

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation.

Toronto, January 15th, 1896.

Pursuant to notice read from the pulpit on the two preceeding Sabbaths, the aunual meeting was held this evening in the lecture hall.

The meeting was opened by prayer. The chair was occupied

by the Rev. Alex. Gilray,

On the motion of Mr. Jas. Turnbull, seconded by Mr. Geo. E. Dalby, Mr. James Brown was appointed Secretary of the meeting.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting as printed in the

year book were accepted as read.

It was brought to the notice of the congregation, by the Secretary, that the Board of Managers recommend an increase to the Board from 15 to 18 membership. After a short discussion this was decided upon.

On the motion of Mr. James Brown, seconded by Mr. W. J. McCullough the resignation of Mr. Archibald Lang was accepted

It was also moved by Mr. P. B. Martin, seconded by Mr. James Brown, that in view of the increase of the membership of the Board of Managers that the representation of Elders on the board be increased from three to five. Carried.

The nomination for the seven vacancies on the Board of Managers was then made, which resulted in the election of Messrs. D. W. Clark, E. H. Harcourt, N. Binns, C. G. Smith, R. Wilson, W. McCulloch, Alex. Bell. And for the two vacancies for representatives of the Session on the Board resulted in the election by acclamation of Messrs. C. R. Peterkin, and Wm. Clarke.

The Scrutineers being Messrs. John Imrie, A. E. Bastedo, Dr. Gordon, T. Henderson, G. R. W. Thomas.

The Session report was read by the Session clerk Mr. Geo.

Dalby, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Report of the Board of Managers was read by Mr. James Brown, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Treasurer's report was received as printed by the motion

of Mr. C. R. Peterkin, treasurer. Carried.

The Sunday School report was read by Hugh B. Gilray, who

moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Woman's Foreign Missionary Society Report was read by the Secretary of the meeting, on behalf of Miss Elsie Clarke who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Speedwell Mission Band report was read by Miss

K. Macdonald, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Y. P. S. C. E. report was read by its Secretary, Mr. Geo. Cook, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

Junior Society of Christian Endeavor report was read by Mr.

R. Wilson, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

Woman's Association report was read on behalf of Miss Mitchell by the Secretary of the Meeting, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

Bible Class report was read by Mr. G. R. W. Thomas, who

moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Session report was then adopted as read.

The Board of Managers report was adopted as read with exception of the recommendation re the "Annual Report" Book. It was moved by Mr. R. Wilson, seconded by Mr. Elder, that the "Annual Report" Book be printed and distributed as usual. Carried.

It was moved, and seconded, that the several other reports

be received, and adopted as read. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Geo. E. Dalby, seconded by Mr. Wm. Clarke, that the following gentlemen be trustees for 1896. James Turnbull, B. A., H. F. Sharpe, and C. McPherson. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. A. E. Bastedo, seconded by Mr. C. R. Peterkin, that a vote of thanks be tendered the Auditors for

their services. Carried.

A vote of thanks was also tendered Mr. C. R. Peterkin, the treasurer, and the members of the Board of Management, for their services during the past year, the motion being made by Mr. Wm. Elder, seconded by Mr. Alex. Bell. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Geo. E. Dalby, seconded by Mr. Wm. Clarke, that Mr. H. F. Sharpe, and Mr. Chas. T. Lyon be

appointed auditors for the comining year.

The following resolution was moved by Mr. Robt. Wilson, and duly seconded, "that the services of praise be confined to the singing of the Psalms and Pharaphrases, and Hymns authorised at the general Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada." After a few words on the motion by two or three of the members present, it was put to the meeting and declared lost.

This concluded the business of the meeting, which was dismissed by the singing of the Doxology and prayer by the

Rev. Mr. Hamilton.

NOTE. No summary is made of any of the reports referred to in the Minutes, each of them being printed in full in the following pages.

Session Report for Year 1895.

STATISTICS.

During the year 77 members have been added by certificate, 28 by Profession of Faith—105 in ail. 85 have been disjoined and 7 removed by death; leaving a net gain of 13. The number of members in January, 1895, was 826. It is now 839.

There were 23 infants and 1 adult baptized.

Six Elders have been added to the Session, and their districts

re-adjusted.

We are glad to be able to report increased attendance at Communion, six hundred being present at our last celebration.

The Sunday School presents an interesting and encouraging

report, shewing an increased attendance.

The Y. P. S. of C. E. has been more vigorous than ever, and has entered with commendable zeal upon greater undertaking for the accomplishment of still better, and more effectual, service in our Master's cause.

The Session are also pleased to notice the efficiency of the work carried on in the Juvenile Society, with happy results.

The Boys Brigade enterprize has called forth earnest effort. Some twenty-six meetings have been held with an average attendance of 30 boys. Most of the work done has been more or less experimental but much has yet to be done before we can report a well organized and equipped company.

The work in our several missionary organizations, The Missionary Association, The Auxiliary to the Women's Foreign Mission Society, and The Speedwell Mission Band, has been well maintained. The Woman's Association deserve special commendation for the amount of practical and benevolent work accomplished and it is cheering to know that they have larger plans, for still more extended effort during the present year.

We are glad to notice that the report of the Bible Class indicates larger attendance and increased contribution for

missionary purposes.

Tokens of the Divine favor on the painstaking effort, and the diligent and faithful service rendered in these organizations, and in every other department of the Lord's work in our midst, call for expressions of deepest gratitude on the part of Session, Managers, and Congregation.

Managers Annual Report.

Your Board have pleasure in presenting their annual report

for 1895.

The average collection for 1895 was \$93.74 per sabbath, the average collection for 1894 was \$89.77, or an increase for 1895 of \$3.97 per sabbath. From the printed statement which our Treasurer has placed in your hands, you will see that the floating debt of the congregation on the 1st of January amounted to \$754.31. We began the year with a deficit of \$554.77, shewing that we increased our indebtedness \$199.64 during the past year. This indebtedness has given the Board considerable anxiety and with a desire not to have it increased, but fully wiped out they make the following recommendation for your approval at this time. The recommendation is as follows: That during the coming year we make a special offering monthly to be taken up regularly on the last sabbath of each month, or whatever subbath the congregation thinks best. We would have a special envelope suitably printed to be used for this purpose, the object being that this year the deficit might be wiped out, if the congregation would heartily join in this, and contribute a stated sum regularly monthly the amount might easily be met in this way. We would reduce the indebtedness without it being a special strain upon the members as it is felt to be when a large sum is asked for in a specified time. The monies resulting from this effort would be kept seperate, and be known as the "Debt Fund" to be used only for the reduction of the deficit.

The Board also recommend, that if the congregation think it advisable at this time to increase the membership of the Board that it be increased to not more than eighteen.

They also recommend that in view of the state of our finances the printing of the annual report book for this year be discontinued.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Annual Report of Sabbath School for 1895.

We are glad to be able to say that there has been a considerable increase in the attendance and also a corresponding increase in contributions.

The order in the School is steadily improving, which is to a considerable extent due to the exertions and co-operation of the

The Teachers and Scholars are to be congratulated on our success at the annual examination in Higher Religious Instruc-

tion, no fewer than fourteen prizes having been won.

It is to be hoped that under the Divine blessing a larger number may be led to seek the Saviour in the year on which we have entered than in the past year, only eight scholars having made a profession of faith during 1895.

The new mode of distributing the hymn books is working

very well.

The library, under the management of Mr. Binns and his assistants has given great satisfaction to teachers and scholars. An improvement might be made in the prompt return of books and in an addition to the books of the library if a little financial

aid were given.

We have to mention with regret the early removal of two of our senior scholars by death but we believe the dispensation has made a deep impression on the School. We have also to refer to the death of one of our most successful teachers, Miss Diehl, who, after long suffering, passed away to her reward. Her memory is sacred in the minds of the class, of which she was the beloved teacher.

We are happy to say that we have again this year as last, sent another of our teachers to the Mission Field, Mr. Calvin McRae.

Our prayers follow him.

Our sympathy is extended to our late fellow-worker, Mr. G. O. Merson, who has been so long ill and also to Mrs. Merson in her severe trial. Our prayer is that he may soon be restored

to his ramily in perfect health.

As we go forward in the work we do so feeling sure that God will bless our humble efforts in trying to lead the young people of our Sabbath School to know something of the love of God and to impress upon them the duty of giving their young hearts to the Saviour, who said, "Suffer the little children to come unto me." In presenting the report of the Bible Class for the year 1895, we are pleased to state that the attendance for the year 1895 was 2,421, being 301 more than last year. The average attendance was 47, distributed as follows: ladies, 30; gentlemen, 17; the class having been in session every Sunday during the year.

The general collections amounted to \$60.43, being an increase of \$14.31 on last year. Share fund contributions, \$5.00, being a decrease of \$14.12; and special contributions, \$5.11, being a decrease of \$1.29 from last year. This makes a total of \$70.85, as the collections from all sources for the past year.

We have to record our sorrow at the loss of Mr. Gardiner, our former teacher, by his removal from the city, in token of which he was presented with two suitable books and a letter, and also our regret at losing Mr. Chas. Hume, our late secretary-treasurer, by his removal to another part of the city, and we trust that our Father's blessing may accompany them in their new fields of labour.

We wish to thank Mr. Duguid and Miss Samson for their kind services at the organ during the year, and are glad to state that we have secured Miss Best for our organist.

The following have been appointed a committee in connection with the Bible Class: Misses Readman, McRae and Havill, and Messrs. Cook, McCulloch and Havill.

We also wish to state that we have adopted a system of special monthly contributions by envelope, in conjunction with the Church and Sabbath School.

We are following the International Sunday School Lesson Scheme in our studies during 1896, under the interesting and beneficial guidance of our Pastor.

In closing, we desire to thank our heavenly Father for His great kindness and mercy unto us during the past year, and pray that a more abundant blessing may rest upon us in future. We also wish to extend a most hearty invitation to any persons in the Congregation who have not joined our class to become members and enjoy the lessons with us.

In reviewing the work of the past year we are indeed thankful to our Heavenly Father for the way He has led us through another year. It has indeed been a year full of great blessings to our society. Never before has there been such harmony in the work, and a spirit of more loyal devotion. We indeed hope hat the seed sown has fallen on good ground, and will bring forth fruit.

To some of our members it has been a very sad year, as it has meant the severing of those earthly ties which unite us so closely together, in the calling away of those we love, but we

know that what is our loss is their gain.

The several committees have done excellent work. The Temperance and Missionary Committees have held several good meetings during the year, and about 75 per cent. of the members have signed the pledge. The Missionary Committee also meet every Sunday after Sunday School, and visit a certain section, and their efforts have been greatly blessed.

Over 125 boquets of flowers and a text of scripture with each have been distributed, and relief has been given to any worthy

cases coming under the notice of the Relief Committee.

The Social and Musical Committee have not been idle. The result of which is the sociability of the members, that "at home" feeling that is so profitable to the advancement of a society. The Musical Committee have supplied the hymns and aided greatly in increasing the interest of the meetings by having good singing, and a concert was also held, the proceeds of which, amounting to \$40, was handed to Mr. Peterkin in aid of the building fund.

Literature has been sent to Algoma to the lumber camps, and the committee are preparing to send a large assortment to Calvin McRae, Inkster, North Dakota.

An average of five teachers a Sunday has been provided by the Sabbath School Committee, and by the efforts of the Lookout Committee, 28 members have been added to the *role*, making the total membership 128, which shows a considerable increase, considering the number that have left.

The other committees are doing good work. We are pleased to announce that the Junior Endeavor for girls has been started, under the leadership of Mr. and Mrs. Wilson.

The financial part of the Society is in good condition as by the Fulton System or 2c a week, a considerable amount has been raised. One quarter of the total receipts is devoted to Missions, the other goes to the different schemes and work of the church.

The attendance at our meetings has been good, being on an average of 65 at our Monday night, and the center of the church is always well filled on Sunday Night meetings, and keeping our motto in view, "Trusting in the Lord' Jesus Christ for strength," we go forward to 1896 with renewed energy and determination to do more than ever before for Him who has done 30 much for us.


