The decision of Mr. Justice Stuart was appealed, according to the usual practice in Edmonton, to the Alberta and Great Waterways Company and the Canada West Construction Company. The appeal will be heard at the next regular sitting of the court on Monday, November 13, 1911.

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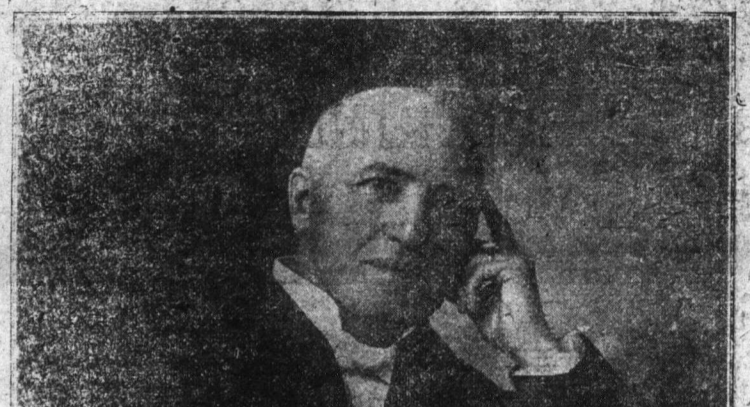
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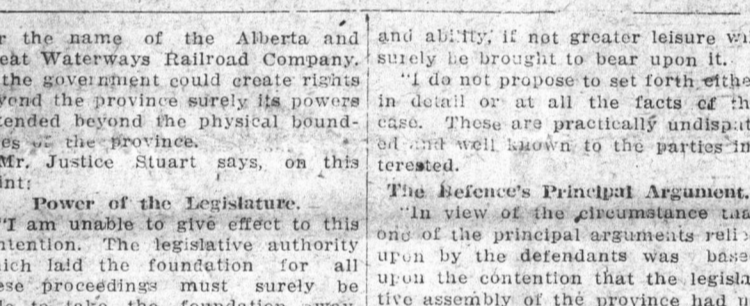
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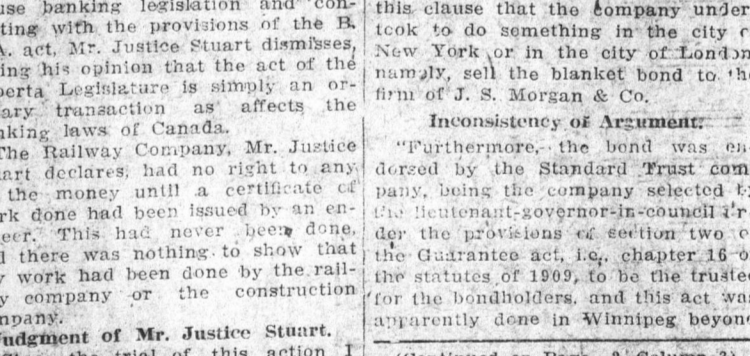

SAYS ITALIANS ARE IN BAD CONDITION

Newspaper Correspondent Who Has Arrived At Malta Says That Strict Censorship Has Resulted in Many Facts Being Suppressed by Italians.

Malta, Nov. 4.—A newspaper correspondent arriving here from the city of Tripoli and its vicinity reports that 1,000 men killed and wounded, and that the Turks have forced the Italians back from positions they assumed soon after the occupation, until at the present time the Italians occupy less than one half of the ground they held three weeks ago.

BUSINESS CENTRES REPORT GOOD TRADE

Dun's Review Shows That Steady Progress is Being Made in All Lines in Canadian Business Centres—Colder Weather Helps Retail Business.

New York, Nov. 3.—According to Dun's Review the exact extent of his report from branch offices of the "Dun's Review" in leading trade centres steady progress is being made in all lines.

At Regina the weather has improved and threshing operations are in full swing, with better results than expected.

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EDMONTON CITY HAD A VERY NARROW ESCAPE

Loss by Fire in London Totalled Nearly \$1 Million—Whole Business Section of City Burned Out Already Preparing for Rebuilding.

London, Ont., Nov. 8.—Nearly one million dollars was lost in the fire which broke out in the city of London, Ontario, on Monday night. The fire was completely wiped out, while five other stores were damaged to a great extent.

REVIEW OF THE CAUSES LEADING TO REBELLION

Objection to Nationalization of Foreign Provincial Railway Origin of Trouble in Szechuan—Actors Seized the Opportunity.

Pekin, Nov. 2.—The present trouble has been brewing in Szechuan since May 9, when an edict was issued declaring the government's intention of resuming control of all trunk railways.

AGITATION IN FAVOR OF GOOD TRUNK ROADS

Provincial Good Roads Convention in British Columbia Asks Assistance of Alberta and the Canadian Press Association.

New Westminster, B.C., Nov. 4.—At the first provincial good roads convention which closed today, a telegram was sent to Hon. H. L. Borden, the mayors and councils of Toronto, Halifax, Dawson and the Province of Alberta, and the Canadian Press Association asking them to support strongly the project of a transcontinental road from Halifax, Nova Scotia to Alberta, Vancouver and the land highway and northwards to Dawson city from the Canadian border line.

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PERFECT ORDER IN CITY OF SHANGHAI

First Light after Captivation to Rebels Passes Quietly—Rebel Leaders to Avoid Bloodshed—Report That Bombardment is in Progress at Hangchow.

Shanghai, Nov. 8.—The first light after the captivation of the city to the revolution passed uneventfully. Perfect order is maintained in Shanghai and the outlying districts, which constituted a remarkable feature of the movement. Li Ping Shu is the responsible head of the new administration in the native city and suburbs and is now engaged in completing his organization. He informed the correspondent that he recognized only the republic of Han and would guarantee order. The only disorderly elements, he said, now in China are the former officials and the Manchu troops.

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SASKATCHEWAN STILL SHORT IN COAL SUPPLY

All Outlying Points in Province Found on Investigation to Have Not More Than 30 Per Cent. of Winter's Supply Laid In.

Regina, Nov. 8.—T. Crombie, chief of the information and statistics bureau of the provincial government, has completed an investigation into the coal situation and finds that practically all the outlying points have but more than 30 per cent. of the winter's supply of coal. During his investigation, Mr. Crombie visited practically all of the points along the Goose Lake line, and portions of the Canadian Pacific railway line and the Grand Trunk Pacific line from Saskatoon to the border.

EXPULSED BY TRADES COUNCIL

Montreal, Nov. 8.—A sensational development in trades union circles here last night was the expulsion from Trades Union circles by the Montreal Trades and Labor Council of Mr. A. Masse, Conservative labor candidate in St. Mary's division, Montreal, opposing Maderic Martin, M.P., in the recent election.

The decree which extends over a period of five years was based on the charges of electioneering in connection with the election of a candidate in a political contest without the sanction and against the wishes of the council.

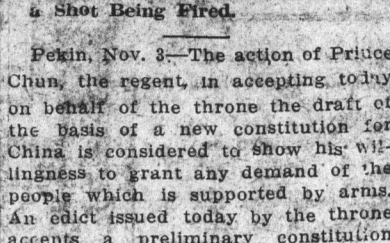

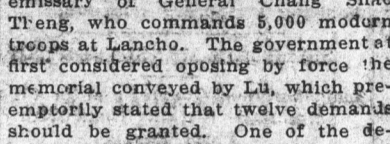

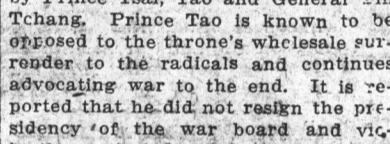
