Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton, and Halifax, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in the Dominion of Canada.

The times of the SUN'S RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton, Halifax, and Fort Garry.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton, Halifax, and Fort Garry.

The column, SUN ON MERIDIAN, gives the time that a watch should show when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

MOON'S AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. When in the column headed Moon's rising or setting, or Moon on meridian, the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The MOON'S MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for a point in latitude 45° and longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR shews for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. It passes the meridian in the morning from April 9 to October 8, and in the afternoon from October 10 to April 8. On October 9, there are two transits, namely, at 6m. 21s. a.m. and at 11h. 56m. 25s. p.m.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

The six last columns will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

From the time of the upper transit of the pole star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.

MOON'S PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the four meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0°, 90°, 180°, and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, i. e., the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 45°. When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar, or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45°.

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

If the altitude of Pola is above the horizontal plane observed at the time of its meridian transit be corrected for refraction, the latitude of the place of observation will be found by subtracting the polar distance from the altitude so corrected, for the upper transit, and by adding the polar distance to the corrected altitude, for lower transit.

By observing Polaris with a horizontal circle at the time of its upper or lower meridian transit the direction of the meridian may also be found; but as its motion in azimuth at these instants is more rapid than at other points of its course, any error in the time will then produce the *greatest possible* effect on the azimuth. Near the time of greatest elongation, on the other hand, the change of azimuth is very slow; so that an error in the supposed time of observation will occasion a comparatively *small* error in the azimuth. On this account the instant of greatest elongation east or west of the meridian is the time most favourable for the determination of the meridian.

Again, as the point of greatest elongation is the one at which the change of altitude is most rapid, any error in the time will produce a comparatively large error in the altitude. Hence this part of the star's path is the *worst* that could be taken for finding the latitude.

As the transits of Polaris and the times of its greatest elongation often take place when the sky is clouded, or during daylight, some days may sometimes pass without the occurrence of an opportunity favorable for these observations with Polaris.

To remedy to some degree this inconvenience, tables are herewith given which contain the times of transit of three other circumpolar stars, with the intervals between the times of transit and of greatest elongation; and also their azimuths at the same instant.

Of the three stars β , ϵ , & δ Ursæ Minoris, δ , from being nearest to the pole, is on the whole the best adapted for the determination of the meridian; while β , though convenient on account of its greater brightness, is less suitable than the other two; since the length of the interval between the times of its meridian passage and greatest elongation, as well as its azimuth at the latter time, are both greatly affected by a change in the latitude.

On examining the table, it will be seen that an error of 10' in the assumed latitude will occasion an error of about 4' in the azimuth of the star.

In order to harmonize with the rest of the Calendar, where the times of transit of Polaris have been usually placed, the transits of that star are given in *civil* time; for greater convenience however the transits of β , ϵ , & δ Ursæ Minoris in the following table are in *astronomical* time, being reckoned from noon to noon. For the sake of brevity the transits are given for the 1st, 11th and 21st, and also on those days when *two* transits take place.

The times of meridian passage on any intermediate day may be readily found with sufficient accuracy by subtracting the following numbers from the recorded time that next precedes it in the table.

As in the case of the Pole Star, the lower transits of each of these stars will occur 11h 58m 2s (nearly) after the time of upper transit.

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of 45°.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual civil day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

Star Table.

From the times of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of culmination, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude.

To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the polestar given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the setting of a star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 45°.

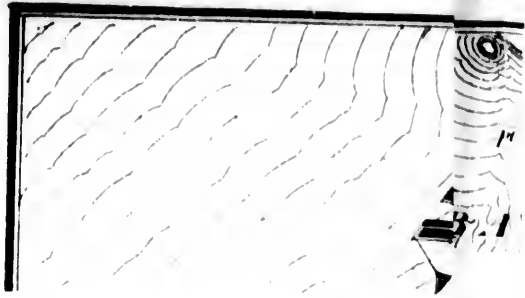

Eclipses

In the year 1872 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, May 22, 1872. The middle of the eclipse occurs before the Moon rises in Canada. The last contact with the shadow occurs soon after the Moon rises at Halifax and Fredericton, but before she rises at western stations. The last contact with the Penumbra takes place after the Moon rises at the places named below, but before she rises at Fort Garry.

The following Table contains the local mean astronomical times at which such phases are visible occur.

II.—An annular eclipse of the Sun, June 4, 1872, invisible in Canada. The line of central eclipse extends from a point in the Indian Ocean (Lat. 5° 47' N., Long. 102° E.), across the Indian Peninsula and China, to a point in the Pacific (Lat. 27° 32' N., and Long. 155° 36' W.)

III.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, November 11, 1872, visible in Canada.

The local mean times at which the various phases occur at different stations are given in the following table.

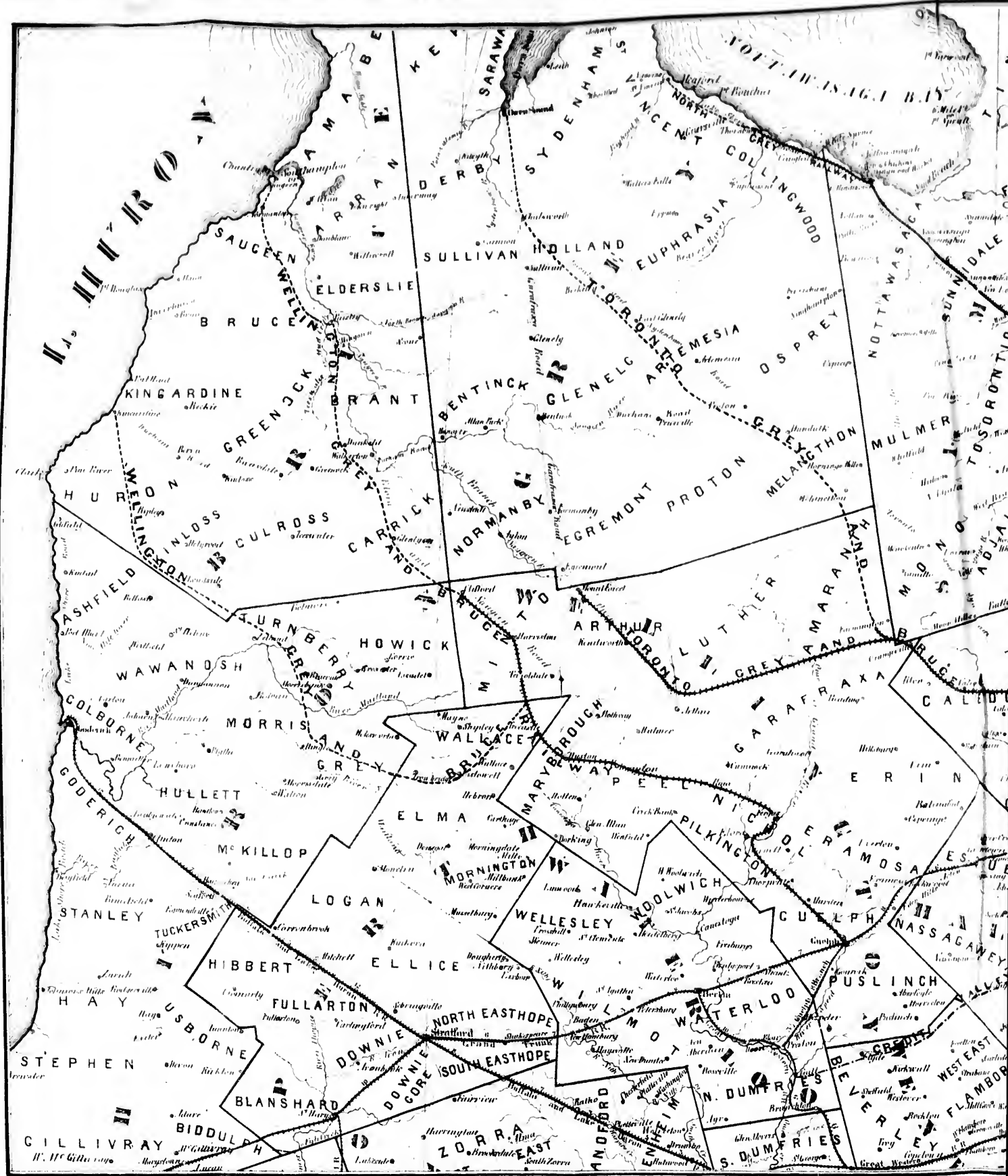
The first contact with the shadow occurs at 11° from the northernmost point of the Moon's limb towards the west; and the last contact at 2° towards the west, in each case for direct images. Magnitude of the Eclipse (Moon's diameter=1) 0.923.

IV.—A total eclipse of the Sun, November 29, 1872, invisible in Canada. The line of central eclipse extends from a point in the South Pacific (Lat. 12° 15' S.; Long. 173° 12' W.) eastward, south of Cape Horn, to a point in the South Atlantic (Lat. 41° 29' S.; Long. 12° 33' W.)

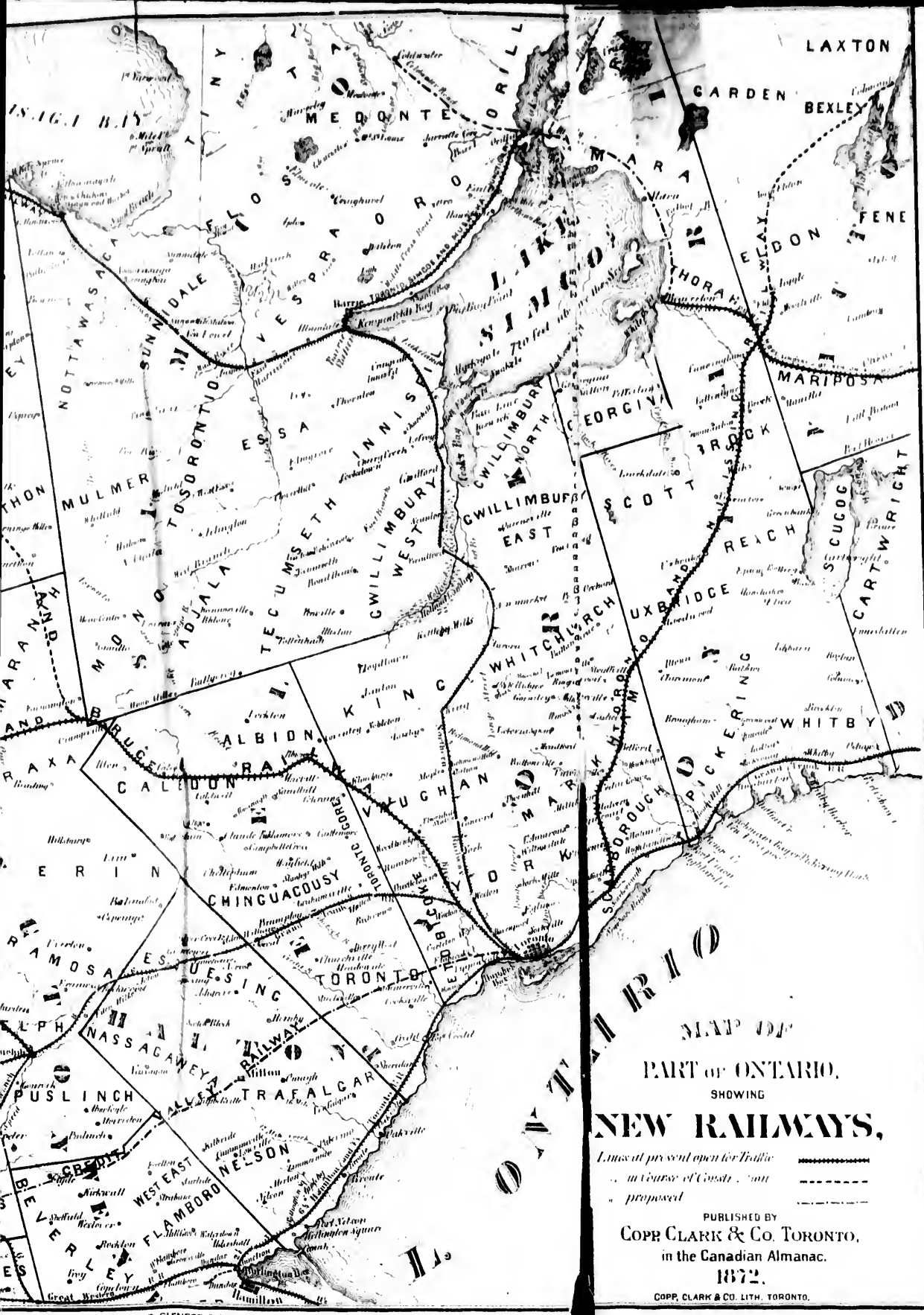

FISHERIES OF THE DOMINION.

The aggregate value of the Fish products of the Provincial Fisheries is computed, by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries, to be nearly seventeen millions of dollars. Americans employ—tonnage varying—between eight and eleven hundred vessels in these Fisheries.

Their estimated annual catch is valued at about eight millions of dollars. The probable value of capital embarked in carrying on the Inshore Fisheries is computed at nine millions of dollars. Thus making a total interest of some seventeen millions of dollars.

THE METRIC SYSTEM.

An Act to render permissive the use of the Metric or of the Decimal System of Weights and Measures.—34 Vic. cap. 24.

WHEREAS for the promotion and extension of the internal, as well as of the foreign trade of Canada, and for the advancement of science, it is expedient to legalize the use of the Metric System of Weights and Measures: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Metric Weights and Measures Act, 1871."

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act or Law now in force to the contrary, no contract or dealing shall be deemed to be invalid or open to objection, on the ground that the weights or measures expressed or referred to in such contract or dealing, are weights or measures of the Metric System, or on the ground that decimal subdivisions of legal weights and measures, whether Metric or otherwise, are used in such contract or dealing.

3. The tables in the schedules hereto annexed shall be deemed to set forth, in terms of the standard weights and measures of Canada and the United Kingdom, the equivalents of the weights and measures therein expressed in terms of the Metric System; and such tables may be lawfully used for computing, determining and expressing, in weights and measures of Canada and of the United Kingdom, weights and measures of the Metric System.

4. Whenever the Governor in Council is of opinion that it has become necessary and desirable, he may direct Standards of Metric Weights and Measures to be procured and legalized, and verified copies of them to be provided, and may by Order in Council make regulations for authorizing and facilitating the use of the same, for the verification of Metric Weights and Measures in use in Canada.

We insert this year another Prize Problem; and those who send in its solution before February 15th, 1872, will have a chance for Smith's Classical Dictionary.

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The Colony of British Columbia, by order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 20th day of July, 1871, was admitted into the Union or Dominion of Canada. The following are the terms of union:

Canada to be liable for the debts and liabilities of British Columbia existing at the time of the Union.

British Columbia not having incurred debts equal to those of the other Provinces now constituting the Dominion, to be entitled to receive, by half-yearly payments in advance from the General Government, interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum on the difference between the actual amount of its indebtedness at the date of the Union, and the indebtedness per head of the Provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick (27.77), the population of British Columbia being taken at 60,000.

The following sums to be paid by Canada to British Columbia for the support of its Government and Legislature, to wit, an annual subsidy of \$35,000 and an annual grant equal to 80 cents per head of the said population of 60,000, both half-yearly in advance, such grant of 80 cents per head to be augmented in proportion to the increase of population, as may be shown by each decennial census, until the population amounts to 400,000, at which rate such grant shall thereafter remain, it being understood that the first census be taken in the year 1881.

The Dominion to provide an efficient mail service, fortnightly, by steam communication, between Victoria and San Francisco, and twice a week between Victoria and Olympia; the vessels to be adapted for the conveyance of freight and passengers.

Canada to assume and defray the charges for the following services:—Salary of the Lieutenant Governor; Salaries and allowances of the Judges of the Superior Courts and the County or District Courts; the charges in respect to the Department of Customs; the Postal and Telegraphic services; protection and encouragement of Fisheries; provision for the Militia; lighthouses, buoys and beacons, shipwrecked crews, quarantine and marine hospitals, including a marine hospital at Victoria; the Geological Survey; the Penitentiary; and such further charges as may be incident to and connected with the services which, by the British North America Act of 1867, appertain to the General Government, and as aforesaid may be allowed to the other Provinces.

Suitable pensions, such as are approved of by Her Majesty's Government, to be provided by the Government of the Dominion for those of Her Majesty's servants in the Colony whose position and emoluments derived therefrom were affected by political changes on the admission of British Columbia into the Dominion of Canada.

The existing Customs Tariff and Excise Duties to continue in force in British Columbia until the Railway from the Pacific coast and the system of railways in Canada are connected, unless the Legislature of British Columbia should sooner decide to accept the Tariff and Excise Laws of Canada. When Customs and Excise Duties are, at the time of the Union of British Columbia with Canada, leviable on any goods, wares, or merchandises in British Columbia, or in the other Provinces of the Dominion, those goods, wares and merchandises, from and after the union, be imported into British Columbia from the Provinces now composing the Dominion, or from either of those Provinces into British Columbia, on proof of payment of the Customs or Excise Duties leviable thereon in the Province of exportation, and on payment of such further amount (if any) of Customs or Excise Duties as are leviable thereon in the Province of importation. This arrangement to have no force or effect after the assimilation of the Tariff and Excise Duties of British Columbia with those of the Dominion.

British Columbia to be entitled to be represented in the Senate by three members, and by six members in the House of Commons. The representation to be increased under the provisions of the "British North America Act of 1867."

The influence of the Dominion Government to be used to secure the continued maintenance of the naval station at Esquimaux.

The provisions of the "British North America Act of 1867," to be applicable to British Columbia in the same way and to the like extent as they apply to the other Provinces of the Dominion, and as if the Province of

British Columbia had been one of the Provinces originally united by the said Act.

The Government of the Dominion undertake to secure the commencement simultaneously, within two years from the date of union, of the construction of a Railway from the Pacific towards the Rocky Mountains, and from such point as may be selected, east of the Rocky Mountains, towards the Pacific, to connect the seaboard of British Columbia with the Railway system of Canada; and further, to secure the completion of such Railway within ten years from the date of the union.

And the Government of British Columbia agree to convey to the Dominion Government, in trust, to be appropriated in such manner as the Dominion Government may deem advisable in furtherance of the construction of the said Railway, a similar extent of public lands along the line of Railway throughout its entire length in British Columbia, not to exceed, however, twenty (20) miles on each side of said line, as may be appropriated for the same purpose by the Dominion Government from the Public Lands in the North-west Territories and the Province of Manitoba. Provided that the quantity of land which may be held under pre-emption right or by Crown grant within the limits of the tract of land in British Columbia to be so conveyed to the Dominion Government shall be made good to the Dominion from contiguous public lands; and provided further, that until the commencement, within two years, as aforesaid, from the date of the union, of the construction of the said Railway, the Government of British Columbia shall not sell or alienate any further portions of the public lands of British Columbia in any other way than under right of pre-emption, requiring actual residence of the pre-emptor on the land claimed by him. In consideration of the land to be so conveyed in aid of the construction of the said Railway, the Dominion Government agree to pay to British Columbia from the date of the union, the sum of \$100,000 per annum in half-yearly payments in advance.

The Dominion Government will guarantee the interest for ten years from the date of the completion of the works, at the rate of five per centum per annum, on such sum, not exceeding £100,000 sterling, as may be required for the construction of a first class graving dock at Esquimaux.

The charge of the Indians, and the trusteeship and management of the lands reserved for their use and benefit to be assumed by the Dominion Government, and a policy as liberal as that hitherto pursued by the British Columbia government to be continued by the Dominion Government after the union.

To carry out such policy, tracts of land of such extent as it has hitherto been the practice of the British Columbia Government to appropriate for that purpose, shall from time to time be conveyed by the Local Government to the Dominion Government in trust for the use and benefit of the Indians, on application of the Dominion Government; and in case of disagreement between the two Governments respecting the quantity of such tracts of land to be so granted, the matter shall be referred for the decision of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

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MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS AND SCHOOLS.

MEDICAL COUNCIL.—The act, called "The Ontario Medical Act," incorporates the whole profession of Ontario under the name of "The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario," and grants certain powers to the College which are exercised by an executive body called "The Council of the College, &c." The profession, through its Council, has the power of establishing a curriculum of studies, which shall be observed by all medical teaching bodies in Ontario, and by all students of medicine.

The act also deprives all universities, colleges or schools of medicine of the privilege hitherto enjoyed, of granting a diploma entitling its holder to legal recognition in this Province, and places the sole licensing power in the hands of a Board of Examiners to be annually appointed by the Council. The degree or diploma of an university or college of any part of the world henceforth only possesses an honorary value in Ontario, unless granted before the 23rd day of July, 1869. Only British or Colonial diplomas confer any rights if granted before that date.

Every person, in order to become legally qualified to practice, is required to have his name registered in the Register kept by the Registrar of the College. This Register is published annually and sold to the public, and may be obtained by applying to the Registrar of the College.

LETTER RATES, ETC.

Canada.—Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Dominion pass, if prepaid, for 3 cents per ½ oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 5 cents per ½ oz. Letters mailed at any office for delivery by or from that same office, are charged one cent each and must be prepaid, otherwise they are sent to the Dead Letter Office.

British Columbia.—The rate of postage on letters to British Columbia and Vancouver Island is the same as to any other Province in the Dominion.

Manitoba.—Letters, &c., for Manitoba are now charged the ordinary Canadian postage rates.

Newfoundland.—Postage on letters 1 ½ cents per ½ oz. Newspapers 2 cents each. Prepayment necessary.

Prince Edward Island.—Postage on letters 3 cents per ½ oz. if prepaid, 5 cents if unpaid. Newspapers 2 c. each.

United States.—The rate on letters to the United States is 6 cents per ½ oz. if prepaid, 10 cents if unpaid. Newspapers 2 cents each.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every Thursday, via Derry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 3d. stg. per ½ oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada to New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 4d. stg. per ½ oz.

A Canadian Packet leaves Liverpool every alternate Tuesday for Halifax, calling at Queenstown en route. Post-

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"By Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any Mail for Canada is a "Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

WEST INDIES VIA HALL AX.

Letters for the West Indies, British and Foreign, are sent via Halifax and Bermuda, monthly; postage 12 cents per ½ oz., newspapers 2 cents each; books, 6 cents per ½ oz. No unpaid correspondence forwarded by this route.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration. The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz.:

- On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America 2 cents.
- On Letters for the United States 5 "
- On Letters for the United Kingdom 8 "
- On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England 16 "
- On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via France (see Table).

On parcels, patterns, or samples, in Canada, 5 cents. On book packets & newspapers to United Kingdom, 8 cts. Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

PARCEL POST.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Dominion, is 12 ½ cents per 8 oz. (with 5 cts. additional if Registered.)

BOOK POST.

A Book Packet may contain any number of separate books, publications, works of literature and art, maps or prints, photographs, aquaerotypes, when not on glass, or in frames containing glass; any quantity of paper vellum or parchment (to the exclusion of letters); and the books, maps, papers, &c., may be either written, printed or plura; or any mixture of the three; and may be either British, Colonial or Foreign.

Book Packages must be open at both ends or both sides. The rate on Book Packets between any place in Canada, and to P. E. I. and Newfoundland, is one cent per ounce.

British and Foreign Postage Table.
VIA ENGLAND.

No. 2.—*Shewing the amount of Postage, to be collected in the Dominion of Canada, upon Letters, Newspapers, and Book Packets, forwarded by Canadian Mail Steamers, to the United Kingdom, and, through the United Kingdom to the undermentioned Colonies and Foreign Countries.*

In all cases the postage must be prepaid. Letters for the United Kingdom, if posted unpaid, or insufficiently paid, will be forwarded,—but they will be charged on delivery with the amount of deficient postage, and a fine of 3d. stg. No Book Packet addressed to Portugal, Madeira, the Azores, or Cape de Verda, must exceed 1lb. in weight; the weight of a Book Packet for Russia or Poland is limited to 8 oz.; the weight of any Packet of Patterns for Germany or Belgium is limited to 8 oz.; the weight of a Book Packet for Greece is limited to 3lbs. No such Packet for Greece must exceed 2 ft. in length, or 1 ft. in width or depth. Letters may be registered to all places, except those the names of which are followed by the letters *n r*, indicating that *no registration* can be effected. The Registration Fee on letters addressed to the United Kingdom, is 8 cents each. In all other cases the Registrar's Fee is 16 cents from Canada to the place of destination; except in those cases where an asterisk is prefixed, which *a Registration Fee of 8 cents each letter, and a postage of 4 cents per ½ oz. must be collected; to this must be added *double* the ordinary rate of Postage as given in this table. Upon Letters, Newspapers, and Book Packets for the United Kingdom, forwarded through the United States, via New York, the following *additional* rates must be collected, viz., 2 cents per ½ oz. for Letters, 2 cents each for Newspapers, and 2 cents per 4 oz. for Book Packets. Newspapers and Book Packets for British Colonies and Foreign Countries are not forwarded by the New York route to England. On Book Packets not exceeding 1 oz. in weight, addressed to the United Kingdom, the postage is 2 cents; on Book Packets weighing more than 1 oz. the progressive rates of postage will be found in the table below.

POSTAGE RATES, ETC., ON PATTERNS AND SAMPLES WITHIN THE DOMINION.

Patterns or samples of merchandise and goods for sale, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight, may be posted in Canada to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of 1 cent. per ounce, under the following regulations:

Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples however of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The Packet may bear on the outside the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; also a trade mark and numbers, and the price of the article enclosed; inside, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves; the particulars however of the trade marks, numbers and price, may be marked on the articles themselves, instead of on the outside of the Packet, at the option of the sender.

Any sample or pattern Packet containing a letter, or otherwise violating the conditions of the preceding rules, will be rated and treated as a letter.

The rate of one cent. per ounce is to be pre-paid by postage stamp, and, if such rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the Packet is to be rated with the deficient postage and a fine of five cents in addition.

Packets of samples and patterns may be registered on prepayment by postage stamp of a registration fee of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such packets be handed in to the post office for registration.

POSTAGE RATES, ETC., ON PATTERNS AND SAMPLES, TO UNITED KINGDOM AND FOREIGN PARTS.

Patterns of merchandise, and samples, may be forwarded between Canada and the United Kingdom, France, Italy, German Empire, Netherlands, Portugal, Switzerland, and Denmark, by the Canadian Packet mails, at book post rates, and subject to the following conditions:

There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the manufacturer's or trade mark and number, and price of the article.

Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles intended for delivery within the United Kingdom, are now allowed to be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves of the contents.

Bags entirely closed, even though they may be transparent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to foreign parts.

The rule which prohibited the transmission through the Post, as patterns, of articles of cutlery, &c., has been rescinded; and scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pen-nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, are now allowed to be forwarded by the Post as samples, provided they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags, and to the persons of the officers of the Post Office. Such articles, however, must be so packed that they may be easily examined; and it is made a rule that any packet containing such articles, which may be found to be insufficiently guarded, shall not be forwarded through the Post.

None of the articles named in the next preceding paragraph may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad, except Germany, Belgium, and the British Colonies, and not to these places when addressed via France.

No. 4.—Rates of Postage on all matters transmissible by Post, not of the character of a Letter.

NOTE.—The Postage upon all matter included in this table should be prepaid by postage stamps.

The Money Order Post Offices are furnished with Lists of all the Money Order Offices in the United Kingdom, Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland; and the Postmasters are instructed to afford every information in their power, in respect of the places upon which they draw, together with any other information relating to such issues as the intending Remitters may desire.

All deaf mute youths of both sexes between the ages of seven and nineteen, not being deficient in intellect, and free from contagious disease, being residents of the Province of Ontario, are admitted into the Institution.

The period of education and instruction for any pupil does not exceed seven years, and no pupil can remain in the Institution after the age of twenty-one, unless under special and extraordinary circumstances.

The regular annual School Session commences on the first Wednesday in September each year, and continues till the last Wednesday in June. No applications for admission will be received after the first Wednesday in Sept., except in special and extraordinary cases.

Parents, guardians or friends, who are unable to pay for the board of pupils, must apply to the Councils of the county, township, city, town, or incorporated village in which they reside. Parents, guardians or friends, who are able to pay for the board of pupils, will make direct application to the Principal for admission into the Institution.

LEGAL AND JUDICIARY.

THE LAW SOCIETY OF ONTARIO.

The Law Society was first established in 1797, by the act 37 Geo. III, c. 13, which enabled the then practitioners of the law to form themselves into a society and make rules for its government. By the act of 1822, 2 Geo. IV; c. 6, "the Treasurer and Benchers of the Law Society" were formally incorporated; and under these and other statutes the Society has continued to be governed by a Board of Benchers, in the same manner as the various Law Societies of England. By the act of last session, 34 Vic. c. 15, the Benchers heretofore appointed from time to time by their own body, are made, exclusive of *ex officio* members, elective by the Bar. The *ex officio* consisting of the Attorney General for the time being, and all members of the Bar of Ontario who have at any time held the office of Attorney or Solicitor General of the former province of Upper Canada, and any retired Judges of the Superior Courts of Law or Equity of Ontario. The elective thirty in number, being chosen by ballot, for a term of five years, by the members of the Bar, in manner prescribed by the act. Vacancies during the term to be filled by the remaining Benchers. The Judges of the Superior Courts are Visitors of the Society, and, on the first day of Easter Term, annually, the Benchers appoint one of their body to be Treasurer, and who is also President of the Society. The Benchers sit in convocation every term for the call of Barristers, the admission of Attorneys and Solicitors to practice, and of Students to enter the Society, the fees paid by whom form the revenue of the Society, Osgoode Hall, appropriately named after the first Chief Justice, is the Ontario "Inn of Court," or head quarters of the Society, in which is provided accommodation for the Courts of Equity, and for the sittings in term of the Superior Courts; with a valuable and extensive library.

COURTS OF LAW AND EQUITY.

COURT OF ERROR AND APPEAL.—Constituted for the hearing of appeals in civil cases from the Courts of Queen's

Bench, Chancery and Common Pleas; and appeals in criminal cases from the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas. From the judgment of this court, an appeal lies to Her Majesty in Privy Council, in cases over £1,000, or where annual rent, fee, or future rights of any amount, are affected. *Judges*—Hon. Wm. H. Draper, C.B., Chief Justice of the Court of Error and Appeal in Ontario; and the Judges of the Superior Courts of Law and Equity, in their order of precedence, as above, as Visitors of the Law Society. *Clerk and Reporter*—Alexander Grant.

COURT OF QUEEN'S BENCH.—The jurisdiction of this Court extends to all manner of actions, causes and suits, criminal and civil, real, personal and mixed, within Ontario, and it may proceed in such, by such process and course as are provided by law, and as shall tend with justice and despatch to determine the same; and may hear and determine all issues of law, and also with the inquest of twelve good and lawful men (except in cases otherwise provided for) by all issues of fact, and give judgment, and award execution, thereon, and in all matters which relate to the Queen's Revenue (including the condemnation of contraband or smuggled goods) as may be done by Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Law in England. *Chief Justice*—Hon. William Buell Richards. *Prime Judges*—Hon. Joseph C. Morrison, and Hon. Adam Wilson. *Clerk of the Crown and Pleas*—R. G. Dalton, Q.C. *Reporter*—Chris. COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.—This Court has the same powers and jurisdiction as a Court of Record, as the Court of Queen's Bench. HEIRS AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. *Clerk of Commissioners*, W. B. Heward.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, crim. con., or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law.

COUNTY COURT SITTINGS AND COURTS OF GENERAL SESSIONS.—The County Judge of each county, holds a sitting of his Court and a Court of General Sessions in his county semi-annually on the second Tuesday in June and December, except in the county of York, in which county said court is held three times, commencing on the second Tuesday in March, June and December, the latter Courts for the trial of cases of felony and misdemeanor, but treason and capital felonies are exempted from their jurisdiction.

SWIFT TRIALS OUT OF SESSION.—By the Act of the Parliament of Canada, 32 Vic., cap.—any person committed to jail for trial, on charge of being guilty of any offence for which he may be tried at a Court of General Sessions, may, with his own consent, and subject to the provisions of the said Act in that behalf, be forthwith tried by the Judge of the County Court and General Sessions without a jury, and if convicted be sentenced by the said Judge, and the Judge sitting on any such trial for all the purposes thereof, is constituted a Court of Record, and the record in any such case shall be filed among the records of the Court of General Sessions last mentioned.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—These courts, which now have reference to traders only, are regulated by the Act 32 & 33 Vic. cap. 16, known as "the Insolvent Act of 1869," which repealed all former statutes and consolidated and assimilated the practice in Bankruptcy and Insolvency in the several Provinces of the Dominion. The county Judges in the several counties preside, and official assignees are nominated by the Board of Trade at any place, or the council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade.

SUBROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts. *Chief Surrogate Clerk at Toronto*—Sir J. L. Robinson, Bart.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; and personal actions to that amount, if not excepted from their jurisdiction; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crim. con., seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Each judicial district is divided into court divisions, and courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. *The Divisions*

are established by the Courts of General Sessions, and in certain cases by the Judges.

Terms of the Courts.

COURT OF ERROR AND APPEAL.—This Court holds its sittings twice a year at Toronto, in the months of January and June, upon such days as it may by rule or order from time to time appoint, and may adjourn such sitting from day to day, or for any such longer period as it may deem expedient, and may also appoint days for giving judgment or for disposing of business as in its discretion it shall see fit.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins 3rd Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter. By the act 29 & 30 Vic. cap. 40, Trinity Term, hitherto commencing on the Monday after the 21st August, was abolished; but the same statute gave power to the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas, at their discretion, to hold sittings in banc in time of vacation (except long vacation), by virtue of a rule or order of the court, respectively to be made in or out of term, for the hearing of such special cases or rules for new trials as shall be named in a list to be attached to any such rule or order, and for giving of judgments in cases previously argued, and for disposing of such other business as the court in its discretion shall see fit. Notice of such rules to be given in form and manner prescribed by the act, six clear days before the day appointed.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters.

LONG VACATION extends from the 1st of July to the 21st of August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS.—The several County Courts in Ontario hold four terms in each year, commencing respectively on the first Monday in the months of January, April, July, and October, and ending on the Saturday of the same week.

Into the Primary and Higher departments, both males and females are admitted. Young men are, in the Higher department, fitted for matriculation in Arts, Law or Medicine; and here students who have the Ministry in view also pursue their studies, until they are prepared to take up Theological subjects with advantage. The Winter Term commences on the first Wednesday in January and continues thirteen weeks. The Spring Term commences the second week of April.

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PROVINCIAL NORMAL AND MODEL SCHOOLS, FOR THE INSTRUCTION AND TRAINING OF TEACHERS.—*Normal School*: Rev. H. W. Davies, D.D. Principal; James Carlyle, M.D., Mathematical Master; Thomas Kirkland, M.A., Natural Science Master; John George Hodgins, LL.D., Lecturer on the School Law of Ontario; Samuel Clare, Teacher of Book-keeping and Writing; William Armstrong, G. The Sessions of the Normal School commence on the 8th of January and 8th of August, and close on the 15th of June and 15th of December in each year.

HIGH SCHOOLS.—Each of these Schools (which form the intermediate link between the Public Schools and the Universities) is managed by a Board of Trustees appointed jointly by the County and Town Councils. In cities, the Trustees are all appointed by the City Council, except where there is only one School in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, unless certificated and appointed before 18th September, 1865. Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of half the government grant must be raised for the master's salary. The grant is payable to these schools only which attain a certain standard, and is based on the average attendance of pupils in the prescribed studies. An extra grant is provided for masters taking certain Meteorological observations and giving scientific knowledge preparatory to military instruction. Pupils attending these Schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities. There were 101 High Schools, with 7,351 pupils, in Ontario, in 1870. Rev. J. G. D. Mackenzie, M.A., and James A. PUBLIC SCHOOLS.—Each Township is divided into School Sections of a suitable extent for one School; and in each of these Sections three Trustees are selected to manage the School affairs. In cities, towns, and villages, the schools are managed by a Board of School Trustees, elected for the Municipality. There were 4,566 Public Schools, with 442,518 pupils, in Ontario, in 1870.

PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.—Each School and Municipal Corporation, desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries, is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per cent. on local appropriations, and supplying books from the Depository in connexion with the Department. Up to the end of Dec. 1870, about 1,146 Libraries had been thus established, with 242,072 volumes.

EDUCATIONAL MUSEUM.—Connexed with the Educational Department is a Museum, containing specimens of School apparatus and furniture; a valuable collection of Italian, Dutch and Flemish Oil Paintings and Statuary casts and busts. The Museum is freely open to the public, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all kinds reported by the Educational Department as in operation in the Province of Ontario during 1870, was 4,970, attended by 459,161 pupils, and expending \$2,173,711 in their support.

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On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, not less than \$25, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 3 cents.

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On every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duties to be paid, by stamps affixed to each promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange; but the person affixing such stamp shall, at the time of affixing the same, write or stamp thereon the date at which it is affixed, and each stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and, if no date be so stamped or written thereon, such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.

Penalty for neglecting to affix stamps, or for wilfully writing or stamping a false date thereon, \$100.

The Governor in Council may direct stamped paper to be prepared for the purpose of this Act.
