# SOLDIERS ARE ON THE WAY WEST LEFT HALIFAX ON TWO TRAINS

Full Military Funeral for Capt. Sutton to the Station—Many of the Men Remained in the City for a Day or Two—Each Man Received About \$104.

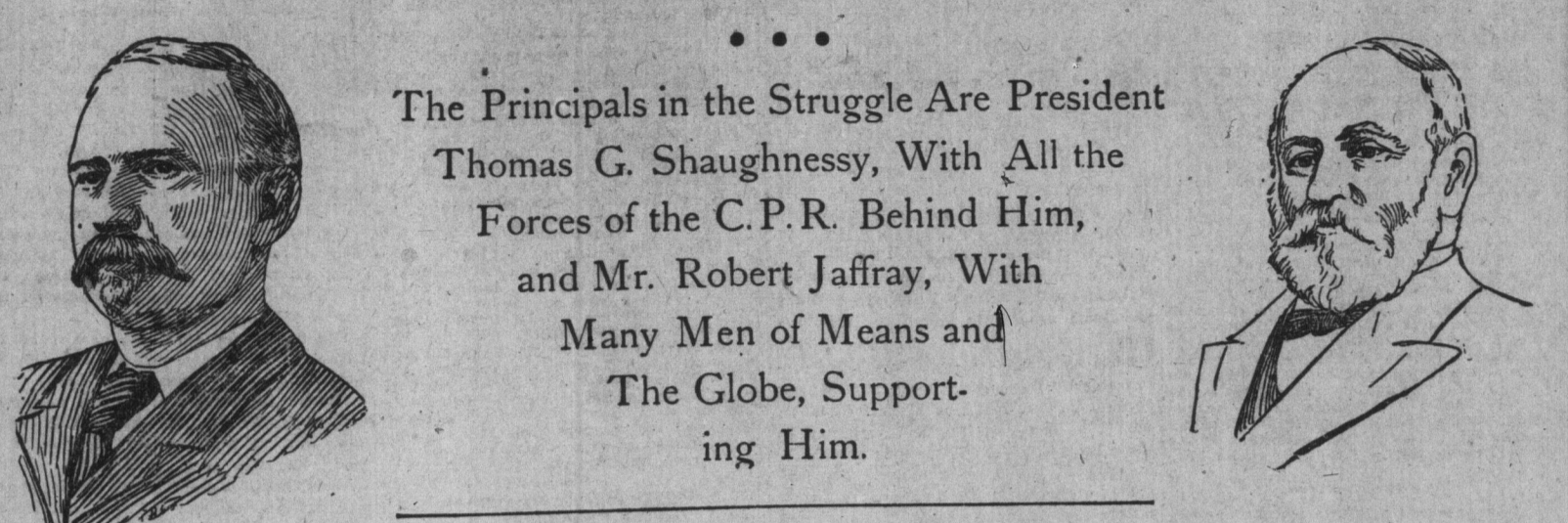
Halifax, N.S., Jan. 9.—The body of Capt. Sutton was sent to Toronto to-day as arranged, but was forwarded to-morrow as a train. There will be a full military funeral from the hospital to the station, with services at the Garrison chapel.

Mr. Sutton, accompanied by the wife of Major Williams, left this afternoon for Toronto. The R.C. Mounted Men and R.C.A. train, with the Royal Canadian Mounted Rifles, left at 7:15 local time. The train was made up of a baggage car, dining car, six tourist sleepers and Pullman. There were on board 215 men of C.M.R. and 158 men of R.C.A. The second train, made up of the same as the first, with an additional Pullman and dining car, pulled out of the station at 10:45 o'clock with the Canadian Army on board. The depot was thronged with cheering crowds, both inside and out, and the men were given an enthusiastic send-off.

The Woodstock, N.B., men, twenty in number, went home on the Maritime express. Many Remained Over. It is estimated that 25 per cent of the men of all ranks and corps remained over in the city, and special arrangements will have to be made for their transportation later on. \$28,000 Paid Out. ## WAR IS NOW DECLARED ON C.P.R. BY JAFFRAY, GLOBE & CROW'S NEST

Many Others Will Be Involved—Where the Hill-Morgan-Rockefeller Combination Comes In—Statements of Mr. Jaffray, Mr. Rogers, Mr. Shaughnessy, The Globe, Major Pellatt and Mr. Osler.

Some big things are on three days in railways. Surprising everything is the consolidation effected by Pierpont Morgan, J. D. Rockefeller and J. J. Hill. Over 70,000 miles of railways come under one system, and the whole of the anthracite and a great deal of the bituminous coal fields of the States east of the Mississippi as well.

It is a gigantic railway deal, and it is a gigantic coal combine. It means reduced expenses in running the roads, followed by increased profits and probably an enhanced price in coal for every consumer, whether factories, railways or to fifty miles of people.

While this deal is largely confined to the United States, it may have a Canadian end. We are interested in the price of coal, and J. J. Hill of the Great Northern Railway, and of the Morgan-Rockefeller-Hill syndicate, has brought us into it in another way by negotiations with the Crow's Nest Coal Company, whose headquarters and President, Mr. Robert Jaffray, are in this city.

Next in the way of a surprise is the declaration of war on the Canadian Pacific made by the Globe yesterday and by Mr. Jaffray the day before in Montreal. The deal that Mr. Hill met the directors of the Crow's Nest Coal Company, who have been in the Morgan-Hill-Rockefeller deal, and he is also associated with William Mackenzie and Daniel Mann in their transcontinental railway scheme, now coming into existence.

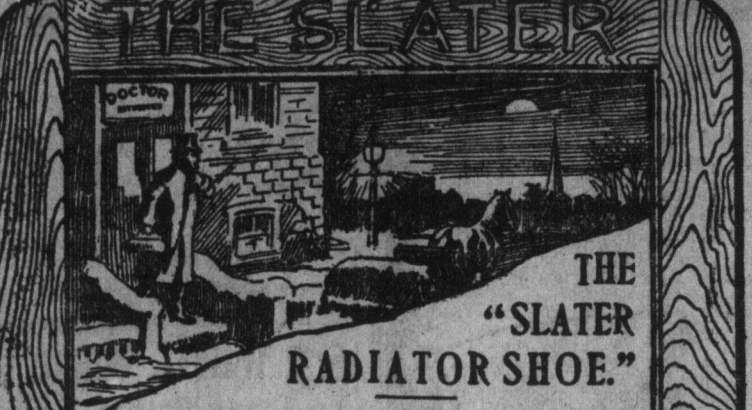

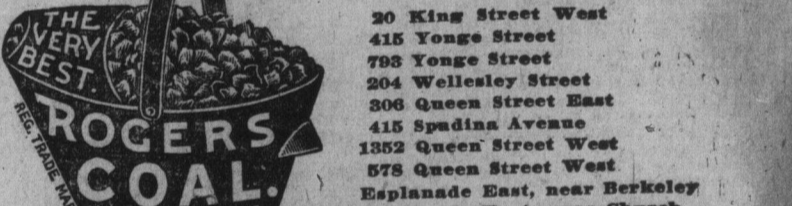
