Progress of the Revolution.—We have just been informed that Mr. Chaffers, of whose expulsion from St. Cesaire by the radicals so much has been said, returned to that place on Friday last. Our informant, Mr. Thomas Wood, a resident of St. Cesaire, tells us that since the flight of the rebels at Point Olivier, a small party of loyalists of the place, himself among the number, have gone round disarming all the adherents, of the rebel party. Eighty stand of arms, barrel and a half of powder, and a canister of ball cartridge, were the finit of their labours. Forty of these guns are now in the hands of Major Trydell, of the 83d Regiment. On Wednesday last a loyal meeting was held, at which 300 persons were present. The Cure addressed the meeting in a speech of an hour and a half in length, and was followed by Messrs. MONTREAL, Decemr. 23.—The Toronto Commercial Herald says that there are 225 prisoners confined in the Toronto prison, captured since the commencement of the late disturbance.

Montreal, Deceme 23.—The Toronto Commercial Herald says that there are 225 prisoners confined in the Toronto prison, captured since the commencement of the late disturbance.

Seventy one of the prisoners brought in on Sunday from St. Eustache have since been discharged unpunished, and ready to engage in rebellion anew. They were taken in arms, and surely deserved something more severe than a march to Montreal. This elemency to the habitans may either argue an extension of it to their guilty leaders, or that a concentrated measure of justice will be awarded them, which we trust will be the case. We have seen a letter from a gentleman in the country, whose store has been pillaged of goods to the value of 3 thousand pounds. He says that the spirit of disaffection in St. Hyacinthe, Rouville, and the surrounding district is as rife as ever, that the holtans are encouraged in rebellion by the elemency of the Government, and that nothing but a strong military force will render it safe for loyalists to dwell in that part of the country. Similar accounts have already been received from St. Eustache, and a company of Royals has been dispatched to protect the inhabitants from plunder.

Amury Girod, the traitor, who committed suicide when about to be apprehended on Monday last, was buried on Tuesday in the Queen's highway.
