X. The foregoing Constitution shall not be altered, unless it be at an annual general meeting of subscribers, notice of such alteration having been given at the previous annual meeting, and two-thirds of those present consenting thereto.
