SHOULD TAKE MONEY WHEN BADLY DEFACED. Law is Very Strict, But Not Enforced, and Country is Flooded With Mutilated Coins.

The increasing prevalence of the defacements on the coin of the realm has caused considerable comment among prominent business men and bankers of the city, and also considerable speculation on the best methods for doing away with the evil.

Some of the big stores and other business houses refuse to accept mutilated American coins, but with others it is easy to have them accept it, and this makes Canada a dumping ground for the valueless coins of the United States.

The Criminal Code is Explicit. The Criminal Code of Canada in relation to the subject, which is very clear, is as follows: "Every one is guilty of an offence if he knowingly or negligently uses or circulates in payment a coin which is so impaired, diminished or lightened as to pass for current gold or silver coin."

Every one who utters any coin defaced by having stamped thereon any name or word is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction before two justices of the peace, to a penalty not exceeding five dollars.
