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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

Province of Quebec Rifle Association.

CONSTITUTION.

RULE 1. That this Association be called the "*Province of Quebec Rifle Association*," and shall have for its object, the encouragement of Rifle shooting in the Province.

2. That the Annual Subscription for Individual Members be two dollars, and a donation of twenty dollars in cash, at any one time for that express purpose, shall entitle the donor to apply to be elected a life member at the next annual meeting of Council.

3. That any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps, may become affiliated to this Association, by the payment of an annual subscription of not less than ten dollars, the number of memberships to be in proportion to one for every half dollar so subscribed.

4. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Council composed of the office-bearers, and two representatives from each affiliated Association in this Province. Five to form a quorum.

5. The office-bearers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary-Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the annual meeting; all office-bearers must be individual members of the Association.

6. A Patron and Vice-Patrons may be elected at the first meeting and afterwards whenever a vacancy occurs.

7. The Deputy Adjutant-Generals and Brigade Majors of the Province, being members of the Association, shall be members, ex-officio, of the Council.

8. The Representatives to the Council must be members of Association, either by affiliation or otherwise; they shall be chosen annually by the Association they represent, and their names sent to the Secretary, at least one month before the annual meeting; and to entitle to vote any changes must be duly notified to the Secretary.

9. The Council may from time to time make such By-Laws for their proper guidance as they may deem necessary, but no by-law to be altered or new one proposed, without at least such notice being given to each member of the Council, as by the by-laws may be determined.

10. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be agreed on at the annual business meeting.

11. The Annual Business Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on, by the by-laws; and this meeting terminates the previous year's business.

12. An Annual Report shall be made by the Secretary-Treasurer and submitted to the Council, previous to publication.

13. At its annual meeting the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee of eleven of its members, who with the Secretary-Treasurer, shall carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, and give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

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BY-LAWS.

1. That the Annual Meeting of the Association be held at Montreal on the first Thursday in May.

2. Extraordinary Meetings may be called by the Secretary, when required by any six members of the Council; fifteen days notice of such meeting given to each member of the Council, and the requisition must state the object for which the meeting is called; but no change in the constitution, by-laws, or special decisions of Council shall be made without one month's notice of motion prior to the annual meeting, and no change shall take effect without a majority of two-thirds of the members present.

3. Three Auditors shall be appointed annually, whose duties shall be to examine the Treasurer's accounts previous to the Annual Meeting.

4. The Treasurer shall be required to deposit from time to time all sums of money paid over to him, on behalf of the Association—in a safe bank.

5. The payment of sums for current expenses must be authorized by the President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents. Other payments to be made only upon the authority of the Council.

MINUTES
OF THE
ELEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING
OF THE
PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION

HELD IN THE MILITIA OFFICE, MONTREAL,

THURSDAY, MAY 6TH, 1880.

PRESENT:—Lt.-Col. Fletcher, C.M.G., Dept. Adj. General, Mil. Dis. No. 5, Lt.-Col. McEachern, C.M.G., Lt.-Col. Rowe, Lt.-Col. Gardner, Lt.-Col. Crawford, Lt.-Col. Sinton, Lt.-Col. Bacon, Major Bond, Major Mudge, Captain Balfour, Captain Massey, Lieutenant Whitman, Lieutenant Lydon.

Lt.-Col. McEachern, C.M.G., Presiding.

It was moved by Lt.-Col. Rowe, seconded by Lt.-Col. Crawford, and carried unanimously "That as the Proceedings of the last Annual Meeting had been printed and distributed they be taken as read."

The Secretary (Lt.-Col. Bacon) then read his annual report, and in the unavoidable absence of the Treasurer (Lt.-Col. Fraser) through the sudden death of his mother, the financial statement for the year just ended, shewing a balance to the credit of the Association of \$494.08, when it was moved by Major Bond, seconded by Lt.-Col. Sinton, and *carried* "That the Secretary's report and the Treasurer's financial statement just read be adopted and printed for distribution."

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province, having accepted was duly elected Patron of the Association.

It was resolved that the list of Vice-Patrons remains the same as last year, with the exception of substituting the name of Lt.-Col. Brydges for the late Hon. L. H. Holton, and leaving off Hon. L. R. Masson, M.P., elected President.

The Hon. L. R. Masson, M. P., was unanimously elected President.

The list of Vice-Presidents was by resolution changed by striking off the names of Lt.-Col. Grant and Lt.-Col. Hanson, and adding those of Lt.-Col. Fraser, Lt.-Col. Crawford, Lt.-Col. Rowe, Lt.-Col. Hall and Lt.-Col. Ouimet.

It was then moved by Major Bond, seconded by Lt.-Col. Gardner, and *carried* "That the offices of Secretary and Treasurer be merged into one, and that Lt.-Col. Bacon be elected Secretary-Treasurer."

Lt.-Col. D'Orsonnens and Lt.-Col. Hon. M. Aylmer were elected Executive Officers for the coming Annual Matches.

Auditors elected were: Lt.-Col. McEachern, C.M.G., Major Bond and Captain Balfour.

Executive Committee proposed by Lt.-Col. Sinton, seconded by Capt. Massey: Lt.-Cols. Fletcher, McEachern, Martin, Aylmer, D'Orsonnens, Whitehead, J. D. Crawford, Major Bond, Captains Balfour and Scott, and Lieut. Whitman, and carried after another list of names proposed in amendment by Captain Balfour, had been submitted to the meeting and lost.

Surgeon, W. H. Mayrand, Esq., M.D., 11th Battalion, re-elected.

Representative Members to Council of D. of C. R. A., Lt.-Col. Bacon, Lt.-Col. Fraser, Lt.-Col. Rowe, Lt.-Col. Ouimet, Capt. Balfour.

It was then unanimously resolved that the Annual Prize Meeting should commence at Point St. Charles Rifle ranges, on Tuesday, 10th August, and that the Executive Committee be authorized to prepare the programme and carry out the matches.

Moved by Major Johnson, seconded by Capt. Balfour, "That the usual grant of \$100 be made to the Secretary." *Carried.*

Moved by Lt.-Col. McEachern, seconded by Captain Balfour, "That the perpetual disqualification passed on Sergeants Wynne and Wilson, at the meeting of the Executive Committee, held August 11th, 1875, be now withdrawn." *Carried.*

Moved by Major Johnson, seconded by Lt.-Col. Rowe, "That the back position in all matches with military rifles be disallowed.

Moved in amendment by Capt. Balfour, seconded by Major Mudge, "That the motion be deferred until the decision of the National Rifle Association of England on the subject is made known." The amendment was lost and the main motion carried.

Moved by Captain Balfour, seconded by Lt.-Col. Sinton, "That in view of the many changes recently effected in the management of sister associations, and the necessity of keeping up with the times, a committee of three, consisting of Lt.-Col. Martin, Major Mudge and the mover, be appointed to consider whether or not a revision of the Constitution and By-laws of this association could be made tending to its advantage. The proposed changes, if any, to be laid before a meeting of members of the association for consideration and suggestions, on the second day of the Annual Matches for the current year, and to be submitted for adoption to next annual meeting of Council." *Carried.*

The meeting then adjourned.

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ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Province of Quebec Rifle Association.

It has been the custom for many years past, to say that the records of the last year's proceedings shew that the work of the Associations has been carried on efficiently and successfully. Now, although the last year is no exception to this rule, it is doubtful, unless some extra effort is made, whether the next Annual matches will bring together as many competitors as have heretofore participated in them. This not so much from any falling off in number of prizes as from extra inducement offered at other Rifle meetings, and more especially at the Annual matches of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association held at Ottawa; perhaps it will be well to consider if it is possible to arrange our Provincial meeting in such a way as to bring forward more young shots, to take the place on the Prize lists of some of those whose names, year after year, appear thereon.

This year, unfortunately, finds us in the same position as last as regards a permanent range, and every year brings us nearer to what must inevitably occur, namely, the loss of the ranges, unless some determined effort be made to secure the possession of them by the Government, either by purchase or exchange.

The Association possesses eleven sets of canvass targets, an increase of four from last year, a most valuable addition, facilitating, as it does, not only the Annual matches, but the practice of the city corps of Montreal.

An effort should this year be made to increase the Prize list and make it more attractive, and a strong appeal should be made to induce subscriptions from the Corporation and the citizens of Montreal. Seven or eight years ago they responded handsomely to such an appeal, and would doubtless do so again if properly approached. The Association is of great benefit to the City Force, and the members of it should shew their appreciation of it by taking this matter up heartily.

An invitation has been received from the N. R. A. of the United States to compete at Creedmoor, on the 16th September next, in the International Military Match, for the "Hilton Challenge Trophy" value \$3000; if our funds would permit, we might try to train up a Team for this competition.

A notice of motion has been given with reference to the back position in shooting in military matches; from present indications, both in the discussions at the N. R. A. in England, and at the Dominion of Canada R. A. Annual meeting, this year, it is pretty certain that in military matches, at least, this position is doomed to be abolished before long, and it will be well to consider if it would not be for the benefit of our Riflemen for the Association to banish it in all Snider and Martini Henry competitions at least.

The entries in the matches last year compare favorably with the previous year, although a reduction was made in the Prize list, but this can scarcely be expected to continue, and it will be well to consider what extra inducements can be held out to bring Riflemen to compete at the Annual matches. A Battalion challenge cup, and an Association challenge cup, would be a valuable addition to the list of Prizes, if our funds would allow us to offer them.

The telephone used last year to communicate between the firing points and the targets in place of using a horse to ride backwards and forwards, was found to be a great convenience, and the thanks of the Association are due to Mr. Grant, of the Montreal Telegraph Company, for the assistance he gave in

the construction of it, as well as to Major Kennedy and his engineers, who assisted therein.

The Executive Committee was authorized at the last annual meeting, to purchase ten Martini Henry Rifles, to be offered as Prizes at the Annual matches, and the Secretary took advantage of the presence in England, of Captain Boyd, and wrote to him, requesting him to purchase the best rifles of the required pattern that could be had; this, through the powerful influence of Colonel Gzowski, was effected at the lowest possible price, and the rifles sent out were of the newest pattern; the thanks of the Association are due to Colonel Gzowski and Captain Boyd, for the trouble they took in the interests of the Association.

The Association have again to thank the Dominion Government for its continual support in the shape of the Annual grant of \$1700, and also the Provincial Government for the Annual grant of \$500.

To His Excellency the Governor-General, the best thanks of the Association are due for his kindly support, and the presentation of a silver and bronze medal as annual prizes at our matches.

Were it not for these liberal grants, the work of the Association could scarcely be carried on.
