An Act to amend chapter fifty-three of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada respecting Weights and Measures.

WHEREAS the discretionary power now allowed to the parties to any contract for the sale and delivery of grain, vegetables and other articles, to the measures established by law, consider as not being obligatory, is prejudicial to the inhabitants both of the towns and rural districts, and it has become necessary to amend the law in that respect: Preamble.

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. Section five of Chapter fifty-three of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada intituled, An Act concerning certain Weights and Measures, is amended by striking out the following words at the end of the said Section “unless the contrary appears to have been agreed upon by the parties.” Sect. 5 of cap. 53, Con. Stat. Can. amended.

2. Section six of the said Act is amended by striking out the following words at the end of the said Section “unless the contrary appears to have been agreed upon by the parties.” Section 6 amended.
