Another item of Southern news sheds much light on the spirit that animates the Ku Klux element among the whites. The respectable people repudiate these outrages and deny that there is anything in the nature of a war of races. Gangs of white ruffians seize on every pretext that is offered for shedding negro blood, being only too happy when a negro commits or is suspected of committing some crime which they can use as an excuse for murdering him. The negroes occasionally arm themselves to resist or revenge these outrages, and general alarm and terror
