TENTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE MANAGERS OF  
THE ORPHANS' HOME  
AND  
FEMALE AID SOCIETY, TORONTO.

"In accordance with the rules of this Society, the Managers beg respectfully to present to the members, at this their general meeting, the following report of the affairs of the institution for the past year; and the Managers and members have great cause for gratitude and thankfulness to Almighty God, that during a long and trying winter, the general health of the children has been so good as scarcely to require medical attendance, and with equal gratitude they record the great increase of usefulness the 'Home' has attained during the past twelve months.

"Since the date of the Ninth Annual Report, twenty-seven children have been admitted into the 'Home' as proper objects of the charity, and during the same period thirty children have left the 'Home,' seventeen of whom have been apprenticed out, according to the rules of the Society; four were adopted, but two have since been re-admitted, the Managers not being satisfied as to their treatment; eight have been taken out by their mothers, who were again in positions to be able to support them; and one, a very delicate child, two years of age, after a residence of only six weeks in the 'Home,' died from the effects of diarrhoea. The number of orphans at present in the institution is fifty-eight—namely, thirty-eight boys and twenty girls.

"During the months of August and September, the small-pox, in a mild form, attacked three of the orphans, and caused great alarm; but a kind Providence permitted the disease to spread no further, and, under the skilful treatment of our respected medical officer, Dr. Ogden, and the maternal care of the matron, Mrs. Holmes, the invalids were soon again restored to health.

"The Treasurer's accounts, presented herewith, show that the sum of \$2,028.50 has been received since the last annual general meeting (including the balance then on hand) from subscriptions, donations, and other sources, for the general purposes of the institution—showing a falling off, as compared with the previous year. And the Managers

would here express a hope that their successors in office, and the general members of the Society, may be stimulated with increased energy and a stronger determination to improve the subscriptions and donations, so as to promote and extend the usefulness of the Society. The expenditure for general purposes during the past year has been \$1,798.11, leaving a balance of \$280.39 cash in hand for the general purposes of the Society.

"For some time past the Managers have seen the necessity of the orphan children having regular tuition, but the funds of the institution being inadequate to support a schoolmaster, Miss Holmes, the matron's daughter (who resides at the 'Home' with her mother) has, for the present, undertaken to teach the children, at a salary of fifteen pounds per annum—an office for which she is fully qualified, having obtained a first-class honour at the Normal School.

"Since the last annual report, the west wing of the building, so auspiciously commenced by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Toronto laying the corner stone, has been completed, at a total cost of \$1,371.09, under the superintendence of Messrs. Cumberland & Storm. The auditors and Managers desire to thank these gentlemen for their kindness in rendering their services gratuitously, and they have also to thank Mr. Carr for painting and glazing the west wing, without making any charge therefor. It will be observed by the accounts of the building committee, that a balance of \$194.50 appears to be due to Mr. James Worthington, the contractor for the building. It is hoped that a sufficient sum to pay the balance may, in a short time, be received from those clergymen of the Diocese of Toronto and Huron who have not yet responded to the appeal made to them. Twenty-four clergymen whose names appear in the accounts have responded nobly to that appeal, and the Rev. Dr. Lett has largely increased the amount of the building fund by sermons kindly preached by him, in fourteen churches, for the benefit of the fund.

"The Managers have also, on behalf of the Society, to express their thanks to the Orangemen of Port Hope for a very handsome sewing machine, presented to the Home by the hand of the Rev. Dr. Lett. A more suitable present could scarcely have been suggested, or one that will add more to the comfort of the 'Home' and its inmates."

Rev. Mr. ARNOLD moved, seconded by Mr. FLEMING, that the report just read be adopted. The motion was unanimously carried.

Rev. Dr. LETT informed the meeting that a gentleman whose name he could not make public had given a mortgage security to the Institution amounting to \$2,000. The announcement was received with applause.
