

Messrs. Purvis and Edwards audited the accounts, and out of a substantial balance on hand the Secretary was awarded \$50 for his services. A proposal to hold next year's show at Burgoyne, which was brought up, was left to be decided by the Directors after making due enquiry as to buildings and other facilities at that end of the Island. A meeting of the Directors has been called for Saturday, October but cannot be reported in this issue.
