London, Jan. 25.—There is no confidence here of the report that the Japanese ambassador in London, Baron Hayashi, has said that the Japanese government had previously decided not to take any military measures, or any steps which could be construed as being prejudicial to the negotiations. "When Japan decides to take action," he will announce it frankly to Russia and the rest of the world.

According to Baron Hayashi, the situation here has considerably improved. The Russian ambassador, Count Benckendorff, when questioned as to the truth of the rumor that the only of Russia to Japan was sent from St. Petersburg yesterday, said: "It is not true."

Count Benckendorff significantly remarked as he believed the question of Japanese assistance in Manchuria to be the most important outstanding question.

"But this," he added, "certainly does not mean words going to war about. As regards the Japanese demand for the inclusion of a Russian ally in the Russo-Japanese alliance, the Japanese government is merely a matter of words, and surely no war about words would be justifiable. So, I am hopeful of peaceful talks of the negotiations."
