BOUGHT A MANSION CANADA

Mrs. Nellie Sartoris, Daughter of Gen. U.S. Grant, Will Occupy a Cobourg Mansion

Formerly owned by Miss Allan

Princely Residence, With Handsome Grounds, Situated in a Delightful Spot

Cobourg, Ont., Aug. 4.—Mrs. Nellie Grant Sartoris, daughter of Gen. U.S. Grant, sailed legally yesterday for the purchase of the magnificent residence of Miss Allan, daughter of the late Sir Hugh Allan, founder of the Allan Line of steamships, and will have almost immediate possession.

The residence, with its handsome grounds, is situated in the southwest part of the town, on the most commanding site available. It has a view of the town and of the beautiful country for many miles north, east and west, with a panoramic view to the south of the harbor.

The house was built by the late West-ward Tremain, a lumberman. It was at first owned by the late Mrs. Tremain, and was purchased by William Weller, the great mail contractor and proprietor of the line of coastwise steamships between Hamilton and Montreal for many years previous to the construction and operation of the Grand Trunk railway system. Subsequently it was purchased by the late Mrs. Tremain, who was just last Saturday.

Mrs. Sartoris is accompanied here by her mother, widow of the great general, who has just left Saratoga.

Great Forest Fires Drive Game

Quebec, Aug. 4.—Tremendous damage has been caused by fire to the forests in North America and Quebec, and the neighborhood of the headwaters of the Ottawa River and of its principal tributaries, in many districts the havoc wrought by the flames is complete.

Wild animals including moose and deer, and game birds were all driven from their haunts to the rivers and lakes. During the progress of the fire they could only be shot down or captured by a party of hunters returning to the woods. In several instances the animals were driven to the edge of the flames, and were only saved by the timely intervention of the hunters.
