AFGHANISTAN.

Great Britain's dependencies and colonies, scattered over every portion of the globe, indicate the greatness of the Empire over which Victoria reigns.

But perhaps the dependency, which Great Britain prizes most highly, is oriental India, and it is no mere matter of pride that she uses every available means to secure it from internal revolt and from external invasion.

In 1852, if we remember aright, Great Britain entered into a solemn treaty of alliance with the Ameer of Afghanistan.

From the present year, we believe, the most amicable relations have subsisted between these contracting parties.
