THE QUEEN.

VICTORIA, Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; only daughter of His late Royal Highness Edward Duke of Kent, and Victoria, late Duchess of Kent, daughter of Francis Duke of Saxe Cobourg; born the 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the Throne on the decease of her Uncle, William IV., June 20th, 1837; Proclaimed June 21st, 1837; Crowned June 28th, 1838; Married February 10th, 1840, to Field Marshal His Royal Highness Prince Albert Augustus Charles Emanuel, Prince of Saxe Cobourg and Gotha, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, &c. &c. &c.

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ECLIPSES.

During this year there will be five Eclipses: three of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. On the 11th of June, there will be a *total Eclipse* of the Moon. The Eclipse will begin at Montreal 48 minutes past 11, and will end at 6 minutes past 3 on the morning of the 12th. At Toronto it will begin at 25 minutes past 11, and will end at 42 minutes past 2 on the morning of the 12th. The *total Eclipse* appears 1 hour and 7 minutes after the beginning, and lasts a few minutes over an hour.

II. On the 27th of June, there will be a *partial Eclipse* of the Sun. Not visible on this Continent.

III. On the 21st of Nov. there will be an Eclipse of the Sun. Only *partial*, and not visible in America.

IV. On the 6th of December there will be a *total Eclipse* of the Moon, visible as follows:—Begins at Montreal 51 minutes past midnight, and ends 17 minutes past 4; begins at Toronto 28 minutes past midnight, and ends 17 minutes past 4. This Eclipse becomes *total* 1 hour and 9 minutes after the beginning, and continues one hour and thirty-two minutes.

V. On the 20th of December there will be an Eclipse of the Sun, only *partial* and invisible on the American Continent.

PLANETS.

Until February 25th, Venus will be *Evening Star*, and then *Morning Star* until 10th December. Until October 5, Mars will be *Morning Star*. Until March 13th, Jupiter will be *Morning Star*, then until October 1, *Evening Star*. Until March 9, Saturn will be *Morning Star*, then until September 18th, *Evening Star*, then again *Morning Star*. Mercury, about February 7th, June 3rd and September 30th, will be visible in the West soon after sunset, and in the East before sunrise about March 29, July 29, and November 15th.

REGULATIONS AND RATES.

Letter Rates.—Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province pass, if prepaid, for 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., but if posted unpaid are charged 7 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

On letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward's Island the rate is 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., with optional pre-payment.

The rate on letters to the United Kingdom will be,
 By Canadian Packet, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce.

By Cunard

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If a letter exceed 1 oz. in weight, it will be liable to *four* rates, as, after the first ounce, fractions are not recognized, the rate progressing by the oz.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on arrival in England.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"by Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any mail for Canada is a "Canadian Mail" by whatever Packet forwarded.

Letters for British Colonies and possessions, beyond sea, and for Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on Letters for the United States, (except California and Oregon,) 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

" " for California and Oregon, 15 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.
" " British Columbia, 15 cents, to be prepaid.

The rate on Letters for the following destination, per Canadian Ocean Steamers, is 23 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and must be prepaid:—

Africa (West Coast of), Australia, (including all the Colonies embraced in this general name,) Buenos Ayres, Cape of Good Hope, Ceylon, Egypt, Gibraltar, Gold Coast, Hayti, India, Liberia, Malta, Mauritius, Monte Video, Natal, New Zealand, St. Helena, Sierra Leone, Spain, Tasmania, West Indies (British).

For the principal German States, the rate is 29 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

For France and Algeria, 17 cents per $\frac{1}{4}$ oz.

On Letters to the above destinations forwarded by the Cunard Line of Steamers, an additional charge of 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. becomes necessary.

Registration Charges.—For the Registration of a Letter addressed to any place in British North America the charge is 2 cents.

For the registration of a Letter to United Kingdom, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ c.

France, and other countries for which letters pass through France, an amount equal to the postage.

Miscellaneous Charges.—The charge on Parcels by Parcel Post to any place in Canada is 25 cents per lb., (with 5 cents additional if registered.)

One cent per oz., payable in advance by postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Hand Bills, and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The charge upon Books, &c., by Book Post to England, is 7 cents

on packets not exceeding 4 oz. in weight; 12½ cents on ½ lb. packets; and 12½ cents for every additional ½ lb. These charges must be prepaid.

Book Post with France.—For a packet of Printed Matter, or single Newspaper, Book, &c., not over 2 oz., 4 cents.

The Book Post Regulations between Canada and England apply to matter between Canada and France.

Newspapers and Periodicals—Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication addressed to any place in Canada at the following rates, *if paid quarterly in advance*, by either the publisher at the Post Office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either Publisher or Subscriber, such papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

Transient Newspapers.—Transient Newspapers, that is to say, Canadian Newspapers, posted otherwise than from the Office of Publication, and American or British Papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid one cent each, by Postage Stamp, or they cannot be forwarded; except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers and News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mail.

Newspapers by Mail from England or United States.—Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers, brought by Mail into Canada, are charged 1 cent each on delivery.

Periodical Publications.—The rate on Periodical Publications is, if not exceeding 3 ounces in weight, 1 cent; over 3 ounces, 4 cents.

If prepaid by Postage Stamps from the Office of Publication, Periodicals, *published in Canada*, weighing over 3 ounces, may pass for 2 cents each.

Periodicals, *printed in this Province*, other than Newspapers when specially devoted to the education of youth, (both religious and general) to Agriculture, to Temperance or to any branch of science, and addressed directly from the Office of Publication to be transmitted to any Post Office in this Province, are exempt from charge.

Transient Periodicals—Including Canadian Periodicals not prepaid the commuted rate from the Office of Publication, nor exempted by the preceding clause, and all other Periodical Publications posted in this Province, must be prepaid by Postage Stamps, the full rate, at the time of posting.

Periodicals received in the Mails from the United States are charged with the rates named in the first clause of this section.

Postage Stamps—Postage Stamps of the respective values of 1 cent, for Newspapers ; 5 cents for ordinary Provincial Letters ; 10 cents for United States rate ; 12½ cents for Canadian Packet, and 17 cents for Cunard Packet, are provided for sale to the public.

Letter Envelopes impressed with Medallion Stamp, and equivalent to the pre-payment of Postage to the amount of 5 and 10 cents respectively are furnished for sale to the public at the following rates :

The 5 cent Envelope at the rate of \$5.50 per 100 or 66 cents per dozen. The 10 cent Envelope, at \$10.50 per 100, or \$1.26 cents per dozen.

Penal Clause—The Act contains the following penal clause :

To inclose a letter, or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a Parcel posted for the Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor.

To inclose a letter or any writing, or make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to enclose any other thing in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers, (except in the case of accounts and receipts of Newspaper Publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers, shall be a misdemeanor.

Money Orders on England, Scotland and Ireland.—Money Orders, payable at any Money Order Office in Great Britain and Ireland, can be obtained at any Canadian Money Order Office. The Orders are drawn in sterling, the Commission chargeable being for £2 and under, 1 shilling sterling ; from £2 to £5, two shillings. No order can be drawn for more than £5 ; but any number of orders for £5 each may be procured.

Brickmakers, Builders or any person carting building materials in the city, an annual duty for registration as follows : For each two-wheeled vehicle ; or corresponding winter vehicle, drawn by one horse, 15s. ; ditto, drawn by two horses, 20s. ; for each waggon, or corresponding winter vehicle, drawn by two or more horses, 20s.

All Bakers, Brewers and Distillers, and their Agents, the following annual duty for registration :--For each Baker's two-wheeled vehicle, or corresponding sleigh, 40s. ; ditto waggon or ditto, 60s. ; ditto Brewer's or Distiller's two or four-wheeled vehicle or corresponding sleigh, 60s.

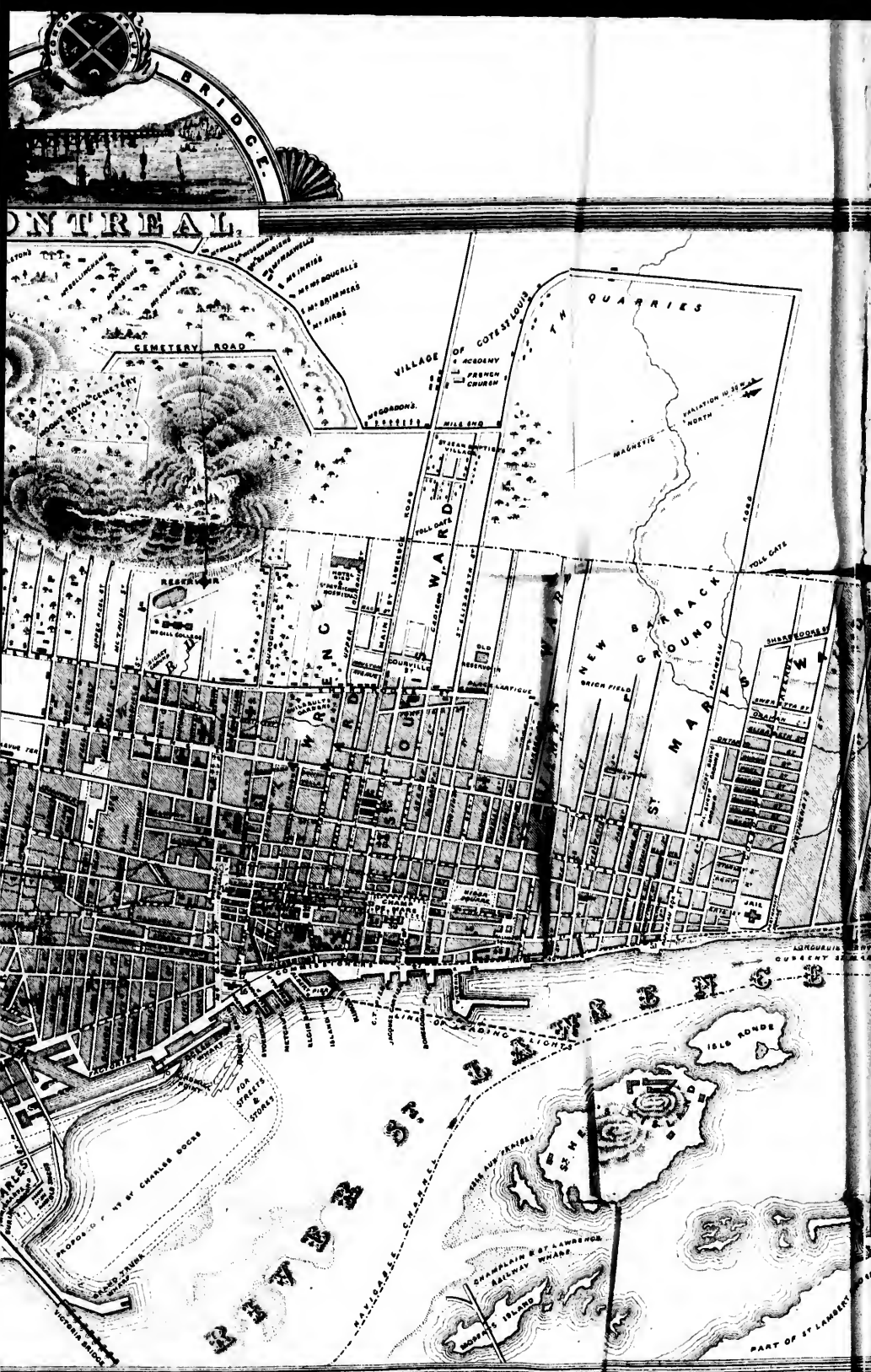
