Temperance Anniversary.

The Blind.

We received the 13th Report of the Board of Managers of the Halifax Institution for the Blind. From it we learn that though fairly successful, more funds are needed, it being found difficult to keep the expenditure within the income. On Dec. 1st, 1883 there were 27 pupils registered, of whom 12 belong to the Province of New Brunswick and 15 to P. E. Island. The pupils from this Province are—Maggie Duke, Richardto; Isabel Collins, Forester, Charles Cole, Fredericton; Agnes Y. J. Chatham; William Colton, St. John's; W. A. Melish, Moncton. We hope the N. B. Legislature will add somewhat to the grant for this year. Last session a grant of \$480 was given. An addition of \$120 could be made without incurring any public debts.
