CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I

THIS Society shall be known as "The Educational Society of the Methodist Church of Canada."

ARTICLE II.

The objects of this Society shall be to assist in maintaining our Universities, Theological Schools, and Higher Mission Schools ; to defray the expenses of the Examination of Candidates for the Ministry in our Church ; and to aid such candidates in obtaining an education.

ARTICLE III.

All subscribers of five dollars per annum and upwards shall be members of the Society, and entitled to a copy of the Annual Report.

ARTICLE IV.

The Management of the Society shall be vested in a Central Board, composed as follows :—

The President of the General Conference ; one Layman from each Annual Conference, to be appointed by the General Conference, to hold office for four years ; one Minister from each Annual Conference, to be elected annually by such Conference, and to be Treasurer of the Society for his Conference ; and also the head of each University and of each Theological School.

ARTICLE V.

A branch of the Society shall be organized in each Annual Conference, under the management of a Committee of such Conference, composed as follows :—

The President of the Annual Conference, the members of the Central Board within the bounds of the Conference ; and four Ministers and four Laymen, appointed by the Annual Conference.

ARTICLE VI.

Sermons shall be preached on behalf of the Society, and collections taken up in aid of its funds, in all our churches and preaching places at some time in February or April in each year.

Meetings shall be held on each Circuit or Station, at which the claims of our Educational work shall be placed before our people, and contributions taken for the funds of the Society.

ARTICLE VII.

The Central Board shall meet annually in the month of July, for the transaction of the following business :—

First. To make appropriations to defray the expenses of the Examining Boards of our Conferences and Colleges.

Secondly. To appropriate to each Conference a sum to aid students appointed by each Conference to attend College.

Thirdly. To make appropriations according to the claims and wants of each University, Theological School, and Missionary Institute.

Fourthly. To determine the proportion of Students to be sent each year to each College from each Conference.

The Central Board shall appoint its own Secretary and Treasurer, and in the absence of the President of the General Conference, elect a Chairman *pro tem*.

They shall fill vacancies occurring in the lay portion of the Board, and shall appoint the time and place of their next meeting.

They shall publish annually a Report of the work of the Society.

ARTICLE VIII.

The Annual Conference Committees shall meet annually at the time and place of the Meeting of the Annual Conferences respectively, for the following purposes :—

1. To consider the cases of all candidates recommended to attend College by the District Meetings, and report to the Conference as to the amount of aid to be given to each, and the College he shall attend, in harmony with the arrangement of the Central Board.
2. To appoint a deputation to each District to attend meetings on behalf of the Society.
3. To arrange for a public Anniversary Meeting of the Society, in connection with the Session of each Annual Conference.



REPORT.

AT the close of the first year of their labour, the Board are pleased to be able to report an encouraging degree of success. Meetings have been held on behalf of the Society as extensively as possible during the year, and the net result of the appeal to our people has been the sum of \$7,449. This amount is quite inadequate to meet the various claims of our Educational work presented for our consideration, but has been expended as best, in our judgment, would serve the interests of the great work.

At the first meeting of the Board, held at the close of the session of the General Conference, it was agreed to accept the appropriations made to aid students by the Educational Committees of the several Conferences in June, 1874. These, amounting to \$3,253, have been paid in full. It was also agreed to provide for the interest on the debt of Victoria College and for an annual grant to the Mount Allison Wesleyan College, as both these had previously been provided for by collections which had been replaced by the formation of this Society. These grants, amounting to \$840 and \$800 respectively, have also been paid in full.

The same Board also ordered the Treasurer to pay the expenses of the Board of Examiners of the various Conferences, amounting to \$168.37. These sums, with \$77 for drafts and discounts, left a balance at the disposal of your Committee of \$2,309.

The Board have entered into a careful examination of the income and expenditure of the Institutions entitled to apply for grants, and into the economy of their management. The result of this investigation has been the following report of claims for aid, which they desire to be paid as soon as the funds of the Society will admit.

These claims amount to \$4,500. The funds in hand, after meeting the expenses of the Board, and the publication of report, will pay a little over 40 per cent., leaving about \$2,600, which the Board would desire to meet next year. The Board have made a careful estimate of the necessities of our Educational work for the year 1875-6, with the following result:—

These claims, with the \$2,600 carried over, and the necessary expenses, will require an income of about \$15,000 for the year 1875-6. When we remember that a sister Church is endeavouring to raise \$25,000, to meet the annual necessities of its Educational work, we feel confident that the liberality of the Methodist people will justify us in the endeavour to raise this amount. It will be seen that two-thirds of this amount, as also of the funds raised last year, have been devoted directly to the education of candidates for the ministry in our Church, and the Board feel assured that our two Universities make ample returns in the same work for the small amounts expended upon them.

The following comparative exhibit of the entire Educational work of our Church, embracing not only the Institutions aided by the Society, but also all others under the care of the Church, may prove of interest.

In conclusion we may mention the following gratifying facts. The attendance on our various Educational Institutions has largely increased during the past year. In no case has there been cause for serious discipline or anxiety respecting the moral welfare of the students. A large proportion of the students in many of the Institutions are faithful members of our Church. In all the schools Bible-classes, prayer-meeting, and our social means of grace are regularly maintained, and at several places there have been gracious revivals during the year. Thirty-five young men from our Theological schools have been received on trial for the ministry by the various Conferences in June last, viz., twenty-five from Victoria College, eight from the Mount Allison Wesleyan College, and two from the Wesleyan Theological College of Montreal.
