

A POSTAL LIBRARY

A postal library for Canada is the ambitious project launched by the Postal Library League of Lethbridge, Alberta, of which Mr. Joseph P. Tracy, the commissioner of commerce and manufacture in that city, is the leading spirit. 

George M. Elliott, secretary of the Canadian Defence League, gave an address last evening at Bond's restaurant, on the subject of Universal Military Training. Dr. H. S. Bridges occupied the chair. The subject was dealth with at considerable length, and those present gave an appreciative hearing. Mr. Elliott said in part:

"I am not belittling the volunteers of Canada, but deprecating the system. Whilst the militia costs you \$1.25 per head of the population, it is calculated that, taking the force as 50,000, the average cost per head to them is more than \$25. Before going farther let me bring to your notice the objects of the League I represent. They are:

(a) To maintain Canadian nationality and keep British connection.

(b) To awaken the public mind to the serious importance of national defence, and to aid in bringing about the adoption of the most effective and economical system to that end.

(c) To carry on a non-political, educational campaign looking to the adoption of the principle of patriotic unpaid, or universal naval or military training, in the belief that such training conduces to the industrial, physical and moral elevation of the whole people, and is essential to national safety. 

Ottawa, March 5—The Social Service Congress discussed political purity at the session today. The speakers included Prof. W. W. Andrews, Regina; W. C. Good, president of the Dominion Grange and Farmers' Associations; J. W. M. Aitkins, Dr. Adam Shortt, chairman of the Civil Service Commission.

Several resolutions were passed at this afternoon's session calling on the dominion government to appoint a royal commission to investigate and make a report on the coal miners' strike on Vancouver Island; to prevent the manufacture, importation and sale of cigarettes in Canada; to establish free employment bureaus; to appoint a royal commission to investigate the unemployment problem; to enact a policy that will raise the Indians to a level of citizenship; to adopt a closer inspection of immigrants from southern Europe; to create a department of child welfare; to give pensions to mothers; to initiate an bid pension scheme; and to assist the extension of co-operative societies.

The congress went on record as being a favor of Woman suffrage, labor mions, total abstinence and social survey work. A resolution recommending hat civil servants be appointed for the uside service, and to give them their olitical rights—it was not decided just that these rights are—caused a warm iscussion and finally the resolution went ack for re-consideration to the resolutions committee along with one to ask
